Independent Auditor's Report

To the Plan Administrator
Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano 403(b) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano 403(b) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2023 Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor’s report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan’s internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters

2024 Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Line 4I - Schedule of Assets as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Auditor's Report on the 2023 Financial Statements

Predecessor auditors performed an audit of the 2023 financial statements of the Plan. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated October 14, 2024 indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF THE PLAN

Plan Description

The following description of the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano 403(b) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information about the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was adopted on January 1, 2013 and qualifies as a defined contribution retirement plan covering substantially all eligible employees of Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano (the “Company”). This Plan was established for the purpose of providing retirement benefits to eligible employees in accordance with the Plan. The Plan is intended to satisfy the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) of 1986, as amended. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Effective February 1, 2019, the Plan was amended to modify the provisions related to participant loans. Prior to the amendment, loans were permitted only in cases of hardship. Under the amended provisions, participant loans may be taken for general purposes, subject to the terms and limitations set forth in the Plan’s loan policy.

Plan Administration

Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano (the “Company”) is the Plan sponsor and serves as administrator, responsible for compliance with ERISA. The Company has delegated certain administrative functions to third-party service providers. Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company, d/b/a Principal Trust Company (“Principal”), serves as the Plan’s asset custodian and provides recordkeeping and participant data processing through its affiliates.

Participant Eligibility

All employees of the employer or of an adopting employer are eligible to make elective deferral contributions except those who normally works less than 20 hours per week if for the 12-month period beginning on the Employee’s hire date, the employer reasonably expects the employee to work less than 1,000 hours of service in such period and for each Plan Year ending after the close of the 12-month period beginning on the employee’s hire date, the employee worked less than 1,000 hours of service in the preceding 12-month period. Participation is voluntary and requires affirmative election by the employee. Employees who are at least 18 years of age and have completed three months of service are eligible to receive contributions other than elective deferral contributions. Participation becomes effective on the first day of the calendar quarter following the date eligibility requirements are satisfied.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to revise the eligibility requirements for elective deferral contributions. Under the amended provision, an employee is eligible to make elective deferral contributions upon completing three months of service and attaining age 21.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's elective deferral contributions, (b) rollover contributions from other qualified plans, and (c) employer's matching contribution. Accounts are also adjusted for allocated investment earnings or losses and are charged with applicable administrative expenses, in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

Investment earnings are allocated based on the participant's selected investment options and the timing of related transactions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is limited to the vested portion of their individual account balance.

Contributions

The Company's eligible employees may contribute up to the IRC Section 402(g) limit and/or 401(m) Actual Contribution Percentage (ACP) test limit for highly compensated employees. The 402(g) limit for 2024 was \$23,000. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. In addition, all eligible employees who have attained age 50 before the close of the Plan year shall be eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to the limitations of, IRC Section 414(v). For 2024, the maximum catch-up contribution limit was \$7,500. The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution equal to an amount determined by the Company.

Each eligible employee may begin receiving matching contributions on the first day of the calendar quarter following satisfaction of eligibility requirements. The Company match is 3% of each participant's eligible wages for the Plan year. Matching contributions are made to the Plan each payroll period throughout the Plan year (commencing on the applicable date of entry). For the year ended December 31, 2024, discretionary Employer matching contributions totaled \$190,990, representing up to 3% of participants' eligible pay, irrespective of participants' own contributions or participation.

Vesting

Participants are one hundred percent (100%) vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become vested in their Company's matching contributions and any earnings as follows:

Company contributions and related earnings become fully vested upon the Participant's attainment of normal retirement age, permanent disability, death, or upon termination of the Plan. Vesting Service is determined using the elapsed time method, which measures the total countable periods of service without regard to hours worked. It reflects the cumulative time a Participant has been employed and eligible under the Plan, as set forth in the Plan provisions.

Forfeited accounts

Amounts forfeited from terminating participants' non-vested portion of their Company matching contribution account and Company discretionary contribution account and earnings on Company contributions may be used to offset administrative expenses or applied to reduce matching and discretionary contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held forfeited non-vested account balances of \$0 and \$1,983, respectively. These forfeitures represent unallocated assets which will be used to offset future administrative expenses or employer contributions.

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, no forfeitures were used to offset administrative expenses; however, forfeitures totaling \$5,514 were used to reduce Employer discretionary matching contributions.

Payment of Benefits

In the event of retirement, termination, death, disability or financial hardship the participants or beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum payment, make a partial withdrawal, installment payments, or rollover the balance in their account to an eligible retirement plan as soon as administratively possible. If upon termination, the participant has not elected to receive or rollover their balance and, if the balance does not exceed \$5,000, the trustee will follow the Plan's provisions for a mandatory distribution. A participant may elect a hardship distribution if it is deemed that the participant has an immediate and heavy financial need as described by the Plan.

Any withdrawals made prior to the participant attaining age 59½ for any reason are subject to a 10% federal excise tax.

Expenses

The Plan allows certain administrative expenses to be paid from Plan assets unless otherwise paid by the Company, at the discretion of the Plan administrator. These expenses may be funded through a combination of sources, including direct payments by the Company, charges to participant accounts, and offsets from revenue sharing arrangements with investment providers. Expenses of the Plan, to the extent that the employer does not pay such expenses, may be paid out of the assets of the Plan provided that such payment is consistent with ERISA.

Investment-related expenses, collectively referred to as Total Investment Expense Net, are deducted prior to the calculation of published investment returns and accordingly reduce the net investment income credited to participant accounts. These expenses include fees retained by Investment Providers to cover investment management and marketing costs. A portion of these fees may also be shared with the Plan's Recordkeeper to help offset recordkeeping and administrative service expenses.

Participant Transaction Fees include charges for participant-initiated transactions such as loans, distributions, and QDRO processing, charged directly to the accounts of the participants initiating such transactions and included in administrative expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of his or her vested account. The notes must be repaid within 5 years, unless for the purchase of a principal residence. The notes are secured by the balance of the participant's account. Principal and interest is paid in level payments at least quarterly through payroll deductions or manual payments made to the employer or custodian. All notes must be adequately secured and accrue interest at a reasonable fixed rate, similar to what a commercial lender would charge under similar terms. The maximum number of loans outstanding at any one time for a participant is two and one loan approved for a participant in any 12-month period.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative costs and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded. The current interest rates on existing loans are ranging from 5.25% to 10.50%.

Investment Options

All accounts are invested in accordance with the terms of the Plan document and investment options elected by participants. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investments offered by the Plan. Participants may change investment elections at any time via internet access or submit election change forms to the Plan Administrator.

SECURE Act 2.0 Provisions

On December 29, 2022, the SECURE 2.0 Act was enacted as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The legislation includes a range of mandatory and optional provisions aimed at expanding retirement plan participation, increasing savings, and simplifying plan administration. The effective dates of the various provisions under SECURE 2.0 extend through 2026.

The Company adopted an amendment to reflect applicable provisions of SECURE 2.0, effective February 1, 2025, in accordance with the required implementation timelines. As of the date the financial statements were available to be issued, Plan management continued to evaluate the remaining provisions of the legislation and assess any additional operational or administrative changes that may be required.

The provisions of SECURE 2.0 did not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 2 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP"). A summary of the significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements follows.

Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

A portion of the Plan's administrative expenses is covered by the Company and through offsets from revenue sharing arrangements with investment providers. The Plan incurred \$2,276 of administrative expenses during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Non-Discrimination for Employee and Employer Contributions

The Plan, as required by the IRC, performs annual tests between highly compensated participants versus non-highly compensated participants to ensure that highly compensated participants are not disproportionately favored under the Plan. If the Plan fails the tests, it must refund excess deferral contributions or make a Qualified Non-Elective Contribution ("QNEC") for the non-highly compensated employees. Excess contributions that are refunded within two and a half months of the Plan year end are accrued as a liability on the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments, bought and sold as well as held during the year. The mutual funds are recorded at quoted market prices.

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Boards ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Inputs to the valuation methodology includes: quoted prices of similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices of identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Value of interest in Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified as Level 1 investments.

NOTE 4 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S ASSET CUSTODIAN

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. All of the information related to investments from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, held at December 31, 2024, and 2023 and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee of the Plan.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate or amend the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, all participants will be 100% vested in their account balances.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted the volume-submitter plan document and received an opinion letter dated March 31, 2017 from the IRS stating that the volume-submitter plan document is acceptable under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. Subsequently, the Plan has been amended. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Asset Custodian; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions for which a statutory exemption exists under ERISA. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective February 1, 2025, the Company adopted an amendment to the Plan to reflect applicable provisions of the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022. Plan management continues to evaluate provisions and assess any related operational or administrative changes.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that no other events require recognition or additional disclosure.
