1. Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Rapp Petroleum Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for complete information.

General

Rapp Petroleum Corporation (the Company) established the Rapp Petroleum Employee Stock Ownership Plan effective July 1, 1998. As of January 1, 2015, the Plan was amended and restated and operates, in relevant part, as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (IRC) and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

The Plan purchased Company common stock using a Securities Acquisition Loan (the loan) from the Company and holds the common stock in a trust established under the Plan. The loan was to be repaid over a period of fifteen years with Company contributions to the Plan. As the Plan made each payment of principal, an appropriate percentage of stock was allocated to eligible participants' accounts in accordance with provisions of the Plan. The loan was collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock. The loan was fully repaid in 2016 and the remaining collateralized shares were released and allocated to eligible participants.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company and its wholly-owned subsidiary are generally eligible to participate in the Plan retroactively to the first day of the plan year in which the employee first completes 1,000 hours of service provided the employee has attained age twenty-one. Participants who do not have at least 1,000 hours of service during such plan year or are not employed on the last day of the plan year are generally not eligible for an allocation of Company contributions for such year.

Contributions

The Company shall make contributions to the Plan as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors in cash or shares of Company common stock. However, all common stock of the Company is currently owned by the Plan; therefore, contributions have been made in cash.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions on account of death, disability, or attaining normal retirement age are made in a lump sum in the plan year following the event, if the participant's vested balance is less than \$5,000. For vested balances exceeding \$5,000, distributions will be made in equal annual installments over five years or an increased period as per the provisions of the Plan for balances exceeding \$210,000. Distributions for other separations from service commence in the sixth plan year following the separation from service and are made in equal annual installments over five years or an increased period as per the provisions of the Plan for balances exceeding \$210,000. However, if the participant's vested account balance is less than \$5,000, distribution shall be made in a lump sum as soon as administratively feasible after the participant incurs a one-year break in service. Distributions can be made in cash or, if a participant elects, in the form of Company common stock plus cash for any fractional share of common stock.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Company is obligated to repurchase participant shares which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan. Historically, all distributions have been made in cash and the Company has not repurchased any shares from participants.

Voting Rights

Participants and/or beneficiaries are entitled to direct the trustee as to the voting of any voting shares allocated to his or her account with respect to any vote required for the approval or disapproval of any corporate merger or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, sale of substantially all the assets of a trade or business, or other similar transactions prescribed by regulation. The trustee shall vote any unallocated shares held by the trust as well as any allocated shares for which a participant has failed to give timely voting direction.

Plan Termination

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the accounts of all affected participants will become 100% vested and will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of the employer contribution and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Generally, only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's beginning of the year account balance to all participants' beginning of the year account balances.

Vesting

Participants will vest 20% after two years of service and an additional 20% each year thereafter through the sixth year in which they will be 100% vested. Participants vest 100% upon attaining normal retirement age or if employment is terminated due to death or total disability.

Prior to full loan repayment in 2016, participants became 20% vested in their accounts after three years of service and vested an additional 20% each year thereafter with 100% vesting after seven years of service.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase of such shares in a single payment or in five equal annual installments with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash. There were no put options exercised during the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account in the plan year following the plan year they reach eligibility. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to a cumulative 25% of the shares allocated to his or her account. In the sixth year, the participant may diversify up to a cumulative 50%.

Forfeitures

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's eligible compensation to total eligible compensation for the plan year. Forfeitures of terminated nonvested account balances allocated to remaining participants at December 31, 2023, totaled 269 shares of Company common stock and \$37 of cash. Forfeitures of terminated nonvested account balances allocated to remaining participants at December 31, 2022, totaled 142 shares of Company common stock and \$87 of cash.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

It is Plan management's policy to include short-term, highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less in cash and cash equivalents. Short-term investments consist of a money market mutual fund.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The shares of Company common stock are valued at fair value. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the plan's gains and losses on Company common stock held during the years. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

All expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to measure the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value at the reporting date.

The accounting framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. Level 3 inputs were used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on deposit to be invested in a money market mutual fund and investments in the money market mutual fund which invests primarily in short term U.S. Government and U.S. Treasury securities, valued based on the quoted market price.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of the Company common stock is based on an annual independent valuation. This valuation was based on a combination of the market and income valuation approaches consistent with prior years. The valuation specialist took into account historical and projected cash flow and net earnings, weighted average cost of capital, market comparables, and applicable discounts and premiums.

The Plan's policy is to recognize transfers into and out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, there were no transfers into or out of Level 3.

4. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated July 19, 2016, that the Plan is qualified and the trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt, under the appropriate sections of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. Administration of Plan Assets

The Plan's assets, which consist principally of Company common stock, are held by the trustee of the Plan.

Company contributions are held and managed by the trustee, which invests cash received and makes distributions to participants.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses for the trustee and third party administrator's fees are paid directly by the Company.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan's investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks, including interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings and cash flows. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

8. Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in Company common stock. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As described in Notes 2 and 5, the Company pays the expenses of the Plan. The Plan uses service providers for recordkeeping and trustee services. Such providers are parties-in-interest under ERISA.

9. Subsequent Events

The Plan's management has evaluated events occurring subsequent to year-end through April 30, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for financial reporting and disclosure purposes. Plan management identified the following subsequent event:

For the period from January 1, 2024 through April 30, 2025 benefit payments of approximately \$408,521 were made to participants.
