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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator
Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing audits in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audits.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audits in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, and assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, (collectively, "supplemental schedules") are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan documents for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan, a defined contribution savings plan sponsored by Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy (the "Organization," "Employer," or "Plan Sponsor"), pursuant to Section 403(b) and the related provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) was established August 11, 1981, and restated January 1, 2024. The Plan is designed to provide participants with a means to defer a portion of their compensation for retirement and to provide benefits in the event of disability, death, termination of employment, or financial hardship. The Plan covers all eligible employees of the Organization, as defined in the plan documents. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and subsequent amendments.

Effective March 27, 2020, the Plan administratively adopted the provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, related to participant loans and distributions. The Organization has until December 31, 2026, to amend the Plan for changes allowed by the CARES Act. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE 2.0) was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Plan Sponsor has until the end of the first Plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026, to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. The Plan has not been formally amended to adopt these provisions as of the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Plan administration

The Organization is the administrator of the Plan and, as such, carries out the duties imposed by ERISA. The Organization has delegated certain responsibilities for the operation and administration of the Plan. Custodial and recordkeeping services are provided by American United Life Insurance Company ("AUL"), a OneAmerica company, and The Lincoln National Life Insurance Company ("Lincoln") (collectively the "Custodians"). Effective July 1, 2009, participant and Employer contributions to assets managed by Lincoln ceased, and all contributions thereafter are remitted to AUL for investment in the appropriate investment fund or portfolio in accordance with the participant's directives and terms of the Plan.

Eligibility

All employees of the Organization, except employees who normally work less than 20 hours per week, are eligible to make elective deferral contributions upon hire.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute through payroll deductions amounts up to 100% of their annual compensation, as defined by the plan documents, on a pre-tax or Roth basis, up to a maximum amount allowed by the IRC. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to the IRC limit. Participants are also allowed to make rollover contributions received from other tax-qualified employer-sponsored retirement plans. Such contributions are deposited in the appropriate investment funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the Plan's provisions.

The Organization may make discretionary matching contributions and discretionary nonelective contributions to Plan participants. Effective January 1, 2024, the Organization began making a 3% non-elective contribution. This contribution is made to all eligible employees following date of hire.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, rollover contributions, the Employer's matching or nonelective contributions, if any, and charged with Plan losses and an allocation of administrative expenses. Participants may direct their contributions among a variety of investment options offered by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan documents. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in all contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may occur as a result of excess Employer contributions. These funds may be allocated as additional discretionary contributions, used to reduce the Organization's discretionary matching or nonelective contributions or to reduce administrative expenses if elected by the Employer, in accordance with the plan document. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$80 were used to pay Plan expenses. There was no forfeiture balance as of December 31, 2024. The unallocated forfeiture balance as of December 31, 2023 was \$80.

Plan loans

Plan loans (or "policy loans") are available to participants through Lincoln, subject to certain limitations. Plan loans are issued directly from the funds owned by Lincoln and loan proceeds are not removed from a participant's account balance. A portion of a participant's fixed account balance is reserved, or held as collateral, to cover the outstanding loan amount for the period of time the loan is outstanding. Management has determined that these loans are not Plan assets and that such arrangements are exempt transactions. Principal and interest is paid ratably monthly or quarterly by the participant to Lincoln. Plan loans outstanding totaled \$116,396 and \$171,165 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Plan loans outstanding at December 31, 2024, bear interest at rates ranging from 3.75% to 4.50%, and mature at various dates through September 2038.

Payment of benefits

Distributions and withdrawals are payable upon retirement, termination of employment, disability, death, or financial hardship. If a participant's vested account balance is equal to or less than \$1,000 upon termination of employment, the balance is immediately distributed as a lump-sum payment. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance is greater than \$1,000 and less than or equal to \$7,000, their balance shall be automatically rolled over into an individual retirement account designated by the plan administrator, unless otherwise elected. If the account balance is greater than \$7,000 upon termination, the participant can consent to either a distribution paid in the form of a lump-sum cash payment, annuity payments, partial payments, a directed rollover into another qualified plan, or to postpone payments to a later date and remain in the Plan as described in the plan documents.

Upon attaining the age of 59 ½ the participant may, while still employed by the Organization, request a withdrawal from their account balance. In certain circumstances as described in the plan document and in accordance with IRS regulations, participants may qualify for a hardship withdrawal.

Administrative expenses

Certain administrative expenses of the Plan, including record-keeping and audit fees, were paid directly by the Organization but may, at the discretion of the plan administrator, be paid by the Plan. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Organization for expenses paid on its behalf. Investment fees, which may vary according to the individual funds selected, are paid out of the assets of the Plan. Transaction fees for certain participant initiated activity are charged to the specific account of the participant initiating any such transaction.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of certain reported amounts. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. The Custodians certify the accuracy and completeness of all investments and related activity.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a description of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measurement for assets invested in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 5 for discussion of the Plan's fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Contributions and receivables

Contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the contributions have been separated from a participant's pay by the Organization, which is the pay date.

Contributions and receivables (continued)

Employer contributions are recorded in the year they are earned and to coincide with the year in which the Organization records the contribution in its general ledger. The Plan records receivables based upon the contributions recognized, less amounts received by the Plan as of the last day of the Plan year.

Contributions representing participant rollovers from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans are recorded when received by AUL.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses are recorded when incurred.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodians, determined to be qualified institutions by the plan administrator, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and;
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Accordingly, as requested by the plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor performed no audit procedures on the certified information other than to agree the certified information to the related information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The fair value hierarchy levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value are as follows:

- *Level 1* - Asset value is based on actual quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- *Level 2* - Inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
- *Level 3* - Significant unobservable inputs (including management's own assumptions in determining the fair value of investments) are used to arrive at fair value.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the valuation methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Separate accounts: The investments in Lincoln and AUL separate accounts are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the accumulation unit published each day. Separate accounts held by the Plan are in the form of accumulation units. The value of the accumulation unit is determined at the close of each business day and is directly related to the net asset value of the shares of underlying investment adjusted for any dividends or distributions received and the daily equivalent of any fee charged pursuant to the contract. The value of each accumulation unit is published each business day. Each investment account is invested exclusively in shares of a specific mutual fund or other investment entities as directed by the contract holder and/or the participant. Separate accounts are recorded as Level 2 investments in the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. INVESTMENT CONTRACTS

The Plan offers the AUL Stable Value Fund ("Stable Value Fund") and the Lincoln Financial Group (LFG) Fixed Account ("Fixed Account"), fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, as investment options for the Plan's participants. These contracts are included in the financial statements at contract value, as reported by AUL and Lincoln. LFG is an affiliate of Lincoln. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Contributions to these accounts are maintained in the general accounts of AUL and LFG. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract value approximates fair value for these investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The plan administrator is not aware of reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuers or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuers. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the Plan's trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants or the issuer are probable of occurring.

5. INVESTMENT CONTRACTS (continued)

The fixed annuity contracts in the Fixed Account are guaranteed against loss of principal, less all withdrawals, including charges and adjustments. The guarantee is based on LFG's ability to meet its financial obligations from the general assets of LFG. Interest is credited daily at an interest rate that will not be less than the guaranteed account minimum interest rate, as defined in the contract. The interest crediting rate is declared on a quarterly basis. The accumulating crediting interest rate was 3.51% and 3.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The fixed annuity contracts in the Stable Value Fund are guaranteed against loss of principal, less all withdrawals, including charges and adjustments. The guarantee is based on AUL's ability to meet its financial obligations from the general assets of AUL. Interest is credited daily at an interest rate that will not be less than the guaranteed account minimum interest rate, as defined in the contract. The interest crediting rate is declared on an annual basis. The average accumulating crediting interest rates were 1.49% and 1.32% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

6. TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted the OneAmerica Financial Partners, Inc. Volume Submitter 403(b) Plan (the "volume submitter plan"). The Internal Revenue Service informed OneAmerica Financial Partners, Inc. by a letter dated November 22, 2017, stating that the written form of the volume submitter plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC, and is appropriate for use by employers for the benefit of its employees. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

7. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines party-in-interest similar to a related party under U.S. GAAP, except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Plan management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be a party-in-interest.

7. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS (continued)

Party-in-interest are defined by ERISA as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the Employer and certain others. As such, transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, and a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain fees and expenses of the Plan are paid by the Organization. The Plan is not required to repay expenses paid by the Organization on its behalf.

The Custodians retain, as compensation for services provided to the Plan, any interest on amounts earned while certain transactions are pending. This applies to both contributions and distributions. Earnings are at institutional money market rates.

Certain Plan investments are owned and managed by the Custodians or their affiliates, therefore, these investment transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

The Plan was amended effective January 1, 2025. Under the provisions of the amendment, Plan loans were made available to participants in the Plan.

On January 2, 2025, Voya Financial, Inc. ("Voya") completed an acquisition of OneAmerica Financial, Inc. As a result of the acquisition all the assets of the Plan held by AUL were transferred to Voya and Voya took over as custodial and recordkeeping services for the Plan.
