1. Plan Description

The following description of Helicopters, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the "Plan") is provided for financial reporting purposes only. Participants of the Plan should refer to the plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established January 1, 2016, and is a leveraged employee stock ownership plan ("ESOP") designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), as amended, covering all eligible employees of Helicopters, Inc. (the "Plan Sponsor"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended. The Plan is administered by GreatBanc Trust Company, the Plan's Trustee.

The Plan purchased common stock of the Plan Sponsor in exchange for a note payable held by the Plan Sponsor and holds the common stock in a trust established under the Plan. As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC. The allocation of shares of common stock to participant accounts may differ from the amounts allocated in the accompanying financial statements due to the timing of debt payments and release of shares of common stock from collateral.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock. The Plan Sponsor has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the Plan document. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to the accounts of employees with rights in allocated common stock (allocated) and common stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released.

Eligibility

Employees of the Plan Sponsor become participants following one year of service, as defined in the plan document, and attaining 18 years of age. Plan entry dates are January 1 and July 1.

Contributions

The Plan Sponsor is obligated to make contributions in cash to the Plan equal to the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its note payable.

The Plan Sponsor may also make an annual discretionary cash or stock contribution to the Plan. Contributions are allocated to eligible participants' accounts in the same ratio as each participant's points, earned for the year, bears to the total points earned by participants. Participants must be actively employed at the end of the Plan year and worked at least 1,000 hours or became retired, disabled, or deceased during the Plan year to receive the contribution.

There were no discretionary contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Plan Sponsor's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Allocations are based on a participant's total points earned for the year, relative to total points earned by all participants who are eligible to share in the allocations of the year. For purposes of applying the allocation of points, a participant shall be awarded ten points for each year of service and one point for each full \$1,000 of compensation received during the applicable year. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Plan Sponsor as of the last day of the Plan year and worked at least 1,000 hours or became retired, disabled, or deceased during the Plan year will receive an allocation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's account balance at December 31.

Vesting and Forfeitures

Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's contribution portion of their account plus earnings is based on years of service, as defined in the plan document, in accordance with the following schedule:

The nonvested balance is forfeited upon termination of service. Participants become fully vested upon death, termination of the Plan, normal retirement age, or total disability.

Plan forfeitures are allocated as Plan Sponsor contributions to the accounts of participants who are eligible to receive an allocation for the Plan year. Forfeitures of terminated nonvested account balances allocated to remaining participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$29,020 and \$53,957, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Upon attainment of normal retirement age, total disability, or death, the amount credited to a participant's account is payable in a lump sum or installments. Upon termination of employment for reasons other than retirement, total disability, or death, the participant's account balance will be distributed in a manner based on the value of the account. If a separated participant's account does not exceed \$5,000, the benefit will be distributed in a lump sum within a reasonable time after termination of employment. If the participant's account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant may elect to receive the benefit in a lump sum or installments in accordance with the plan document and the Plan Sponsor has the right to make these payments over five years. In addition, the Plan Sponsor may defer payments up to five years for participants with account balances that exceed \$5,000 and are not retired, disabled or deceased.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the Trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is permitted to vote any allocated shares for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The Trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, Plan Sponsor common stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Plan Sponsor buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock as of the most recent valuation date. The Plan Sponsor can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to convert the stock to cash.

Diversification

Participants who are 55 or older with at least ten years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25 percent of the number shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50 percent. Participants who elect to diversify receive the value of Plan Sponsor common stock in their participant account. The election to diversify is made within 90 days subsequent to year-end based upon the shares of Plan Sponsor common stock in the participant's account at year-end.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB"), Accounting Standards Codification (the "FASB ASC"), which is the source of authoritative, non-governmental accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). All references to authoritative accounting guidance contained in our disclosures are based on the general accounting topics within the FASB ASC.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows guidance issued by the FASB on fair value measurements, which establishes a framework for measuring fair value, clarifies the definition of fair value within that framework, and expands disclosures about the use of fair value measurements. This guidance applies whenever fair value is the applicable measurement. The three general valuation techniques used to measure fair value are the market approach, cost approach, and income approach.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the 2023 financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into Levels 1, 2, and 3. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical instruments in active markets.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology to include quoted prices for similar instruments in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar instruments in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the instrument, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The instruments' fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Level 3 investments consist of Plan Sponsor common stock that is not actively traded and significant other observable inputs are not available. The fair value of the Plan Sponsor common stock is determined by an annual independent appraisal as of December 31. The appraisal is based primarily on an income valuation approach. The appraisal took into account historical and projected cash flow and net earnings, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables, and applicable discounts and premiums. Plan management accumulates the data for the appraiser from the audited financial statements of the Plan Sponsor. The appraiser prepares a preliminary report which the ESOP Committee and Trustee reviews in detail, discusses, and approves.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair value. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Note Payable

The Plan entered into a \$39,924,503 term loan agreement (the "Agreement") with the Plan Sponsor. The proceeds of the loan were used to purchase Plan Sponsor common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. Shares are released from collateral as payments of principal and interest are made. The number of shares released in any year is the number of shares held as collateral, times the ratio of the current year payments divided by the total of the year's payment plus all future years' principal and interest payments. This resulted in 38,966.2 and 39,471.6 shares being released and allocated for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The outstanding balance on the note payable at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$27,747,152 and \$29,077,969, respectively.

The Agreement provides for the loan to be repaid over 30 years and bears interest at 1.95 percent. Principal is due in annual installments of \$1,330,817.

6. Plan Sponsor Advances

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor advanced \$365,638 and \$301,562, respectively, in cash to the Plan to cover the Plan's distribution obligations. The advances were interest free loans to the Plan. No collateral was taken for the loans. The Plan's management believes the loans complied with the requirements of Department of Labor Prohibited Transactions Class Exemption 80-26. The proceeds from the loans were used to fund benefits paid to participants and converted to contributions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

7. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, Plan investments are shares of Plan Sponsor common stock and held by the trust. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor paid certain administrative and other operating expenses of the Plan.

8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants shall be entitled to receive a benefit immediately after the termination which is equal to or greater than the benefit he or she would have been entitled to receive immediately prior to the termination.

9. Tax Status of Plan

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan Sponsor by a letter dated October 24, 2017, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with GAAP, the Plan Sponsor is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Sponsor has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan Sponsor believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021. The Plan is also subject to routine audits by the Department of Labor, generally for six years after the statutory due date of the annual information return. There are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

10. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan investments are in Plan Sponsor common stock that is not publicly or actively traded. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
