NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the IV Media LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete information.

General

The Plan, which was established on October 1, 1994, is a defined contribution plan by iMedia Brands, Inc. and its subsidiaries (the Employer or Company) to provide benefits to eligible employees who have completed one month of service. Eligible employees become a participant in the Plan on the first day of the payroll period on or next following the date in which the eligibility requirement is met. The subsidiaries that have elected to participate in the Plan include ValueVision Interactive, Inc., VVI Fulfillment Center, Inc., ValueVision Retail, Inc. and ValueVision Media Acquisitions, Inc. The Plan is currently designed to be qualified under the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), as amended, and the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Effective July 31, 2021, the Plan was amended to recognize prior service with Synacor, Inc. Portal Business Segment for purposes of eligibility and vesting.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to exclude bonuses and reimbursements or other expense allowances, fringe benefits, moving expenses and welfare benefits from eligible compensation.

Effective September 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to exclude nonresident aliens with no U.S. source income, interns, and independent contractors from eligibility and participation.

As of August 16, 2023, IV Media, LLC acquired iMedia Brands, Inc. and became the Plan Sponsor, renaming the plan as the IV Media LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan. All terms of the plan remain unchanged.

Effective June 1, 2024, the Plan amended its involuntary cash out and automatic rollover provisions as eligible rollover distributions of account balances of \$5,000 or less will be subject to automatic rollover requirements.

Plan Administration

The Company has appointed a Retirement Plan Committee (the Committee) to manage the operation and administration of the Plan. The Company has contracted with Transamerica Retirement Solutions (Transamerica) to process and maintain the records of participant data, and with State Street Bank and Trust Company and Transamerica Trust Company to act as the trustee and custodian, respectively, (collectively referred to as the trustees).

Investments

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and the Plan Sponsor's contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, an interest-bearing cash fund, a collective trust fund, and a personal choice retirement account, as investment options for participants. Automatically enrolled participants were defaulted into a Fidelity Target Date fund based on the year the participant will reach 65 years of age, unless otherwise elected by the participant.

Participant Contributions

Participants may elect to have the Company contribute their eligible pretax compensation to the Plan in the form of pretax and Roth deferrals up to the maximum amount allowable under the Plan document and current income tax regulations, including catch-up deferrals for eligible participants who are age 50 or older.

The Plan also provides for the automatic enrollment of eligible employees in the Plan with a contribution of 6% of eligible compensation unless the employee affirmatively elects otherwise.

Participants who elect to contribute a portion of their compensation to the Plan agree to accept an equivalent reduction in taxable compensation. Contributions withheld are invested in accordance with the participant's direction.

Participants are also allowed to make rollover contributions of amounts received from other tax-qualified retirement plans. Such contributions are deposited in the appropriate investment funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the Plan's provisions.

Employer Contributions

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan. Participants are eligible to receive discretionary matching contributions after completing six months of service. For the period of January 1, 2023 through March 9, 2023, the Company made matching contributions each payroll period equal to 50% of the first 6% of base compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan. Effective, March 10, 2023, the Company made matching contributions each payroll period equal to 50% of the first 3% of base compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan. The discretionary match is subject to annual true-up.

The Company may also make a discretionary nonelective contribution to the Plan each year, not to exceed 85% of the taxable wage base. Employees who are eligible for the discretionary nonelective contribution must complete one year of service and are eligible to receive an allocation of the discretionary nonelective contribution beginning on the first day of the calendar quarter on or next following the date in which the eligibility requirement is met. No discretionary nonelective contribution was approved or made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited or charged with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, if any, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses and administrative expenses that are paid from the Plan. Allocations are based on participant account earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus the actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of participants' accounts, plus the actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service. Upon normal retirement or death, all contributions become fully vested. Participants vest in the Company's contribution portion and earnings thereon according to the following schedule:

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows participants to borrow not less than \$1,000 and up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the participant's vested balance and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%. The note must be repaid to the Plan within a five-year period, unless the note is used for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the repayment period may not exceed 15 years. The specific terms and conditions of such notes are established by the Committee. Principal and interest are paid ratably through after-tax payroll deductions over the term of the notes.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination for any reason, the participants or their beneficiaries may elect to leave their account balances in the Plan, roll balances over to another plan or individual retirement account, or receive their total benefits in a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. Prior to June 1, 2024, the Plan allowed for the automatic distribution of participant-vested account balances that do not exceed \$1,000 upon termination. The Plan also allows for mandatory distributions of participant-vested account balances over \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000. A mandatory distribution will automatically roll to a traditional individual retirement account serviced by Transamerica unless the participant elects a lump-sum distribution. Effective June 1, 2024, eligible rollover distributions of account balances of \$5,000 or less will be subject to the automatic rollover requirements. Hardship distributions, as defined, and in-service distributions for participants age 59½ and older are also permitted by the Plan. Generally, participants must begin receiving period benefit payments by April 1st of the calendar year following the calendar year in which they attain age 73, or such later age as may be allowed by law under the terms of the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited nonvested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$107,771 and \$138,807, respectively, and may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or fund future employer contributions. During 2024, the Company used \$56,309 of forfeitures to reduce Company contributions and did not use any forfeitures to pay administrative expenses.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America on an accrual basis (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Noninterest-Bearing Cash

The Plan holds noninterest-bearing cash, which is acquired with an original maturity of three months or less and is valued at cost, which approximates fair value.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought or sold, as well as held, during the year.

The Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustees. See Note C for the fair value methods used.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant's loan to be in default, the participant's loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. That hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1 - Inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 - Inputs consist of 1) quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, 2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets, 3) inputs other than quoted prices that are

observable, and 4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term.

Level 3 - Inputs consist of unobservable inputs where there is little or no market activity, and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset including assumptions regarding risk.

The fair value measurement level of an asset or liability within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

Shares are valued at net asset value (NAV) by the Plan at year end based on published quoted market prices.

Collective Trust Fund

The collective trust fund is valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan at year end, which is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Irrespective of the underlying investments that comprise the collective trust fund, the fund itself lacks a formal listed market or publicly available quote. The Plan's collective trust fund may be redeemed on a daily basis and has no unfunded commitments.

Charles Schwab Personal Choice Retirement Accounts (PCRAs)

PCRAs are self directed brokerage accounts that consist of mutual funds, stocks, and money market funds. The mutual funds are valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end at the closing prices in the active markets in which the securities are traded. The stocks are valued daily based on the quoted closing prices in the active markets in which the securities are traded. Money market funds are valued at cost plus accrued income, which approximates fair value measured by similar assets in active markets.

Money Market Fund

The money market fund is valued at cost plus accrued income, which approximates fair value measured by similar assets in active markets.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE D - RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the trustees and Transamerica, its affiliate. Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE E - PLAN TERMINATION OR MODIFICATION

On April 17, 2025, the Company's Board of Directors approved the termination of the Plan. The termination was effective as of June 16, 2025. Please see Note I for further information.

NOTE F - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a volume submitter plan that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended subsequent to the version of the volume submitter plan that received the opinion letter. The Company believes that the Plan is operated in accordance with, and qualifies under, the applicable requirements of the Code and related state statutes, and that the trust, which forms a part of the Plan, is exempt from federal income and state franchise taxes.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan Sponsor has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS.

The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - INFORMATION CERTIFIED OR PROVIDED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEES

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labors' Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the trustees have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

NOTE H - DELINQUENT CONTRIBUTIONS

During 2020, the Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit \$125 of participant contributions within the required time frame specified by the Department of Labor (DOL). The DOL considers late deposits to be nonexempt or prohibited transactions. For the 2020 late deposit, the Plan will deposit lost earnings and also file Form 5330 and pay applicable excise taxes to correct this failure. The excise tax payments will be made from the Company's assets and not from assets of the Plan.

NOTE I - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has analyzed its activity subsequent to December 31, 2024 through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. The Company experienced significant workforce reductions impacting the retirement plan. On February 28, 2025, the Company initiated a partial plan termination due to a layoff/reduction in force. This event affected a substantial portion of plan participants and triggered vesting requirements under applicable regulations.

Further, on April 17, 2025, the Company announced its decision to cease operations, with the remaining employees laid off effective June 16, 2025. As a result, the Company initiated a full plan termination, which will lead to the final distribution of plan assets and closure of the retirement plan by the end of 2025.
