Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements conform with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance. Therefore, it is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users made on the basis of these financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

#### Other Matter — Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 and Schedule H Line 4i Schedule of Assets (Held at Year End) as of December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or are derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Haribo of America, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Adoption Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Haribo of America Inc. (the “Sponsor”) who have completed 6 months of service. The entry date is the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date the employee satisfies the eligibility requirement. Certain employees are generally excluded from the Plan, including union member, nonresident aliens, leased employees, temporary employees, and foreign exchange students. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employer Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”) and the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

Contributions

Each participant may contribute, on a pre-tax or after-tax basis, a percentage of compensation, as defined by the Plan, subject to IRC limitations, in the form of a salary deferral. Participants may also make rollover contributions to the Plan, which represent distributions from other qualified plans.

The Plan includes an automatic salary deferral feature which applies to all participants except those who had a salary deferral agreement in effect on the automatic deferral provision effective date. Participants not electing otherwise, are automatically enrolled to make salary deferral contributions to the Plan in the amount of 5% of their compensation.

The Sponsor makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 5% of employee compensation. This contribution is 100% vested.

Investment options

The Plan’s assets are held by Bank of America, N.A. (the “Custodian”), the custodian of the Plan’s assets. Under an arrangement with the Custodian and upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct employee contributions in any whole percentage increments in any of the available funds. Participants may change their allocation to the various investment options at any time via the internet.

Participant accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with (a) the participant’s contributions, (b) the Sponsor’s contributions on behalf of the participant, and (c) the earnings and losses of the participant’s investments and is charged with any expenses incurred as a result of transactions initiated by the participant. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their accounts attributable to salary deferrals including after-tax deferrals, and catch-up contributions, safe harbor matching and rollover contributions.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow, from their fund accounts, amounts up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. The maximum term of repayment for a loan is five years, unless it is for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the maximum term may be longer. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at fixed rates commensurate with prevailing market rates for similar loans, as determined by the plan administrator at the date of origination. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% on participant loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### Payment of benefits

Upon termination of employment, attainment retirement age, or for reasons of death or disability, participants may withdraw the vested portion of their account in the form of a lump sum or partial installment. Participants still employed with the Sponsor may withdraw all or a portion of their account balance attributable to their salary deferral contributions and actual earnings thereon upon attainment of age 59½ or for reasons of a financial hardship, as allowed under the IRC. A participant whose vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000 will receive a lump sum distribution of their vested account balance as soon as administratively feasible following termination.

#### Administrative expenses

Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and payments of benefits are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Fees related to investment management are also paid by the Plan and allocated to participant accounts.

## 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### Use of estimates in financial statement preparation

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded at the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments funds includes realized and unrealized gains and losses on those investments.

#### Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions based upon the Plan's provisions.

#### Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Expenses

Certain expenses incurred to maintain the Plan are paid directly by the Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Indirect investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation/ depreciation of fair value of investments.

#### Subsequent events

The Sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

## 3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's (the "DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by the Custodian, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

#### 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

##### Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

##### Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

##### Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value.

- Mutual funds and money market funds: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price, and are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Sponsor believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There were no changes in the methodology used during the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

#### 5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Sponsor pays certain costs on behalf of the Plan for insurance, administration and professional services. Recordkeeping and administrative services are also provided by the Sponsor at no cost to the Plan.

#### 6. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### 7. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan utilizes the prototype profit sharing/money purchase/CODA Plan sponsored by Merrill Lynch Pierce Fenner & Smith Inc., who was informed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the plan, as amended, is designed and being operated in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Though the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The sponsor has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are no audits for any tax periods in progress, and the plan administrator believes that the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

## 8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all amounts credited to participant account will continue to be 100% vested.
