Scope and nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of ABB E-mobility Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Basis for opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of management for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other matter - supplemental schedules required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 and schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such supplementary information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures. These additional procedures included comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with US GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is

derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

ABB E-mobility Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the RSP or the Plan) was inception on May 1, 2022 and is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible full-time employees of ABB E-mobility Inc. (the Company, the Employer, or E-mobility). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). Participants should refer to the Plan document and adoption agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Effective April 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to include Imagen Energy as an adopting employer.

Administration

Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company ("Principal") is the trustee for the Plan.

Eligibility

All full-time employees paid on a salaried, commission, or hourly rate basis who are not nonresident aliens, leased employees, reclassified employees, residents of Puerto Rico, or covered by a collective bargaining agreement are eligible to participate in the Plan at any time after the date of hire. Part-time, temporary, or seasonal employees are not eligible. There are no additional entry requirements.

Contributions

Participants of the Plan can elect to make contributions to the Plan through payroll deductions in whole percentages from 1% to 50% of their annual eligible compensation (as defined in the Plan document, subject to Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations) on a pretax or after-tax basis. Eligible employees are automatically enrolled in pretax contributions at 6% of eligible compensation. Employee deferrals can be changed at any time by the participant. The Employer's matching contributions, where applicable, shall be equal to 75% as stipulated by the Adoption Agreement, of the participants' contributions made during the year, up to 6% of their annual compensation. The Company will also provide a nonelective safe harbor contribution calculated as 3% of each eligible employee's eligible compensation.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to include a 60-day opt-out period for automatic enrollment.

Eligible participants who are age 50 or older by the end of their taxable year are eligible to make Catch-up Contributions, subject to IRC limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution. No discretionary matching contribution was made during 2024.

Effective for Plan years beginning on and after April 11, 2023, the Employer will make an additional matching contribution to the Plan on behalf of each eligible participant in the amount, if any, necessary so that the total matching contribution credited to the Plan on behalf of the participant for the Plan year equals the maximum matching contribution the participant is eligible to receive under the Plan for that Plan year (True-up Contribution). For purposes of calculating the True-up Contribution, the 6% limit on compensation eligible for matching contributions will be applied to the participant's compensation for the Plan year. The True-up Contributions for 2024 and 2023 totaled \$85,804 and \$53,391, respectively, and are included in the total Employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Vesting

All participant and Employer contributions and earnings thereon are fully vested at all times.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, matching Employer contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings and is charged with withdrawals, administrative expenses and an allocation of Plan losses. Earnings or losses are based on participants' individual account balances and investment choices. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment, retirement, death or disability, the participant or beneficiary may receive a single sum payment, partial payments, or fixed period installments, depending upon the nature of the event and total vested value of the participant's account, as defined by the Plan document, or may elect to have the payment of benefits deferred up to age 73, at which time distributions must commence. Participants may also take in-service distributions.

A participant may withdraw tax-deferred contributions for (a) medical expenses, (b) purchase of a principal residence, (c) payment of tuition expenses for educational fees and room and board expenses for post-secondary education, (d) payments to prevent eviction from principal residence, (e) funeral or burial expenses, (f) expenses to repair damage to the participant's principal residence, or (g) any other reason set forth by the Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), conditional upon satisfactory demonstration of the need and approval by the Company.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows a participant to have a minimum loan of \$1,000, and the total amount of a participant's loan shall not exceed the lesser of:

- \$50,000, reduced by the participant's highest outstanding loan balance of loans during the one-year period ending on the day before the new loan is made
- The greater of (1) or (2), reduced by (3) below:
 - (1) One-half of the Participant's Vested Account
 - (2) \$10,000
 - (3) Any outstanding loan balance on the date the new loan is made

Loans are repaid from payroll deductions. Each loan shall bear a reasonable fixed rate of interest to be determined by the Company's human resources department (Prime +1% for loans initiated during 2024). The interest rate is fixed for the life of the loan and is limited to no more than 6% compounded annually for participants during a military leave of absence. Participants may elect to repay loans over a period of one to five years. If the purpose of the loan is to purchase the participant's principal residence, the loan may be repaid over a period of up to 20 years.

Administrative Expenses

Certain Plan related expenses are paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan. Expenses related to participant-requested services and administrative services are paid by the Plan, either by the participants directly or with forfeitures.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States ("U.S. GAAP") requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements, accompanying notes and supplemental schedules. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded when earned. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the gains and losses on investments bought, sold, and held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INFORMATION

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Trust Company has certified that the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value, and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4(i) - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820, ("ASC 820") *Fair Value Measurement*, clarifies the definition of fair value for financial reporting, establishes a framework for measuring fair value and requires additional disclosures about the use of fair value measurements.

The hierarchy established under ASC 820 gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). As required by ASC 820, the Plan investments are classified within the fair value hierarchy based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820, and its applicability to the Plan's investments, are described below:

- Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, or inputs that are observable, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term through corroboration with observable market data. Level 2 includes investments valued at quoted prices adjusted for legal and contractual restrictions specific to the security.
- Level 3 - Pricing inputs are unobservable for the asset or liability, that is, inputs that reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. Level 3 includes private investments that are supported by little or no market activity.

The methods used to measure the fair value calculation may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while Plan management believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds - Valued at the fair value, based on quoted market prices in active markets, of shares held by the Plan at year-end. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

Collective trust funds - Valued at net asset value ("NAV") of units held as reported by investment managers based on the fair value of the underlying assets less liabilities. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments. The NAV is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value. Unitholders' transactions (Plan participants) are processed daily.

NOTE 5 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Principal provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a trust agreement between the Company and Principal. Principal receives revenue related to recordkeeping services provided to the Plan from various investment options. Such amounts will be allocated to the accounts of the participants that were invested in the fund(s) that generated the revenue.

Plan administrative expenses are charged directly to Plan participants. The Plan or Company may make a payment to Plan service providers for administrative expenses not covered by amounts charged directly to Plan participants. Notes receivable from participants are also considered party-in-interest transactions.

The transactions described are considered exempt party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 - NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

As reported on the supplemental schedule of delinquent participant contributions, certain Plan contributions and loan repayments were not remitted to the trust within the time frame specified by the Department of Labor's Regulation 29 (CFR 2510.3-102), thus constituting nonexempt transactions between the Plan and the Company.

NOTE 7 - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document that received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management is not aware of any subsequent events that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.
