Note 1 – Plan Description

The following description of Bronco Wine Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of Plan provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan and was established on October 1, 1975. The Plan covers all employees of Bronco Wine Company and related entities, Barrel Ten Quarter Circle, Inc., WG AG Services, Inc., and Bivio Transport and Logistics, LLC (together, the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the first quarter following one year and 1,000 hours of service. Employees may roll over a tax deferred amount from another qualified plan prior to meeting the eligibility requirements for deferrals under the Plan. Eligibility for employer matching contributions will occur on the first day of the Plan year preceding the satisfaction of one year and 1,000 hours of service. Eligibility for employer profit sharing contributions will occur on the earlier of the first day of the seventh month or the first day of the Plan year coinciding with or next following one year and 1,000 hours of service. Employees must be employed as of the last day of the Plan year to be eligible to receive any employer matching or employer profit sharing contributions.

Effective January 1, 2024, employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following three months of service. Eligibility for employer profit sharing contributions will occur semi-annually as of the first day of the first month and of the seventh month of the Plan year preceding satisfaction of one year and 1,000 hours of service.

Contributions

Participant contributions – Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan contains an automatic enrollment feature whereby all eligible employees who have not completed a salary deferral agreement, or opted out, will be automatically enrolled in the Plan with a 3% salary deferral. The automatic enrollment feature also includes an automatic increase each Plan year of 1% not to exceed an 8% salary deferral. Participants may make changes to the deferral percentage or cancel their deferral by completing a salary deferral agreement at any time.

Employer match and profit sharing contributions – The Company may elect to make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The Company may make matching contributions and has elected to match 50% of the first 6% of employee contributions, up to 3% of total compensation deferred to the Plan. The Company contributed \$978,378 for the match portion during the year ended December 31, 2024. Profit sharing contributions are allocated to participants in the same proportion as a participant's compensation bears to the total of all eligible participants' compensation. The Company contributed \$64,411 for the profit sharing portion of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

Participant accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and the employer matching contributions, as well as allocations of the employer profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Participant’s accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Profit sharing accounts are maintained separately for each participant. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined.

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Participants direct the investment of their participant and employer matching contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Profit sharing contributions, detailed at Note 3, are nonparticipant-directed.

Vesting for existing participants – Employee deferrals and employer matching contributions are 100% vested at all times. Participant’s profit sharing accounts vest in accordance with the following schedule:

0 – 1 year	0%
2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 years or more	100%

In the event of termination due to death, disability, or retirement, all balances, including profit sharing accounts, are 100% vested and the participant or beneficiary will receive full payment as soon as administratively possible.

Notes receivable from participants – Participants may borrow money from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Only one loan may be outstanding at any one time. The loans are issued by the Plan and secured by the vested balance in the participant’s account. All loans must be repaid within a period of five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a principal residence, in which case, the loan must be repaid within a reasonable period of time not to exceed ten years. Under the terms of the Plan agreement, plan loans will bear interest at bank prime rate plus 2%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024, the rates of interest on outstanding loans ranged from 5.25% to 10.50% with various maturities throughout January 2034.

Payment of benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant is immediately 100% vested in all contributions and may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s account.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant’s account that is lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and will be reallocated as additional employer contributions, used to reduce future employer contributions, or to apply to plan expenses.

Note 2 – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation – The investments are reported at fair value and contract value. The Plan's custodian, Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower), certifies the contract value of the guaranteed investment contract and the fair value of all other investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (i.e., the exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

The Plan's custodian, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower), certifies the contract value of the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value is the relevant measurement for assets invested in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Income recognition – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. The net appreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains or losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

Notes receivable from participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at amortized cost, which represents unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions upon the occurrence of a distributable event, based on the terms of the Plan agreement. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan administrative expenses – Investment fees pertaining to the custody of the Plan assets and execution of investment transactions are paid by the Plan. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Administrative fees pertaining to the third-party administrator and independent auditor are paid by the Company and are not included in these financial statements.

Subsequent events – Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are available to be issued. The Plan recognizes in the financial statements the effects of all subsequent events that provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing the financial statements. The Plan’s financial statements do not recognize subsequent events that provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at the date of the statements of net assets available for benefits, but arose after the statements of net assets available for benefits date and before the financial statements are available to be issued.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Common stocks – Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Collective trusts – Units held in collective trusts (CTs) are valued using the net asset value practical expedient (NAV practical expedient) of the CTs as reported by the CT managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CTs, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the NAV practical expedient.

Pooled separate accounts – Units held in pooled separate accounts (PSAs) are valued using the net asset value practical expedient (NAV practical expedient) of the PSA as reported by the account managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the PSA, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds) and a money market mutual fund – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

The valuation methods used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contract with Empower

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (FBRIC) with Empower. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The FBRIC does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The contract meets the FBRIC criteria and is therefore reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for FBRICs because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations, which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) the complete or partial termination of the Plan; (2) the establishment or activation of, or material change in, any Plan investment fund, or amendment to the Plan or a change in the administration or operation of the Plan, including the removal of a group of employees from Plan coverage as a result of the sale or liquidation of a subsidiary or division or as a result of group layoffs or early retirement programs. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

Note 6 – Tax Status

The Plan document is a volume submitter defined contribution plan that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated November 14, 2022, which stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the Trustees have evaluated the Plan's tax positions and do not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. It is reasonably possible, given the level of risk associated with the investment securities, that changes in the values of investments in the near term could materially affect a participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8 – Certified Investment Information

The following information related to investments was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower, a qualified institution:

- Investments in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, guaranteed investment contracts, collective trusts and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments of \$6,619,251, dividends, and interest reflected on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

- Interest income from notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at the end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 9 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan paid expenses related to Plan operations and investment management to various service providers. Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower, the custodian, of the Plan. Therefore, transactions with these entities qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 10 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan and discontinue its contributions at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participant's account become fully vested.

Note 11 – Reconciliation to 5500

The Form 5500 has certain items that differ from amounts shown on the accompanying financial statements. These differences relate to classification only and have no effect upon net assets available for benefits for either period.
