### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of MMHR 401(k) Pooled Employer Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the year ended December 31, 2024 and for the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of MMHR 401(k) Pooled Employer Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution and an agent on behalf of a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024 and for the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

#### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution and an agent on behalf of a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of MMHR 401(k) Pooled Employer Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a Pooled Employer Plan (PEP) established by Newport Group, Inc., the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP). The Plan was established under the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE Act) on July 1, 2023. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of the Participating Employers, and is intended to qualify under Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (IRC or Code), sections 401(a) and 501(a). The Plan is intended to constitute as a multiple employer plan, as described under Code sections 410(a), 411, 413, and 415. Each Participating Employer elects their own provisions related to eligibility, contributions, notes receivable from participants, and payments of benefits. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

**Eligibility**

Only those employees of any particular Participating Employer who are designated by the Participating Employer in its adoption agreement as eligible employees shall be eligible to participate in the Plan. Participating Employers may define eligibility requirements based on factors such as age, service, or employee type. Eligible employees shall be eligible to make participant contributions and receive allocations of employer contributions if and to the extent specified in the applicable adoption agreement or otherwise provided by the Plan.

**Contributions**

Eligible participants may elect to have a percentage of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan and Participating Employer adoption agreement, contributed as a pre-tax or Roth contributions. Participating Employers may elect safe harbor or non-safe harbor contribution provisions as well as compensation definitions. Eligible employees may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch up contributions. Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

The Participating Employers in the Plan may elect automatic enrollment and escalation features. Accordingly, the Participating Employer will automatically withhold a defined percentage of an eligible participant's compensation based on the Participating Employer's adoption agreement, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their contributions invested in the designated default fund until changed by the participant.

**Contributions (Continued)**

Under the terms of the Participating Employer adoption agreements, the Participating Employers may elect to make safe harbor contributions, matching contributions, nonelective contributions, prevailing wage contributions, qualified nonelective contributions (QNECs) or qualified matching contributions (QMACs) to the Plan. Participating Employers may also elect to make true-up matching contributions.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Participating Employers' contributions (if applicable), and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings (losses) or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Participating Employer contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of service, ranging from immediate vesting to six year graded or cliff vesting, as elected by each Participating Employer. Notwithstanding the above, participants become fully vested in the Participating Employer contributions upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or total or permanent disability.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

If elected by the Participating Employer, participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate determined by the PPP, which is prime rate plus 1% on the second business day of the month in which the loan is requested. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Benefit Payments**

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution or installments based on the Participating Employer's adoption agreement. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches age 59½ and hardship distributions subject to the Participating Employer's adoption agreement. Prior to January 1, 2024, as defined in the Participating Employer's adoption agreement, if the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1 and \$5,000, the PPP may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account (IRA) in the participant's name without the participant's consent. Effective January 1, 2024, if the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1 and \$7,000, the PPP may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an IRA in the participant's name without the participant's consent.

**NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Forfeited Accounts**

Forfeited nonvested accounts can be used to pay administrative expenses and to reduce future Participating Employer contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$16,478 and \$123, respectively. There were no forfeitures used to pay administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023. There were \$4,126 and \$-0- of forfeitures used to reduce Participating Employer contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the period the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, respectively.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Under that basis, certain additions are recognized when received and certain deductions are recognized when paid. Cash is stated at cost. Investments are stated at fair value. The modified cash basis of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America primarily because the effects of outstanding contributions and outstanding expenses are not included in the financial statements.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

**Contributions**

Contributions from participants and Participating Employer contributions are recorded in the year in which the contributions are received by the Plan.

**NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan document.

**Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

Reasonable expenses of the Plan, including trustee, attorneys, advisors, fiduciaries, and service providers are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers. Expenses that are paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 3 TRANSFERS OF FUNDS**

Upon termination or new entrance of a Participating Employer, funds may be transferred to or from other qualified plans. During the year ended December 31, 2024 and the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, transfers into the Plan from other qualified plans totaled \$685,178 and \$28,738,831, respectively. There were no transfers out of the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024 and the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

**NOTE 4 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION**

Newport Trust Company, the qualified institution of the Plan for the period July 1, 2023 through November 13, 2024, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment and notes receivable from participants information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2023 and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the period July 1, 2023 through November 13, 2024, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2023.

Ascensus, LLC, an agent on behalf of Ascensus Trust Company and Newport Trust Company, LLC, the qualified institution of the Plan for the period November 14, 2024 through December 31, 2024, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment and notes receivable from participants information reflected on the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the period November 14, 2024 through December 31, 2024, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024.

**NOTE 5 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds and the money market fund held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis.

**NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the PPP has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Participating Employer contributions.

**NOTE 8 PLAN TAX STATUS**

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter from the IRS on the pre-approved plan dated November 30, 2020 indicating that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable section of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the PPP believes that the Plan is designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The modified cash basis of accounting requires Plan management to evaluate if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by the qualified institution of the Plan; therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan issues notes receivable to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants accounts, which also qualify as party-in-interest transaction. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**NOTE 10 NONEXEMPT PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS**

During the year ended December 31, 2024 and the period July 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, there were instances where Participating Employers failed to timely remit employee 401(k) deferral contributions and loan repayments to the Plan for certain payroll periods within the time frame prescribed by the Department of Labor. These are deemed prohibited transactions in accordance with ERISA and the IRC.
