Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

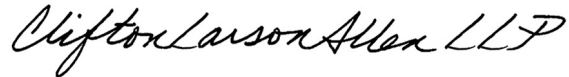

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the FAST Global Solutions, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established effective January 1, 1997, and has been amended and restated throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was most recently amended January 1, 2020 and restated effective January 1, 2016. The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan sponsored by FAST Global Solutions, Inc. (the Employer). The Plan is intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan is comprised of a combination money purchase pension and stock bonus plan, both meeting the requirements of IRC section 401(a). Effective June 1, 2002, the Employer reduced the contribution percentage to the Money Purchase Pension portion of the Plan to 0%. The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Employer who meet certain eligibility requirements, including one year of service and age 18. The Plan excludes employees covered by collective bargaining agreements, nonresident aliens with no U.S. source income, and leased employees. A description of the Plan is set forth in the Summary Plan Description provided to all Plan participants. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Board of Directors is responsible for the oversight of the Plan.

On December 17, 1997, the Plan purchased Employer common stock using the proceeds of various bank borrowings and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan. As the Plan made debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock was allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC. The loan was paid in full during 2010, and all stock has been allocated.

Effective March 24, 2020 the trustee transitioned from Bremer Bank, N.A. to Alerus Financial, N.A. As a result of this transition, the Plan investments are nonparticipant directed.

Contributions

Each Plan year, the Employer contributes to the Plan in such amounts, up to 25% of covered compensation, as may be determined by its Board of Directors. All contributions by the Employer are made in cash or Employer common stock. In order to receive an allocation of employer contributions, a participant must work 1,000 hours and be employed on the last day of the Plan year. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Participants who divest their accounts can elect to receive their funds via lump sum or as a rollover to any retirement account of their choice. Terminated participants, whose accounts have been liquidated to cash, direct the investment of these funds into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Allocations

Contributions and forfeitures are allocated proportionately to participants based on compensation of the eligible participants, subject to specified limitations defined by the Plan. S corporation distribution of earnings on allocated shares is allocated to participants' accounts on the basis of stock account balances before allocation of released shares for the current Plan year. Income is allocated based on each participant's share of the fund at the beginning of the year, less distributions and withdrawals during the year. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after six years of credited service.

Notwithstanding the above, participants shall, however, become 100% vested in the account upon attaining normal retirement age of 62, their death, or becoming permanently disabled.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to the extent required by Section 401(a)(22) and 409(e) to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to his or her account and is notified by the trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. Accordingly, the participants may exercise their voting rights with respect to any corporate matter which involves the voting of such shares with respect to the approval or disapproval of any corporate merger or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, sale of substantially all assets of a trade or business, or such similar transaction as may be prescribed by regulations.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand the Employer buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Distributions

Distributions from the Plan will be made after a participant retires, dies, or otherwise terminates employment. Distributions of vested accounts in excess of \$25,000 can be made in cash or in the form of Employer common shares plus cash for any fractional share. Distributions are paid over a period not longer than the greater of three years or, in the case of a participant with an account balance in excess of \$500,000, as indexed for cost of living under Section 409(o)2, three years and one additional year (but not more than three additional years) for each \$100,000 or fraction thereof exceeding \$500,000, as determined as of the effective date of the first distribution.

Distributions (Continued)

If the participant's vested account balance does not exceed \$25,000, the account will be distributed in a lump sum payment. The Plan also permits partial distributions to participants who have attained the age of 55 and have 10 years of service to allow them to diversify. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance is less than \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. If the account balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan administrator will authorize that the balance be rolled into an individual retirement account. The amount to be distributed is based upon the account valuation date immediately preceding the distribution. Distributions are made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Employer common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Employer common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. The Plan allows participants electing to diversify to choose how they would receive their funds and where it would be invested, if not received as a lump sum.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts are first used to restore amounts previously forfeited and then are reallocated annually to participants who are entitled to share in the contribution for that Plan year in the same manner as the Employer's contribution. Forfeitures totaling \$433,788 and \$372,218 were allocated during the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were no unallocated forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are valued at fair value, except for the Employer Common Stock which is at estimated fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan trustee and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

As provided in the Plan document, administrative expenses may be paid either by the Plan or by the Employer. The Employer has historically paid the operating expenses for the Plan.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 INVESTMENT IN EMPLOYER COMMON STOCK

The Plan's investment in Employer common stock is held by the trust department of an independent third-party bank. The following table presents pertinent information on this investment as of December 31:

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money Market Fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Employer Common Stock: Valued at estimated fair value based on an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal is based upon the discounted cash flow method, consistent with prior years. The appraiser took into account historical and projected sales, net income and other financial information, market comparables, and estimated fair value of the Employer assets and liabilities. Plan management has concluded that a market participant would also recognize a discount for lack of marketability.

NOTE 5 PLAN TERMINATION

Although the Employer has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the terms of the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and the interest of each participant will be distributed to the participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon Plan termination, the Plan Administrative Committee will direct the trustee of the Plan to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust.

NOTE 6 PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan has received a determination letter from the IRS stating that the Plan is qualified under IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 6 PLAN TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for various investment securities including Employer common stock. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and market risks. The stock of the Company is valued annually by a valuation specialist. Because of the inherent subjectivity in any valuation, those estimated values may differ significantly from the values that would have been used had a ready market for the securities existed, and the differences could be material. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plan's assets, which consist of Employer common shares and money market fund, are held by the trust department of an independent third-party bank and an independent investment custodian. Employer contributions are held and managed by the trustee and custodian, who invest cash received as a result of cash contributions, interest income, and dividend income, and make distributions to participants.

The Plan is administered by independent Plan administrators. The trust department of an independent third-party bank is the Plan trustee. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Employer. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE 9 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

FAST Global Solutions, Inc. common stock is held by the trustee of the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer repurchased 5,603 and 3,155 shares, respectively of common stock, from the Plan at the appraised value. The repurchase of stock was for payment of terminated participants' vested account balances, as well as participants who elected to diversify.

NOTE 10 EMPLOYER ADVANCES

During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer advanced \$12,119,889 and \$9,508,643, respectively, in cash to cover the Plan's distribution obligations. The advance was an interest-free loan to the Plan. No collateral was taken for the loan. Plan management believes that the loan complies with the requirements of the Department of Labor Prohibited Transaction Class Exemption 80-26. The loan was partially repaid to the Employer through redemption of shares (see Note 9), with the remainder being allocated to the participants as a contribution to the Plan.
