INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of
Puerto Rico Waste Management Group Corp. 1165(e) Plan:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Puerto Rico Waste Management Group Corp. 1165(e) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards of the United States of America, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) and Schedule H, Line 4a, Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions at December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the

financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) that agrees to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) that agrees to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) certified by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Puerto Rico Waste Management Group Corp. 1165(e) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan was established on July 1, 2008, under the laws of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico and subject to the provisions of the Employees Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of PR Waste Management LLC (formerly known as Puerto Rico Waste Management Corp. and referred to herein as the “Plan Sponsor”) and its affiliates. Effective June 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to include commissions in the definition of compensation.

Eligibility – Employees of PR Waste Management Group LLC and its affiliates who have immediate entry service as determined in accordance with the Plan’s service rules, and are 18 years of age or older, are eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees are eligible to become a participant of the Plan on the first day of the month following the date on which he or she becomes a regular employee.

Participants’ Contributions – Participants may contribute pre-tax and/or after-tax contributions up to \$15,000 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and up to 10% of compensation as post-tax contributions as such term is defined in the plan document. Catch-up contributions allow participants that have reached the age of fifty (50) by the end of the Plan’s year to make an additional pre-tax contribution up to a maximum of \$1,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Compensation for this purpose means total compensation included for income tax purposes. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Employer Matching Contributions – The employer at its election may elect to perform employer matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024 the employer matching contributions amounted \$194,781.

Profit Sharing Contributions – The employer at its election may elect to perform profit sharing contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024 there were no profit sharing contributions to the Plan.

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and any rollover contributions received from other qualified plans, plus allocations of the Sponsor’s contributions, and the participant’s share in investment earnings.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Under the terms of the Plan, participants may borrow from their accounts from \$1,000 up to \$50,000, or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is lower. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's accounts and bear interest at prime rate plus 1%. Interest rate on loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was from 4.25% to 9.50%, respectively, for the term of the loans which may not be less than one (1) year, nor more than five (5) years, unless the loan is for the purpose of acquiring a principal residence. In such cases, the loan may be for a period of time not to exceed ten (10) years. Notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, amounted to \$477,027 and \$465,109, respectively.

Vesting – Participant contributions including rollover contributions are immediately vested. Vesting of employer profit-sharing contributions and matching, if any, is based on years of continuous service. The vesting schedule based on years of service follows:

Notwithstanding the above, a Participant will become fully vested in his matching contributions and earnings thereon, upon the earlier of (i) reaching normal retirement age while still employed by the employer; (ii) retirement at normal retirement age; (iii) disability; (iv) death while employed by the employer; (v) termination of the Plan; or (vi) complete discontinuance of contributions by the employer.

Re-hired employees with partial vesting in employer matching contributions may continue their vesting period upon re-entry to the Plan, if such re-entry occurs within a period of 5 years subsequent to the date of termination and provided that all vested distributions received at termination are reimbursed to the Plan. The previously earned vesting percentage will then be re-established.

Investments Options – The investment manager is responsible for selecting the investment options that will be available under the Plan. The Participants will provide investment directions for all the assets in their individual accounts. The Plan will not invest in qualifying employer securities. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Payment of Benefits – Upon separation from service due to death, disability, retirement or other termination of employment, a participant or beneficiary will receive payment of the vested account balance. The normal retirement age is the date a participant reaches his/her sixty-fifth (65) birthday or if later, after completing five (5) years of participation in the Plan. Early retirement distributions are permitted at the participant's election from any account 100% vested if the participant has reached the age of fifty-five (55) years or if later, after completing five (5) years of service.

Hardship Withdrawals – Under the provisions of the Plan, participants are permitted to make hardship withdrawals from their pre-tax, rollover, matching and catch-up contributions. Such withdrawal is only permitted if: (a) financial hardship is demonstrated, (b) the withdrawal is approved by the Plan Administrator, and (c) such withdrawal is allowable under the Puerto Rico income taxes code. Any participant who makes a hardship withdrawal cannot contribute to their participant tax-deferred contribution account for a period of one year thereafter.

Forfeited Accounts – Forfeited balances of terminated non-vested participants are used to reduce the Plan's administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's forfeited balances were \$6,544 and \$4,197, respectively.

Expenses and Administration – The Plan Sponsor is responsible for the general administration of the Plan and for carrying out the provisions thereof. Plan expenses such as legal, auditing and advisory fees are paid by the Plan Sponsor. Certain transaction charges are deducted from the participants' accounts.

Plan Termination – Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

Reclassifications – Certain amounts presented in the 2023 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the 2024 financial statement presentation.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basic of Presentation – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. A summary of the more significant accounting policies used by the Plan are as follows:

Use of Estimates in the Preparation of Financial Statements – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of changes in net

assets available for benefits during the reporting periods. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan’s investments operate under a trust program. A trust program segregates plan assets, processes, and settles trades, and values the Plan’s assets on a daily basis. The trust is created in conjunction with the qualified retirement plan to own and manage the Plan’s assets. Such assets consist of mutual funds. Since the aggregate shares are held in trust, all dividends and interest are automatically re-invested, and asset management charges are computed and deducted from the net asset value on a periodic basis.

Plan investment return includes interest income, gains and losses on sales of investments and unrealized appreciation or depreciation of investments. The financial statements reflect the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of the Plan’s investments. This net appreciation or depreciation includes realized gains and losses calculated as the difference between proceeds from a sales transaction and cost, and unrealized gains and losses calculated as the change in the fair value between beginning of the year (or purchase date if later) and the end of the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Consist of loans to participants and are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest.

Contributions – Participant contributions are recorded in the period during which the Plan Sponsor makes the payroll deductions from the participant’s earnings.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no benefits payable deductions from the participant’s earnings.

Administrative Charges Payable – Administrative charges are expensed when incurred and are deducted from the participants accounts. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, based on Empower Retirement Services fees structure, the asset management charge is determined by the average net asset value of the Plan times 2.15%. Such fee is deducted from the participants accounts. Administrative charges incurred but not deducted from participants accounts related to participants’ fees at December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$38,738 and \$29,631, respectively.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The FASB’s authoritative guidance on Fair Value Measurement and Disclosures, establishes a framework for measuring fair value which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level

1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active market that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Level 2 inputs include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Model based techniques in which inputs or assumptions to the valuation methodology are unobservable in the market and significant to the fair value measurement. Level 3 inputs include management's own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumption about risk).

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds – Share Prices/Net Assets Values reported on the Plan are generally obtained from a file feed from the National Securities Clearing Corporation, and/or directly from the fund house, or a secondary pricing source, such as Interactive Data Corporation. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified as Level 1.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT

The Plan has a fully benefit responsive group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“Empower”), and managed by Empower Capital Management, LLC, totaling \$33,041 and \$22,748, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The group annuity contract invest contributions in the Key Guarantee Portfolio Fund (“KGPF”) is a general account product where principal and interest for participant-initiated benefit payments are fully guaranteed by the entire general account assets of Empower.

This KGPF is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract for participant-initiated transactions for which values are reported at contract value. Contract value is determined as (a) plus (b) minus (c) where:

- (a) Represents the cost of all contributions made under the contract;
- (b) Includes interests credited to the fund;
- (c) Represents transfer-out from participants’ account balance.

The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions, and it is reset quarterly. The average yield earned by the plan for the benefit responsive fund can be

derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The quarterly credit rate applies to all money deposited in the group contract holder's KGPF account regardless of when it was deposited. The average interest rate for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, Empower informed that the fair value approximates contract value and as such, no adjustments were necessary to the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

5. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Retirement, LLC, the Plan's custodian, has certified as to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental Schedule H, line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

6. TAX STATUS

During the month of August 26, 2022, the Plan received notification from the Treasury Department of Puerto Rico (the "Department") that the request for a favorable determination letter made March 24, 2022, was granted. The Department had no objection to amendments made to the Plan since prior ruling on November 24, 2010. Accordingly, the Plan retains its tax exemption under the Puerto Rico income tax code and its qualified status. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Puerto Rico income tax laws and has no income subject to unrelated business income tax. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

In Puerto Rico, the tax laws permit examination of the Plan Sponsors' income tax returns for up to four years after the initial return is filed. The tax years of the Plan Sponsors with respect to the Plan that remain open for examination are 2021 and 2024.

7. RELATED PARTIES AND PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Certain Plan investments consist of funds administered by an affiliate of Empower Retirement, LLC, the Plan's custodian and recordkeeper and therefore, these transactions qualify as allowable party-in-interest transactions.

8. NON-DISCRIMINATION TEST

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan failed the non-discrimination test. To correct the excess contribution corresponding to 2024 and 2023, the Plan opted to reimburse, and to disclose as a liability, the excess contributions amounting to \$10,680 and \$46,541, respectively, to certain highly compensated participants.

9. RISKS

The Plan's investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and level of uncertainty related to changes in the values of investments, it is at least reasonable possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Individual participant's accounts bear the risk of loss resulting from fluctuations in fund values.

As of December 31, 2024, the Plan was unable to determine the final amount of potential contributions related to earnings that participants may have accrued due to a programming error in the payroll system that occurred in July 2022. This error resulted in the failure to auto enroll eligible participants from that date forward.

Management became aware of the issue in June 2024 and has since identified the affected participants. Those participants who elected to participate were successfully enrolled in the Plan in September 2024. The calculations necessary to determine the potential missed contributions and associated lost earnings are still in progress. The Plan Sponsor is continuing to gather and validate the data needed to complete these calculations. Corrective action is expected to be completed during fiscal year 2025.

The Sponsor will make the required contribution upon finishing the computation process. The estimated contribution receivable as of December 31, 2024, cannot be determined as of the date of issuance of the financial statements. While management believes the assumptions and data currently under review are reasonable, the final amounts may differ from those used in preparing these financial statements.

Recent market conditions have resulted in an unusually high degree of volatility and increased the risks and short-term liquidity associated with certain investments held by the Plan, which could impact the value of investments after the date of these financial statements.

10. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit participant deferral contributions totaling \$133,641 and \$15,290, respectively, within the required timeframe stated by the United States Department of Labor (the “DOL”). For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the lost earnings, totaling \$293 and \$133, respectively, were calculated in accordance with DOL guidelines and remained pending remittance to the Plan Assets.

11. RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500

There is an adjustment to reconcile the Plan’s financial statements to Plan’s Form 5500.

Participants who remain actively employed and do not repay their outstanding loan (or the interest thereon) within the time set forth in the related promissory note, the total amount of the loan outstanding (and any interest owed) will be considered deemed distributions. Deemed distributions are excluded from the net assets available for benefits and are instead reported as an expense in the Plan's Form 5500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. FASB’s authoritative guidance for reporting purposes requires participant loans to be classified as notes receivable from participants and measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. However, notes receivable from participants are considered investments for Form 5500 reporting purposes. In addition, certain participant loans that are in the administrative process of becoming distributions.
