Notes to Financial Statements**

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the 401(k) Plan for the Salaried Employees of J.F. Kiely Construction Company (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible salaried employees of J.F. Kiely Construction Company and the controlled groups, J. F. Kiely Civil Management Co., LLC, JF Kiely Construction Co Management Payroll, LLC, Kiely Business Services Co., Kiely Development Company, LLC, Kiely Engineering, Inc., Kiely Equipment Co, LLC, Kiely Industrial Technologies, LLC, Kiely Strategic LLC, d.b.a. Kiely Engineering, Inc., JF Kiely Construction Of PA, LLC, and Kiely Industrial Technologies, LLC (collectively the “Plan Sponsor”), as defined in the Plan document. Eligible employees are those who have completed 1,000 hours of service, have attained the age of twenty-one, with a minimum one year of service as defined in the Plan document. The Plan excludes employees that are covered by a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, and nonresident aliens. The Plan was originally adopted on May 1, 1996. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and the Plan is managed through Ascensus, LLC, as an authorized representative of Ascensus Trust Company and Newport Trust Company, LLC, (collectively “Ascensus”).

The Plan was restated effective January 1, 2021 as part of the six-year cycle for Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) pre-approved plan documents and includes required regulatory changes.

Contributions

Each year, eligible participants may contribute up to 100 percent of their eligible compensation, subject to the maximum IRS limitations, during the Plan year. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the applicable dollar amount was \$23,000. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The maximum catch-up contribution was \$7,500 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants are also permitted to make Roth deferrals (after tax). Participant contributions to the Plan are recorded in the period that payroll deductions are made from participants.

The Plan Sponsor has implemented a safe-harbor non-elective contribution, which is equal to 3 percent of the participants’ eligible compensation, as well as a discretionary non-elective contribution allocated based on class. Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor made safe-harbor matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions totaling \$989,892 to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Participants direct their investments from a choice of investments provided by Ascensus. Each participant’s account shall reflect the monies deferred, the Plan Sponsor’s contributions, allocations of the Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, deferrals or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the safe harbor Plan Sponsor contribution plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's non-elective contributions and discretionary non-elective contribution is based on years of continuous service according to the following schedule:

<u>Participant's Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
Less than two years	0%
Two years	20%
Three years	40%
Four years	60%
Five years	80%
Six years and after	100%

Participants are immediately 100% vested upon death or total and permanent disability.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount of the lesser of: a) 50% of the participant's vested account, reduced by any outstanding loan balance, or b) \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the one-year period ending on the day before the loan is made. No more than one loan can be outstanding at a time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Note terms generally range one to five years, other than for the purchase of a home. Principal and interest are repaid through weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant will receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Upon termination of employment, the Plan has a mandatory cash-out provision for participants with less than \$5,000 in their account, which does not require consent from the participant. Accounts with less than \$1,000 will be distributed to the participant. Accounts with between \$1,000 and \$5,000 will be rolled into an individual retirement plan. Hardship withdrawals from accounts which are fully vested are permitted by the Plan. In-service distributions are allowed for participants after reaching age 59 ½.

Forfeitures

Participants in the Plan who terminate employment prior to completing five years of service forfeit the non-vested portion of their account. Forfeitures may be used to reduce Plan Sponsor contributions or pay administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures available to the Plan totaled \$5,151 and \$18,205, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures totaling \$306 were used to pay administrative expenses and forfeitures totaling \$32,502 were used to reduce employer contributions.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by Ascensus. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 11, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3: INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY ASCENSUS

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Ascensus.

Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the above information which appears throughout the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

NOTE 5: RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Ascensus, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment manager services are included in net appreciation in the fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant’s account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

NOTE 6: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Plan Sponsor also reserves the right to amend, modify, suspend or terminate the Plan permanently or temporarily, at such time as they deem appropriate.

NOTE 7: TAX STATUS

The Plan Sponsor has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Sponsor believes the Plan is generally no longer subject to income tax examination for years prior to 2022.

NOTE 8: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.





