## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Participants and Administrator of the  
CBS Television Distribution Inside Edition 401(k) Plan

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the CBS Television Distribution Inside Edition 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. **NOTE 1 - PLAN DESCRIPTION**

The following is a brief description of the CBS Television Distribution Inside Edition 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") and is provided for general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information regarding the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2016, the K.W.M., Inc. 401(k) Plan for AFTRA Employees was merged into the King World Studio/Production 401(k) Plan, and the King World Studio/Production 401(k) Plan changed its name to the CBS Television Distribution Inside Edition 401(k) Plan. Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity") is the trustee, custodian, and recordkeeper for the Plan.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Inside Edition Inc. (the "Company"), a wholly owned subsidiary of King World Productions, Inc. Eligible employees of the Company or other Participating Employers as identified in plan documents who are not covered by a collective bargaining arrangement (other than AFTRA), can enroll in the Plan after attainment of age 21 and completing six months of service. Participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan on the first day of the month following the attainment of age and service requirements, unless they already voluntarily enrolled or have elected not to participate. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"), and is overseen by the Paramount Global Administrative Committee.

The Paramount Global Investments Committee serves as the Plan's named fiduciary responsible for the investment of the Plan's assets and appoints the Plan's investment managers.

***Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions***

Certain Plan investments were shares of funds managed by Fidelity and therefore qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The fair value of these investments was \$14,112,017 and \$10,665,026 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, these investments appreciated by \$2,317,442 and earned interest and dividends of \$170,890. For 2024, the Plan incurred expenses of \$13,626 for services provided by Fidelity.

***Participant Accounts***

Each Plan participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the employer matching contributions, the participant's share of the investment income (loss) and any allocated realized or unrealized gains (losses) of the Plan's assets, net of certain Plan expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the participant's vested account balance.

***Contributions***

Participants may contribute up to 20% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. During 2024, the Plan provided for a Company matching contribution of up to 3% of annual compensation subject to Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations. Matching contributions are calculated at 100% of the first 2% of deferred compensation and 50% of the next 2% of deferred compensation for a maximum matching contribution of 3% of deferred compensation. All contributions are made to participant directed investments in various registered investment companies (mutual funds) and common collective funds. Contributions for participants who do not make investment elections are defaulted into the Plan's Qualified Default Investment Alternative, which is the BlackRock LifePath Index Fund with a target date that most closely aligns with the year in which the employee turns 65. The Code limit for participant contributions on a before-tax basis was \$23,000 for 2024. All participants who have attained age 50 before the close of the calendar year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Code limit for catch-up contributions was \$7,500 in 2024.

***Vesting***

Participants in the Plan are immediately vested in their own contributions and earnings thereon. Vesting of the employer matching contribution and earnings thereon occurs in accordance with the schedule below (year of service is defined as a Plan year in which a participant has completed at least 1,000 hours of service):

***Forfeitures***

If a participant's employment terminates prior to being vested in their employer contributions, the non-vested portion of their account is forfeited and may be used for future employer contributions and to pay administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had forfeitures available to be used of \$47,020 and \$18,861, respectively, of which \$0 was used to pay Plan administrative expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024.

***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Eligible participants may request a loan for up to the lesser of \$50,000 (reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the previous 12 months) or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. During 2024, the minimum loan available to a participant was \$1,000 and only one loan could be outstanding at any time. Participants may elect repayment periods up to 60 months or over a longer period of time, as determined by the Plan administrator, for the acquisition of a principal residence.

The loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account. The interest rate on participant loans is one percentage point above the annual prime commercial rate. Principal and interest are collected ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, loans outstanding carried interest rates between 4.25% and 9.50%.

***Payment of Benefits***

Payment of benefits can be made under a number of circumstances including, termination of service due to death, disability or retirement. A participant or beneficiary is entitled to receive benefits in the form of a lump-sum payment equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, a non-recurring partial payment from the participant's vested interest, or installment payments from the participant's vested interest based upon terms set forth in the Plan document. In general, participants must receive a required minimum distribution ("RMD") upon attainment of a certain age, unless they are still employed. For individuals who attained age 70½ on or before December 31, 2019, that age is 70½. For individuals who attain age 70½ on or after January 1, 2020, in accordance with the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (the "SECURE Act"), the RMD age is 72. For individuals attaining age 70 ½ on or after January 1, 2023, in accordance with the SECURE Act 2.0, the RMD age is 73.

Additionally, participants can, upon termination, rollover distributions into an Individual Retirement Account ("IRA") or another company sponsored plan. The Plan also allows for hardship withdrawals under certain circumstances.

***Plan Expenses***

During 2024, all recordkeeping and trustee fees for the administration of the Plan, including loan, distribution, and investment transaction fees, are paid from participant or forfeiture accounts.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States (“U.S. GAAP”).

***Investment Valuation***

Investments in registered investment companies are reported at fair value based on quoted market prices representing the net asset value of the shares held in the Plan. The fair value of the Plan's investment in a common collective fund is determined using the Net Asset Value (“NAV”) provided by the administrator of the fund as a practical expedient. The NAV is determined by the fund’s trustee based upon the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, less liabilities, divided by the number of outstanding units. The common collective funds have daily redemptions and a trading term of one day for participant directed redemptions. Complete liquidation of the Plan's investments may require up to twelve months' notice unless waived at the discretion of the investment manager. The common collective funds had no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

***Security Transactions and Income Recognition***

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date. The historical average cost basis is used to determine gains or losses on security dispositions. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis and dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments, included in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits, consists of the realized gains and losses and the unrealized appreciation and depreciation on those investments presented at fair value.

***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Defaulted participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan to make estimates and assumptions, such as those regarding fair value of investments, that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Subsequent Events***

Subsequent events and transactions have been evaluated through September [xx], 2025, which is the date the financial statements were issued, and are incorporated herein as applicable.

**NOTE 3 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Market values of investments could decline for several reasons including,

changes in prevailing market and interest rates, increases in defaults, and credit rating downgrades. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of such securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in investment values in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the related Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

The net appreciation, which includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year, of \$4,836,602 was attributable to the Plan's investments in registered investment companies and common collective funds for the year ended December 31, 2024. Dividends and interest income of \$605,982 were attributable to the Plan's investments in registered investment companies and common collective funds for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**NOTE 5 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The following tables set forth the Plan's financial assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis at December 31, 2024 and 2023. See Note 2 for the valuation methodology used to measure the fair value of these investments. There have been no changes to the methodologies used to measure the fair value of each asset from December 31, 2023 to 2024. These assets have been categorized according to the three-level fair value hierarchy established by the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB"), which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. Level 1 is based on quoted prices for the asset in active markets. Level 2 is based on inputs that are observable other than quoted market prices in Level 1, such as quoted prices for the asset in inactive markets or quoted prices for similar assets. Level 3 is based on unobservable inputs reflecting the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset. The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The Plan has no investments classified within Level 2 or Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy.

**NOTE 6 - INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document provided by Fidelity. The IRS determined and informed Fidelity by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 that the pre-approved plan document that was used for the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Code. Although the Plan has been amended since then, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Code. In addition, the Company has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there were no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that require recognition of an asset or liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. There are no audits in progress for any tax year.

**NOTE 7 - TERMINATION PRIORITIES**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan. In the event of Plan termination, participants become fully vested. Upon termination, the Plan provides that the net assets of the Plan would be distributed to participants based on their respective account balances.
