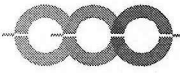

To the Plan Administrator and Participants of the Moss Supply Company, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Moss Supply Company, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Moss Supply Company, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Effective August 25, 2025, substantially all assets of Moss Supply Company, Inc. (the "Employer") were acquired by Lippert Components, Inc. While no formal resolution to terminate the Plan was executed as of the date these financial statements were available to be issued, management may elect to terminate the Plan in the future.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution savings plan covering substantially all employees of the Employer, as defined in the plan document. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after completing twelve months of service and reaching 21 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). Management is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute between up to 90% of their eligible compensation, as defined by the plan document. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Employer may make discretionary nonelective contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no discretionary nonelective contributions made to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, as well as allocations of the Employer's discretionary nonelective contributions and the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's discretionary nonelective contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of continuous service. A participant is fully vested when they attain normal retirement age or in the event of death or disability prior to attaining normal retirement age. Prior to normal retirement age, a participant's interest in the contributions of the Employer vest 20% after two years of service, increasing 20% each succeeding year until fully vested after six years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants - The Plan permits each participant to borrow a minimum of \$500 up to 50% of their vested account balance, not to exceed \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined in the plan document. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeited Accounts - Benefit payments to terminated employees partially vested in the Plan include their vested portion of the Employer's discretionary nonelective contributions. The nonvested portion of terminated participants' account balances is used to reduce the Employer's future contributions or to pay for the Plan's administrative expenses, as determined by the Employer at its sole discretion. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled approximately \$119,000 and \$4,000, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, no forfeited nonvested accounts were used to reduce the Employer's contributions or pay the Plan's administrative expenses.

However, related to \$119,000 of forfeited nonvested accounts at December 31, 2024, management discovered an operational error involving the administration of forfeitures and determined that approximately \$102,400 was improperly forfeited from the accounts of terminated participants during the year ended December 31, 2024. As a result, this amount was recorded as a benefits payable on the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024. The Plan has initiated corrective action to distribute amounts to affected terminated participants, which is expected to be completed during the 2025 plan year.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or annual installments over an elected period of time. For termination of service for some other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. The Plan permits in-service and hardship withdrawals under certain conditions.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Accounting Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any adjustments applied to estimated amounts are recognized in the year in which such adjustments are determined.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisor and Reliance Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan. See Note 4 for disclosure of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions - Contributions from participants are recorded as they are withheld from the participants' wages. Contributions from the Employer are recorded in the period in which the related participant contributions are due.

Notes Receivables from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the management deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Excess Contributions Payable - Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants in the following year.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

GAAP provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under GAAP are described as follows:

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value and categorized in the fair value hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are actively traded.

Collective trust fund: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although management believes the Plan’s valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement as of the reporting date.

5. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ADP Retirement Services is the recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, transactions related to that service qualify as exempt party in interest transactions.

As described in Note 1, the Plan permits participants to borrow from their account balances. These transactions qualify as exempt party in interest transactions.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

The Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan's termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS

On October 6, 2020, the IRS stated that the prototype plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") Section 401(a). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, management and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the taxing authorities. Management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits of any tax periods in progress.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
