**Notes to Financial Statements**

---

**(1) Description of the Plan**

The following description of the Steamfitters Welfare Fund Local Union #475 (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General** - The Plan is a multiemployer collectively bargained defined benefit health and welfare plan. The Plan was established in accordance with an agreement entered into among Steamfitters Local Union #475 (the "Local"), Mechanical Contractors Association of New Jersey, and other independent contractors in 1951. The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of a Board of Trustees, comprised of union and employer trustees. The jurisdiction of the Fund includes Essex and Union County, portions of Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Morris, Somerset and Warren Counties. The Plan covers all members employed under the terms of the collective bargaining agreement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Contributions** - Contributions to the Plan are made by participating employers in accordance with their collective bargaining agreements with the Union. The collective bargaining agreements require contributions to the Plan as a percentage of gross wages. Former employees covered under COBRA make contributions to the Plan for continuation of health coverage. **Welfare Benefits** - Under the Plan, coverage is maintained on a self-funded basis for benefits such as hospitalization, surgical, major medical, maternity, dental, prescription drug, organ transplant, hospital maternity, vision, supplemental disability and death benefits.

**Personal Benefit** - Personal Benefit is a defined contribution feature funded by employer contributions allocated to a participant's Personal Benefit account and is intended to cover medical and other benefits not otherwise covered by the traditional plan. Eligible expenses will be reimbursed up to the amount of the participant's account balance.

For participants with a personal benefit individual account balance of less than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00), the eight percent (8.0%) personal benefit contribution based on the gross wage shall be distributed in its entirety to the Steamfitters Welfare Fund Local Union No. 475. For participants with a personal benefit individual account balance of more than forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00), the ten percent (10.0%) personal benefit contribution based on the gross wage shall be distributed in its entirety to the Steamfitters Surety Fund Local Union No. 475. The determination of the balance in a participant's personal benefit individual account will be determined on March 1st of each calendar year by the administrative office of the Funds.

*(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies*

**Basis of Accounting** - The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Adoption of Recent Accounting Pronouncements** - Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan adopted ASC 326 which changed how entities will measure credit losses for certain financial assets that aren't measured at fair value through changes in net assets available to benefits. The most significant change in this standard is a shift from the incurred loss model to the expected loss model. Under the standard, disclosures are required to provide users of the financial statements with useful information in analyzing the Plan's exposure to credit risk and the measurement of credit losses. The primary financial asset held by the Plan that is subject to the guidance in ASC 326 is employers' contributions receivable. The impact of the adoption was not considered material to the financial statements and primarily resulted solely in enhanced disclosures.

On July 30, 2025, the FASB issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2025-05, Financial Instruments-Credit Losses (Topic 326): Measurement of Credit Losses for Accounts Receivable and Contract Assets. This standard allows entities to elect a practical expedient that assumes that current conditions as of the fiscal year-end do not change for the remaining life of the asset. In addition, the standard provides for consideration of subsequent collections in developing reasonable and supportable forecasts as part of estimating expected credit losses. The Plan elected to early adopt this standard in the reporting period ended December 31, 2024.

**Use of Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations and changes therein, incurred but not reported eligibility credits, claims payable and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information principally provided by the investment custodian.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation and depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Employers' Contributions** - The Plan's policy is to recognize contributions based on the latest executed collective bargaining agreement on an individual employer basis. Contributions from participating employers are based on a percentage of the participating employers' wages for covered employees and are payable to the Plan during the subsequent month. Contributions due but not paid prior to year-end are recorded as contributions receivable. The Plan evaluates participating employers' contributions receivable periodically for potential uncollectible amounts based on the likelihood of collection, including subsequent period collection activity. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan did not record a credit loss allowance for employers' contributions receivable.

The Board of Trustees has established a program to review participating employer records in order to determine compliance with contribution provisions of the collective bargaining agreement. As a result of this program, previously unreported contributions are identified related to current and prior fiscal years. However, due to the collection efforts required by the Plan, including litigation, the ultimate realization of any additional contribution receivable cannot be reasonably estimated until the collection process is completed. Accordingly, the Plan primarily recognizes these previously unreported contributions in the fiscal year in which the settlement proceeds are received.

**Property and Equipment** - Property and equipment are recorded at cost, less accumulated depreciation. Major additions are capitalized, whereas replacements, maintenance, and repairs, which do not improve or extend the useful lives of the respective assets, are expensed currently. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives. The other affiliated funds of Steamfitters Local Union #475 are allocated a portion of depreciation expense.

Depreciation expense was \$1,359 and \$1,326 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and is presented net of depreciation allocated to related Steamfitters Local Union #475 Funds.

**Long-Lived Asset Impairment** - The Plan reviews the carrying value of assets employed in operations for impairment whenever events and circumstances indicate that the carrying value of an asset may not be recoverable from the estimated future cash flows expected to result from its use and eventual disposition. In cases where undiscounted expected future cash flows are less than the carrying value, an impairment loss is recognized equal to an amount by which the carrying value exceeds the fair value of assets. The factors considered by management in performing this assessment include the manner in which the property is used, and the effects of obsolescence and other economic factors. Based on this assessment there was no impairment at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Leases** - Leases are categorized at their inception as either operating or financing leases. Operating right-of-use assets and liabilities are recognized at the lease commencement date based on the present value of the lease payments over the lease term. Leased assets represent the Plan's right to use an underlying asset for the lease term, and lease liabilities represent the Plan's obligation to make lease payments arising from the lease. The lease term may include options to extend or terminate the lease when it is reasonably certain that the Plan will exercise that option. Lease expense for lease payments is recognized on a straight-line basis over the lease term. The Plan uses a risk-free discount rate when the rate implicit in the lease contract is not readily determinable.

**Stop Loss** - Claims that were already paid from the Plan that exceeded the stop-loss coverage and are due to the Plan at year-end are recorded as a receivable. Premiums for stop-loss insurance are included in stop loss insurance payments in the accompany statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Stop-Loss refunds totaling \$24,332 and \$-0-, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, have been subtracted from benefits paid directly to or for participants in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Refunds and Rebates** - Prescription refunds due from the Plan's PBM are recorded when earned. Refunds due at year-end are recorded as a receivable on the statements of net assets available for benefits, with the offset being classified against claims paid. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, Pharmacy rebates totaling \$937,042 and \$738,231, respectively, have been classified against claims paid in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

**Administrative Expenses** - Expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. The Plan shares certain administrative expenses with related ERISA plans. In computing these allocated costs, various factors were considered, including the time spent, space used, costs incurred, and volume of transactions relating to the Plan in relation to the other plans.

**Subsequent Events** - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### *(3) Postretirement and Postemployment Benefit Obligations*

The postretirement benefit obligation represents the total actuarial present value of those estimated future benefits that are attributed to employee service rendered to December 31. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid to or for (1) currently retired or terminated employees and their beneficiaries and dependents and (2) active employees and their beneficiaries and dependents after retirement from service with the participating employers. Prior to an active employee's full eligibility date, the postretirement benefit obligation is the portion of the expected postretirement benefit obligation that is attributed to that employee's service in the industry rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of the expected postretirement benefit obligation is determined by an actuary and is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to historical claims-cost data to estimate future annual incurred claims costs per participant and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as those for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The following were other significant assumptions used in the valuations as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

The foregoing assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. If the Plan were to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of the postretirement benefit obligation.

**Other Plan Benefits** - Plan obligations at December 31, 2024 and 2023 for health claims incurred by active participants but not reported at that date, and for accumulated eligibility of participants are estimated by the Plan's actuary in accordance with accepted actuarial principles.

**Changes in Actuarial Assumptions** - In 2024, the per capita cost assumption was updated to reflect claims experience for the plan year ending December 31, 2024, the healthcare cost trend assumption was updated to reflect the potential impact of the inflation reduction act and the single-equivalent discount rate decreased from 4.81% to 5.51% based on matching the plan's projected cashflows to the spot rates in the FTSE Pension Discount Curve as of the measurement date.

In 2023, the per capita cost assumption was updated to reflect claims experience for the plan year ending December 31, 2023 and the single-equivalent discount rate decreased from 5.01% to 4.81% based on matching the plan's projected cashflows to the spot rates in the FTSE Pension Discount Curve as of the measurement date.

The Plan's deficiency of net assets compared to benefit obligations at December 31, 2024 and 2023, relates primarily to the present value of postretirement benefit obligations, the funding of which is not covered by net assets generated cumulatively through those dates by the contribution rate provided by the current bargaining agreement. It is expected that those future benefits will be funded through a combination of future contributions, increases in the collectively bargained contribution rates, and modifications in eligibility rules and benefit schedules as available.

*(5) Fair Value Measurements*

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets, that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest Bearing Cash Accounts: Valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value.

U.S. Government Securities: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded (Level 1).

Common Collective Trust: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

**(5) Fair Value Measurements (Continued)**

Guaranteed Investment Contracts: Guaranteed investment contracts are valued at fair value by the insurance company by discounting the expected future investment cash flow from both investment income and repayment of principal for each underlying investment purchased directly for the General Account. This calculation takes into account the lower of value of impaired investments that have not yet been reflected in determining gross interest rates. The interest discount rates assumed in these calculations reflect both the current level of market rates and spreads appropriate to the quality, average life and type of investment being valued. Separate calculations are made for each investment year cell. The resulting market value factors are then applied to the investment year breakdown of net cash flow as recorded in the Experience Rating Fund for the Plan's contract. The weighted average factor derived from this calculation is used to calculate the market value of the Plan's contract.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**Transfers Between Levels** - The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another.

The Plan evaluates the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the financial instrument and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits.

The Plan maintains investment contracts with Empower, under which the Plan has no minimum required deposits per year. Empower maintains contributions in Empowers' general account. For contract 557450-E3-00, interest is added at a rate of 4.30% for new money and 3.80% for old money. For contract 557450-E4-00, interest is added at a rate of 4.20% for new money and 3.50% for old money. The interest rates are adjusted annually. When changed, the new rates apply only to funds deposited from the date of change.

**(6) Leases**

The Plan has several office equipment lease agreements with third-parties which provide for minimum rental payments through lease terms expiring through 2027. This includes an option to purchase the equipment at fair value at the end of the lease term. If the equipment is not purchased and not returned, the lease will automatically renew for additional period(s). The exercise of these renewal options is at the sole discretion of the Plan, and only lease options that the Plan believes are reasonably certain to exercise are included in the measurement of the lease assets and liabilities. Variable payments are not determinable at the lease commencement and are not included in the measurement of the lease assets and liabilities.

Because the initial term of these leases are greater than a year, the Plan records the related right-of-use assets and liabilities at the present value of the lease payments to be paid over the life of the related lease. The present value of lease payments is calculated by utilizing the discount rate stated in the lease when readily determinable.

Because the Plan does not have access to the rate implicit in the leases, the Plan utilizes the risk free interest rate as the discount rate. The weighted average remaining lease term in years for the leases was 2.42. The weighted average discount rate for the leases was 1.84%. In determining that rate, the Plan considers prevailing economic conditions at the commencement date and factors such as credit risk, term of lease and options, and the effect of collateralization based on the nature of and quality of the underlying asset.

The operating lease expense for the year ending December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$15,543 and \$16,185, respectively.

#### *(7) Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions*

The Plan pays fees for several arrangements with services providers and affiliated entities. These transactions are considered exempt party in interest transactions under ERISA.

The Plan leases office space on a month-to-month basis from the Steamfitters Pension Fund Local Union #475, along with three other affiliated funds of the Local Union. The current monthly rental payment is \$699 and is subject to annual adjustment on November 30, 2025. Rent expenses for the Plan were \$8,384 and \$8,384 for the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023, respectively.

Certain administrative and building related expenses incurred by the Steamfitters Pension Fund Local Union #475 are allocated to the various affiliated funds. The Plan's share amounted to \$25,487 and \$22,270 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan allocates certain administrative expenses throughout the course of the year to the affiliated funds. This allocation amounted to \$505,012 and \$454,976 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

***(7) Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions (Continued)***

The net amounts due from the Local Union and the affiliated funds of the Plan at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$48,573 and \$43,947, respectively, resulting from the previously described transactions. ***(8) Reciprocity Agreements***

The Plan has entered into reciprocity agreements with certain welfare funds administered by various local unions. In accordance with these agreements, the Plan is required to remit funds received and is entitled to receive funds from participating employers on behalf of temporary employees to and from the employees' participating local unions.

For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan remitted reciprocal payments of \$385,946 and \$570,297, respectively, and received reciprocal payments of \$577,805 and \$964,279, respectively, in accordance with these agreements with the participating local unions. Reciprocal payments received are included in the employer's contributions in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. No allowance for credit losses as of December 31, 2024 or 2023, was necessary for reciprocal payments due to the Plan. Payments made to other plans for reciprocal contributions collected on behalf of those plans are recorded as a reduction to the reciprocal contributions payable account and are not included in the consolidated statement of changes in net assets available for benefits as they do not represent an expense of the Plan.

***(9) Multiemployer Pension Plans***

The Plan contributes to a multiemployer defined benefit pension plan, Steamfitters Pension Fund Local Union #475. The following table outlines the Plan's participation in this plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and sets forth calendar year contributions into the plan. The "EIN/Pension Plan Number" column provides the Employer Identification Number ("EIN") and the three-digit plan number. The most recent Pension Protection Act zone status available in 2024 and 2023 relates to the plan's two most recent fiscal year-ends. The zone status is based on information received from the plan's administrator and is certified by the plan's actuary. Among other factors, plans certified in the red zone are generally less than 65% funded, plans certified in the orange zone are both less than 80% funded and have an accumulated funding deficiency or are expected to have a deficiency in any of the next six plan years, plans certified in the yellow zone are less than 80% funded, and plans certified in the green zone are at least 80% funded. The "FIP/RP Status Pending/Implemented" column indicates whether a financial improvement plan ("FIP") for yellow/orange zone plans, or a rehabilitation plan ("RP") for red zone plans, is either pending or has been implemented. As of December 31, 2023, the plan had not implemented a FIP. The Plan did not provide more than 5% of the contributions by all contributing employers to this plan. There is no collective bargaining agreement associated with the Plan's participation in this plan.

**(10) Tax Status**

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on September 8, 2004, stating that the VEBA trust established under the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the provisions of Section 501(c)(9) of the IRC. No federal or state income taxes have been recorded in 2024 for unrelated business taxable income. The Plan and trust are required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status of the trust. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if it has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**(11) Plan Termination**

Under certain conditions, the Plan may be terminated. Upon termination, the assets then remaining will be subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan then in effect and will be used until exhausted to pay benefits to participants in the order of their entitlement, subject to the provisions of ERISA.

**(12) Risks and Uncertainties**

**Investment Risk** - The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**Actuarial Assumptions** - The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefit obligations are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

**Concentration of Credit Risk** - Financial instruments which potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk are cash, and employers' and reciprocal contributions receivable arising from its normal business activities. The Plan routinely assesses the financial strength of its employers and reciprocals based upon factors surrounding the building trades industry and its geographic locations. A substantial portion of the Plan's income is derived from the employers of this industry which is in turn dependent upon the stability and environment of the local economy. A downturn in the industry would affect employer contributions. A surety bond is required of certain contractors which reduces the risk of possible losses due to delinquent employer contributions.


