The financial statements comprise the statements of the net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to or notes receivable from participants or assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subjected to periodic examination by a state or federal agency that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of King's Daughters Medical Center Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution Plan, covering all employees of King's Daughters Medical Center (the "Hospital"). The Hospital is a nonprofit organization as determined by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Therefore, the Plan is subject to the 403(b) provisions of Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). 403(b) Plans require universal availability; therefore, participation is not subject to any hours or years of service requirements.

Contributions

Participating employees may make pre-tax salary deferrals up to the maximum allowable by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Participating employees may also make Roth contributions up to the maximum allowable by the IRS. Participants are eligible for Hospital matching contributions without regard to age or years of service and are only restricted if the participant is a member of an excluded category. Excluded categories include employees who normally work less than 20 hours per week and employees who are classified as nonbenefiting employees. The Hospital matches a percentage of the participants' contributions based on compensation as follows:

Participant Investment Programs

Contributions in the Plan are invested into any of the investment funds available under the Plan provisions, in such proportions as the participants direct. Participants may change investment options at any time.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Hospital's matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The Plan provides benefits based solely upon the amount contributed to the participant's account and any income, expenses, gains and losses on investments, which may be allocated to such participant's account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions. A participant's vested percentage in the portion of their account attributable to the Hospital match plus earnings thereon shall be determined under the following schedule:

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan document includes provisions authorizing loans from the Plan's trustees to eligible participants. Loans are made directly with the Plan's trustees, Milliman, Inc. ("Milliman"), Corebridge Financial ("Corebridge"), or Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company ("VOYA"). For these loans, the related participant's investments are restricted and held as collateral for the loan. The restriction on the funds is released as the loan balance is paid down. All loan repayments are made directly to Milliman, Corebridge, or VOYA by the participant.

Participants may borrow from Milliman, Corebridge, or VOYA using a portion of their Plan account as security for the loan. The minimum loan is \$1,000 and may be up to the lesser of (1) \$50,000, reduced by the participant's highest outstanding loan balance during the 12-month period, or (2) 50 percent of their vested account balance. These loans bear interest at rates, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined periodically by Milliman, Corebridge, or VOYA, that range from 1.0 percent to 9.5 percent as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly ACH transfers by the participants to Milliman, Corebridge, or VOYA. The Plan Administrator has concluded that these loans are not Plan assets and that such arrangements are exempt transactions.

Participant loans totaled \$639,095 and \$498,576, respectively, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Under the borrowing terms, Plan assets of \$583,415 and \$295,103, respectively, serve as collateral to these loans as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

In the event of default, such loans are reportable to Plan participants as taxable income but remain outstanding and continue to accrue interest until repaid by the Plan participant or the participant becomes eligible to receive a distribution under the terms of the Plan. During 2024 and 2023, \$24,731 and \$0-, respectively, of loans went into default.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, loans in default amounted to \$276,548 and \$234,285, respectively. Such amounts include the principal and accumulated interest.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are generally payable on termination, retirement, death or disability. Benefits may be paid by either lump-sum or installments over a fixed reasonable period of time. Hardship distributions are also available from the participant's account.

Forfeitures

The Plan held no forfeitures at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Forfeitures can be applied to reduce the Hospital's contributions to the Plan or pay administrative expenses if directed by the Hospital. In 2024, \$5,856 in forfeitures were used to fund employer's contributions or pay administrative expenses.

Note 2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized and unrealized gains and losses on the Plan's investments are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments at year-end in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses incurred by the Plan are paid by the Plan to the extent not paid by the Hospital.

Note 3. Investments Certified and Provided by Trustees

Information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the years then ended, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Milliman, Corebridge, or VOYA, the trustees of the Plan. The contract value of the guaranteed investment contract was certified by the trustee.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

- *Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- *Level 2* – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- *Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis.

- *Pooled separate accounts/collective trusts* – Valued based on market value of its underlying investments (Level 2).
- *Not fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contracts and restricted investments held for collateral* – Valued at the accumulated unit value of units held by the Plan at year-end, which is included as measured at NAV practical expedient. There are no unfunded commitments. The redemption frequency is daily, and no redemption notice is required.
- *Annuity funds and Mutual funds* – Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded (Level 1).

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Guaranteed Investment Contracts

The Plan invests in fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment funds with Corebridge. Corebridge maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contracts are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contracts. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Corebridge, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Note 5. Continued

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events included the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletions of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable to occur.

In March 2023, when the Plan changed trustees from Corebridge to Milliman, the guaranteed investment contract with Corebridge became subject to a five-year transfer arrangement. Under this arrangement, Corebridge retains the contract assets and distributes them to Milliman over a fixed payout schedule: one-fifth of the assets in year one, one-fourth of the remaining assets in year two, one-third of the remaining assets in year three, one-half of the remaining assets in year four, and the balance in year five. Participants may continue to initiate permitted transactions at contract value during this period, and the payout limitation applies only at the plan level between trustees.

In addition to the fully benefit-responsive investments, the Plan invests in guaranteed investment contracts with VOYA that are not fully benefit-responsive. As such these investment contracts are presented in the statements of assets available for benefits at the fair value of the investment contracts.

Note 6. Related Party

At December 31, 2024 and 2023 and during the years then ended, certain Plan investments were shares of mutual funds and guaranteed investment contracts managed by Milliman, guaranteed investment contracts and shares of annuity funds managed by Corebridge, and shares of pooled separate accounts and investment contracts managed by VOYA. Milliman, Corebridge, and VOYA are the trustees of the Plan assets as defined by the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Administrative expenses paid to Milliman, Corebridge and VOYA by the Plan during 2024 and 2023 totaled \$159,812 and \$149,521, respectively.

Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Hospital has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If terminated, the net assets of the Plan are to be set aside for the participants' benefits.

Note 8. Income Tax Status

The Plan has been designed to qualify pursuant to the appropriate section of Code and accordingly, the Plan's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. Although the Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the IRS, the Plan's administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provisions for income taxes have been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 9. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for potential recognition or disclosure through October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
