As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- The certified investment information in the accompanying financial statements agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).



Basis for Opinion

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments. Management is also responsible for administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.



In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to the Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Alpha Omega Integration, LLC 401(k) Retirement Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document and any amendments thereto for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was adopted effective January 1, 2003 by Alpha Omega Integration, LLC (Alpha Omega), the sponsor of the Plan, and includes employees of Alpha Omega and Trusted Mission Solutions, Inc. (collectively, the Employer or the Company). The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company, as defined below. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Trustee, Custodian and Administration of the Plan

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAICA) and Empower Trust Company, LLC (collectively, Empower), serve as the custodians and trustees of the Plan. The recordkeeper of the Plan is Empower Trust Company, LLC. The administrator of the Plan is the Company. Empower holds all assets of the Plan in accordance with the service provider contract with the Company. The Plan's management manages the operation and administration of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company who are age 21 or older and have completed 30 days of service are considered eligible for participation, except for: (1) Union employees; (2) interns; (3) leased employees; (4) part-time employees working less than 1,000 hours; (5) temporary employees (6) seasonal employees; and (4) independent contractors.

An eligible participant can enter the Plan on the first day of the month following the date the eligibility requirements are met.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum allowed, as defined in the Plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participant salary deferrals may be traditional 401(k) (pre-tax) or Roth 401(k) (after-tax). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions, subject to limitations imposed by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts (rollovers). Newly eligible participants are automatically enrolled at a pre-tax deferral rate of 6%, unless a participant specifically elects an alternative deferral amount or elects not to participate.

The Company provides a safe harbor contribution in an amount equal to 100% of a participant's elective deferrals up to 1% of a participant's eligible compensation, and 50% of the participant's elective deferrals that exceed 1% of the participant's eligible compensation but do not exceed 6% of the participant's eligible compensation. The Company may also make an additional discretionary matching contribution. No additional discretionary matching contributions were made during 2024.

The Company may also make a non-elective discretionary contribution (profit-sharing contribution) to the Plan. Participants must have performed one year of service (defined as 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year) and be employed on the last day of the plan year, except in the event of death, disability or retirement during the year, to be eligible for the profit-sharing contribution. For 2024, profit-sharing contributions of \$41,301 were made. Such contributions are calculated on a plan year basis.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a fixed income guaranteed option, as investment options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and an allocation of net Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which participants are entitled is the vested portion of their accounts.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in safe harbor employer matching contributions, and the related earnings thereon, is 100% upon the completion of two years of service. Profit sharing and employer matching contributions, and the related earnings thereon, vest at a rate of 20% each year beginning with the first year of service, with full vesting after five years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are permitted to borrow a minimum of \$1,000 of their vested benefits under the Plan. Participants may borrow up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in their account during the prior 12-month period. The maximum term of a note for general purpose may not exceed five years, however, if the loan is used for the purchase of a primary residence, the term may exceed five years. Participants are allowed to have one outstanding note at any given time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate fixed at 1% greater than the prevailing prime commercial rate at the date the loan was made. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. These loans are subject to certain restrictions as defined by the Plan Document and applicable restrictions under the IRC.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, retirement (age 65), disability or death, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive an amount equal to the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution or select installment options as permitted by the Plan. Hardship distributions are permitted upon demonstration of financial hardship, with limitations defined in the Plan agreement.

In-service distributions are available from fully vested sources after the participant reaches the age of 59½.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$11,054 and \$57,737, respectively. Forfeited accounts are utilized to either reduce Plan expenses or to reduce employer contributions. During 2024, forfeitures of \$306,247 were used to reduce employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from estimated amounts.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, with the exception of the fully benefit-responsive investment contract. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser and custodians. See Note 4 for additional information related to fair value measurements.

Investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value (see Note 5).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Contributions Receivable

Participant contributions and any related employer safe harbor contributions are recognized in the period during which the Company makes the respective payroll deduction from the participant's compensation. Discretionary matching or Non-elective/profit sharing contributions are recorded in the relevant period in accordance with the terms in the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of participant-initiated transactions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

3. Certified Investment Information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year), including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower, a qualified institution.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds - These assets are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions

made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on an agreed-upon formula but may not be less than zero. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuers. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan document (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) premature termination of the contracts, (4) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (5) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material representation or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

6. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are funds managed by Empower or its affiliates. Empower is the custodian and trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services are included in net depreciation in fair value of investments. Other expenses may be paid through revenue-sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

7. Income Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Coastal Pension Services, Inc. Coastal Pension Services, Inc. received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 2020, which states that the pre-approved plan document, as then designed, satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to reduce or discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts in the financial statements and participant account balances.

10. Prohibited Transactions

During the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, participant contributions and loan repayments totaling \$186,585 were not remitted to the Plan within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. These transactions constitute non-exempt party-in-interest transactions or prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Plan's management is working to calculate lost earnings and will remit them to the Plan and correct the late remittances during 2025.

11. Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

During January 2025, the Company acquired Macro Solutions, LLC and SeKON Enterprise, LLC. Effective July 1, 2025, the Macro Solutions, LLC 401(k) Plan was merged into the Plan. Effective July 1, 2025, the SeKON Enterprise, LLC 401(k) Plan merged into the Plan.
