Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Caring, Inc. CWA Local 1040 Employees 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Caring, Inc. CWA Local 1040 Employees 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note I to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

DECEMBER 31, 2024

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN:

The following description of Caring, Inc. CWA Local 1040 Employees 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, adopted by CARING, Inc., Caring Residential Services, Inc., Caring House Projects, Inc., and Caring Senior Living, Inc., (the Companies) which are located in Atlantic County, New Jersey, is a defined contribution plan offering employee and employer contributions to substantially all employees who meet the following requirements. For an employee to be eligible to contribute or receive employer contributions, they must be a member of the Local CWA 1040 union, have one year of service and be age twenty-one or older. Certain nonresident aliens who have no earned income from sources within the United States are not eligible. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees oversees governance of the Plan. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may elect their contributions to be pre-tax 401(k) deferrals, or Roth 401(k) deferrals subject to federal income tax in the year of deferral. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain IRAs. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds as investment options for participants.

The Companies contribute matching contributions for participants who defer a percentage of their compensation to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Companies contributed a match equal to 30% of the participant's salary deferral amount. The Companies, at their discretion, may also make a qualified profit sharing contribution to the Plan. Eligible employees will generally receive a share of the discretionary contribution based upon their total compensation compared to the total compensation of all Plan participants. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no profit sharing contributions made by the Companies.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, if any, and allocations of the Companies' contribution and Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based upon participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, plus earnings thereon. A participant is also fully vested in the full value of their account if a participant attains normal retirement age, as

defined in the Plan, or becomes permanently and totally disabled. Notwithstanding such events, a participant becomes fully vested in employer contributions after three years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Notes bear interest at rates of 4.25% - 9.5%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Notes initiated after January 1, 2024 bear interest at a rate of 8.75% - 9.5%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through biweekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or if the vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, a retirement benefit may also be distributed in the form of a monthly annuity. Each participant may elect to retire and to receive a retirement benefit any time on or after the date employment is terminated. Such retirement benefit shall be a lump sum payment or the monthly amount that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Upon the death of a participant before retirement, the value of the participant's account is paid to the participant's designated beneficiary.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$19,358 and \$11,161, respectively. These accounts are first to be used by the Plan to pay any administrative expenses that are not related to a specific transaction and thereby chargeable to specific participant's accounts. Any remaining forfeitures are to be used to reduce the Companies' contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$3,076 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Date of Management's Review of Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. The Plan accrues interest at prevailing rates on participant loans from the time funds are borrowed until the account is fully paid. The amount of participant loans past due more than 90 days, based on contractual terms, and still accruing interest is \$-0- at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes receivable from participants are stated at the amount the Plan expects to collect from outstanding balances. The Plan provides for probable uncollectible amounts through a valuation allowance and a charge to benefits paid based on its assessment of the current status of individual accounts and the terms of the Plan document. Balances that are still outstanding after use of reasonable collection efforts are written off against the valuation allowance. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, all participant loans are fully collateralized by participant's remaining account balance and no allowance for probable uncollectible amounts is deemed necessary.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of annual amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as accounts payable with a corresponding reduction to contributions. There were no excess contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan, including administrative expenses, are paid by participants, unless otherwise paid by the Companies. Expenses that are paid by the Companies are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted

quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The Companies pay for the Plan's annual audit and third party administrator fees. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Companies incurred audit fees and third party administrator fees of \$16,200 and \$9,350, respectively.

The Plan invests in shares of mutual funds managed by affiliates of Reliance Trust Company. Reliance Trust Company acts as trustee for only those investments as defined by the Plan. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services amounted to \$3,215 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE E - PLAN TERMINATION:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS:

On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself. The Plan has been amended and restated to comply with several recent legislative actions since adopting the prototype. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan was designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires the Plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2022.
