- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Information Required by ERISA

The supplemental information of Schedule H, line 4a – schedule of delinquent participant contributions and Schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year), as of or for the year ended December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental information, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental information that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental information, we evaluated whether the supplemental information, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental information, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by the qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by the institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Choice Pooled Employer Plan III (the PEP or the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the PEP basic plan document, and the applicable adoption agreement for the participant's employer which has chosen to participate in the PEP (Participating Employer), for a more complete description of the PEP's provisions.

General

The PEP is a pooled employer plan established and administered by The Administrative Group, LLC dba TAG Resources, the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP). The PEP was established on January 1, 2022, under the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE Act). The PEP is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of the Participating Employers and is intended to qualify under Internal Revenue Code (IRC), sections 401(a) and 501(a). The PEP allows any affiliated or unaffiliated employer, as defined, to participate in the PEP. Each Participating Employer elects its own provisions related to eligibility, contributions, notes receivable from participants, and payment of benefits. The PEP is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The PPP had contracted with Reliance Trust Company (RTC) through June 30, 2024 for trust services, and effective July 1, 2024, the PEP entered into a trust agreement with Transamerica Trust Company (TTC) to provide trust services, and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (the Custodian or Transamerica) as the Plan's Custodian and with Transamerica's affiliate, Transamerica Retirement Solutions (TRS), for recordkeeping services

Plan amendment

Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to change its name from the SBAM Retirement Savings 401(k) Pooled Employer Plan to the Choice Pooled Employer Plan III.

Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to replace Reliance Trust Company, as former trustee, with Transamerica Trust Company as the Plan's trustee.

Eligibility

Only employees specifically designated as eligible by their Participating Employers, who are designated by the Participating Employer in its adoption agreement, are eligible to participate in the PEP. Participating Employers may define eligibility requirements based on factors such as age, service or employee type. Eligible employees shall be eligible to make contributions and receive allocations of employer contributions if and to the extent specified in the applicable adoption agreement or otherwise provided by the PEP.

Contributions

Each year, eligible participants may make pre-tax, Roth 401(k), and/or after-tax contributions of their eligible compensation, as defined by the PEP and Participating Employer adoption agreement, subject to applicable limits established by law. Participating Employers may elect safe harbor or non-safe harbor contribution provisions as well as compensation definitions. Under certain circumstances, eligible employees may make rollover contributions to the PEP. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the calendar year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the PEP.

The Participating Employers may elect automatic enrollment and escalation features. Accordingly, the Participating Employer will automatically withhold a defined percentage of an eligible participant's compensation based on the Participating Employer's adoption agreement, unless the participant affirmatively opts out.

Note 1 – Description of Plan, Continued

Contributions

Under the terms of the Participating Employer adoption agreements, the Participating Employers may elect to make matching contributions, profit-sharing contributions, safe harbor, and nonelective contributions to the PEP. Participating Employers may also elect to make true-up matching contributions. Participating Employer contributions, if any, are recorded in the year for which the contributions apply.

Aggregate Participating contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$1,547,667. Participating Employer contributions are invested in funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the PEP's provisions. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, their respective Participating Employer's contributions, if any, and Plan earnings or losses. Participants are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Participants may direct their account balance into various investment options offered by the PEP which include mutual funds and a guaranteed investment contract. Allocations are based on participant earnings or losses, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their individual contributions and their Participating Employer's safe harbor contributions, if any, plus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in any other Participating Employer contributions portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of credited service. Vesting periods range from immediate to six years based on graded or cliff vesting schedules, as elected by each Participating Employer. Participant accounts become fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age (65), death, or disability.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures in any year from the accounts of participants whose employment with a Participating Employer has terminated shall be used in the following year by the applicable Participant Employer to offset future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses of the PEP. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures were used to pay Plan administrative expenses totaled \$17. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, available forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$32,474 and \$7,894, respectively.

Notes receivable from participants

Plan participants are permitted to borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years unless the loan is used to acquire a principal residence of the participant which must be repaid in a reasonable period of time. Loans are secured by the vested account balance in the participant's account, and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1%. A participant may only have one (1) loan outstanding at any time.

A participant can only have one loan currently outstanding from the PEP, unless as a result of a conversion from a prior plan, the participant has loans that were transferred to the PEP, in which case, up to one such grandfathered loan may also be outstanding for a possible maximum total of two loans outstanding. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the PEP document. Principal and interest are repaid through regular payroll deductions.

Note 1 – Description of Plan, Continued

Payment of benefits

Payment of benefits can be made in a lump-sum, partial distributions, or periodic required minimum distributions based on the Participant Employer's adoption agreement. Upon separation of employment due to termination of employment, death, disability, or normal retirement age (65), a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution, installment payments, or maintain their vested account balance in the PEP. Participants with vested amounts less than \$5,000 will receive a lump-sum distribution. Participants may elect to take in-service withdrawals of their vested accounts if they meet certain defined requirements, including becoming disabled, reaching early retirement age (59½), or due to heavy financial hardship, as defined. Participants, at any time, may also withdraw amounts attributable to their contributions, rollover contributions and/or any portion of their transferred balance that is available under a grandfathered withdrawal option.

Plan administration

The PPP is responsible for the management and administration of the PEP. The PEP's investment assets are maintained by TTC from July 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, and by RTC as of December 31, 2023 and from January 1, 2024 through June 30, 2024, and Transamerica as the Plan's custodian. Transamerica invests cash received, controls and discloses the funds of the PEP. Administrative Group, LLC dba Transamerica Fiduciary Services is the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP) and TAG Resources, LLC is the PEP's third-party administrator.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is recorded at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The PPP determines the PEP's valuation policies based on information provided by the PEP's investment advisors, Custodian and Trustee. See Note 4 for a description of fair value measurements.

Interest income is recognized when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the PEP's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates, and those differences may be material.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual method. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participants' accounts and included as administrative expenses when incurred.

Notes receivable from participants, continued

No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make scheduled repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant note receivable to be in default, the note receivable is reduced and a benefit payment recorded.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and uncertainties

The PEP provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk, liquidity risk and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, including the uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible changes in such risks in the near-term would materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Participating Employers are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Concentrations

For the year ended December 31, 2024, six (6) Participating Employers individually comprised approximately 89% of transfers in from other qualified plans.

Plan expenses

Reasonable expenses of the PEP, including custodian, attorneys, advisors, fiduciaries, and service providers are paid by the PEP, unless otherwise paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers. Expenses that are paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers are excluded from these financial statements. Investment advisor fees are paid from the PEP. Expenses paid by the PEP are included in administrative expenses on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to participants' accounts and are also included in administrative expenses. Additionally, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Uncertain tax positions

U.S. GAAP requires the PEP administrator to assess its uncertain tax positions for the likelihood they would be overturned upon examination by the IRS. In accordance with this guidance, the PEP administrator has determined it does not have any positions at December 31, 2024 that it would be unable to substantiate.

Note 3 – Investment Information Certified by the Trustee and Custodian

The PPP has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Accordingly, Reliance Trust Company as of December 31, 2023 and from January 1, 2024 through June 30, 2024, and Transamerica Trust Company as of December 31, 2024 and from July 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company, the qualified institutions, have certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental information is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- Investment information included in the Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental information

At the request of the PPP, the PEP's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified information to the related investment information included in the financial statements, including the disclosures related to the investments to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP, and in the ERISA-required supplemental information, including assessing whether the supplemental information is in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

Accounting guidance provides a framework for measuring fair value and provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1	Unadjusted quoted prices for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities in active markets that a plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.
Level 3	Significant unobservable inputs.

An investment's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no transfers of investments into or out of Level 3.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements, Continued

The following is a description of the value methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds – valued at quoted market prices, which represent their daily net asset value (NAV) reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are traded on national exchanges (active markets).

Pooled separate accounts – Valued at net asset value (NAV) based upon the units of such pooled separate accounts are based upon significant observable inputs but are not based upon quoted market prices in an active market and are therefore considered Level 2 investments within the fair value hierarchy.

Collective investment trust funds (CT) – valued at the NAV of the CT and publicly published daily and, therefore, classified as Level 2. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investment of the CT less its liabilities. The fair value of the underlying investments is determined using market quotations or processes obtained from independent pricing sources that may employ various methods to value the investments, including matrix pricing.

Money market fund – institutional short-term investment vehicle valued daily with a NAV of \$1. NAV is the quoted price in an active market and therefore is classified within Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the PEP believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contracts with Insurance Company

The PEP invests in a fully benefit-responsive investment contracts issued by Transamerica (the issuer) which are guaranteed by Transamerica, with a contract value of \$2,627,688 and \$510,965, at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The contributions are maintained in the general accounts. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contracts with Insurance Company, Continued

Transamerica is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the PEP. The effective rate of interest is set semi-annually and effective as of the first day of the semi-annual period.

The effective rate of interest is established every January 1 and July 1 and is based on the daily balance, at a rate that is the daily equivalent of the effective annual rate of interest applicable for the six-month period. There is no stated minimum or maximum interest rate. The contracts do not permit Transamerica to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and, therefore, are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because it is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the PEP. Contract value, as reported to the PEP by Transamerica, represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The PEP's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on Transamerica's ability to meet its financial obligations. Transamerica's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the PEP to transact at contract value with Transamerica. Such events include amendments to the PEP documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, bankruptcy of the PPP or other PPP events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or premature termination of the contract. PEP management does not believe any events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the PEP to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the PEP to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the PEP and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include an uncured violation of the PEP's investment guidelines, a breach of a material obligation under the contracts, a material misrepresentation or a material amendment to the agreement without consent of the issuer.

Based on ongoing credit evaluations of its guaranteed investment contract investments, PEP management does not expect payment defaults or delinquencies and has not recorded an allowance for credit losses for these investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 6 – Party-In-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL Regulations as any fiduciary of the PEP, any party rendering service to the PEP, the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP), Participating Employers and certain others. The PEP's investments are managed, held, administered and/or issued by Transamerica and TTC. Through June 30, 2024, RTC was the trustee of the Plan. Admin Group, LLC (AG) is the Plan's third-party administrator. Therefore, transactions with Transamerica, TTC, RTC and AG qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

Note 6 – Party-In-Interest Transactions, Continued

Administrative Group, LLC DBA Transamerica Fiduciary Services is the PEP's PPP and its affiliate, TAG Resources, LLC, provides third-party administrative services. Accordingly, transactions with Administrative Group, LLC DBA Transamerica Fiduciary Services and TAG Resources, LLC qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The PEP compensates these service providers directly for such services which is included in administrative expenses for the period ended December 31, 2024, in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Note 7 – Refunds Payable for Excess Contributions

During 2024 and 2023, the Plan received contributions from participants in excess of Plan and IRS limitations. Such excess contributions were refunded to participants in each of the subsequent years with a liability and corresponding reduction to contributions recorded in the year the excess contribution was received.

Note 8 – PEP Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the PPP has the right under the PEP to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the PEP subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of PEP termination, participants will become 100% vested in the Participating Employer's contributions. Any unallocated assets of the PEP shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the PPP may determine. Additionally, Participating Employers have the right to transfer the assets attributable to their participants to another Plan should the PEP terminate.

Note 9 – Plan Transfers

In the normal course of business, the PPP adds Participating Employers, and assets from the Participating Employers' qualified plans are transferred into the PEP, when administratively feasible to do so. Likewise, as Participating Employers leave the PEP and adopt different qualified plans, assets attributable to these outgoing Participating Employers are transferred out of the PEP.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, transfers into the PEP from other qualified plans totaled \$47,874,622. For the year ended December 31, 2023, transfers out to other qualified plans totaled \$8,006,979.

Note 10 – Tax Status

The PEP is intended to qualify under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(a) and 501(a).

On August 17, 2021, the IRS stated that the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit-Sharing Plan adopted by the PEP, as then designed, qualifies under IRC Section 401(a) and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The PEP has not received a determination letter specific to the PEP itself. The PEP has been amended since adoption, however, the PEP Administrator and the PEP's tax counsel believe that the PEP is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the PEP's financial statements.

The PEP is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 11 – Delinquent Participant Contributions

During the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023 certain participant contributions and loan repayments totaling \$85,421 and \$30,133, respectively, were not remitted to the PEP within the timeframe required by the Department of Labor (DOL). These transactions constitute non-exempt party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA.

Note 11 – Delinquent Participant Contributions, Continued

The Participating Employers reimbursed the PEP for lost earnings related to a portion of the 2024 delinquent participant contributions in the amount of \$67,195. The remaining 2024 delinquent participant contributions are being evaluated by the Participating Employers and the Plan's third-party administrator for lost earnings to correct these transactions. As of the date of this report the 2023 delinquent participant contribution have been corrected and lost earnings have been reimbursed to the PEP.

Note 12 – Subsequent Events

The PEP evaluated events occurring subsequent to December 31, 2024 through October 14, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued, for matters that should be recorded in the financial statements or disclosed in the footnotes thereto.
