NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

1 – Plan Description

The following description of the M&W Distribution Services, Inc. (Company or Plan Sponsor) Tax-Favored Savings Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan established effective January 1, 1982, by the Company to provide retirement benefits to eligible employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility of Participants

Eligible employees, as defined, who have reached age 21 and who have completed six months of service, may participate in the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date the eligibility requirements have been met.

Contributions

Participants are allowed to make tax-deferred contributions of their compensation, as defined, up to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (the Code).

For each pay period, the Company provides a non-elective safe harbor contribution to eligible employees, as defined, of 3% of their compensation, as defined. The Company also provides a discretionary matching contribution of 100% of a participant's salary deferral for the Plan year in excess of 3%, but not exceeding 6%, of such participant's compensation.

The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan that is allocated based on the ratio of each participant's annual compensation, as defined, to the total annual compensation of all eligible participants. No profit-sharing contributions were made during 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company contributions, and an allocation of the Plan's investment results. Allocation of the Plan's investment results is based on relative account balances, as defined. Participants may allocate their contributions, at their discretion, among various investment options offered by the Plan.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED)**

1 – Plan Description (continued)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the Company's non-elective safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. A participant is 100% vested in the Company's discretionary matching contributions after three years of service, as defined. A participant is 20% vested in Company profit-sharing contributions after two years of credited service, as defined, and in increments of 20% for each of the next four years until the completion of the sixth year, when a participant is fully vested.

Distributions

A participant's vested account balance may be withdrawn upon retirement, as defined, termination of employment, or death during the Plan year. Distributions are made in the form of a lump-sum payment. Upon written request and approval, participants may withdraw some or all of their elective deferral contributions account balance while still employed, if the withdrawal is necessary due to financial hardship.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited non-vested amounts are used to reduce Plan Sponsor contributions to the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$7,207 and \$5,519, respectively. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures totaling \$0 were used to reduce Plan Sponsor contributions.

Accumulated amounts in an unallocated expense budget account were \$18,154 and \$10,130 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Amounts in the account may be used to pay Plan expenses or allocated to participant accounts. During 2024, \$8,219 was credited to the expense budget account, and \$300 was used to reduce expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant may borrow the lesser of 50% of his or her vested account balance or \$50,000. Participants may have one loan outstanding at any given time. A loan is secured by the balance in the participant's account and is repaid through payroll deductions over periods ranging up to five years, unless the loan is used to acquire a principal residence, in which case the loan may be issued for a reasonable amount of time. The interest rate is determined by the plan administrator based on prevailing market conditions and is fixed over the life of the loan.

2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their account balances.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Accounting Pronouncements

As of December 31, 2024, there were no new accounting pronouncements that had or were expected to have, including those not yet adopted, a significant impact on the financial statements or disclosures of the Plan.

The Plan assessed recent accounting pronouncements, noting none that would impact the financial statements or notes to the financial statements.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Plan Sponsor considers all highly liquid investments purchased with maturity dates of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to use estimates that affect the accompanying financial statements and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 3 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

The value of the units in the pooled separate accounts is determined by the issuer based on the fair market value of the underlying investments.

Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis of accounting. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on the trade date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative Expenses

Pursuant to provisions of the Plan, expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan may, but need not, be paid by the Company. If the Company elects not to pay such expenses, these expenses shall be paid by the Plan. Certain recordkeeping fees are paid by the Plan through revenue sharing that the Plan receives indirectly from certain of the Plan's investment options.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent loans made to participants against their vested balances, as permitted by the Plan. Notes receivable from participants are valued at the principal amount outstanding plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

3 – Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820 *Fair Value Measurements* ("ASC 820") provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2—Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value.

Pooled Separate Accounts—These investments are represented by a unit of account whose per unit value is the result of the accumulated values of the underlying investments. The underlying investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value ("NAV"). The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. The NAVs of the underlying investments are quoted in an active market.

4 – Information Certified by the Qualified Institution

All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (Transamerica), the custodian of the Plan.

5 – Income Tax Status

The Company adopted a Prototype Standardized Profit Sharing Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020. The opinion letter stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Code. The Plan itself has not filed for an IRS determination letter. The plan administrator is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that would adversely affect the qualified status of the Plan.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no such audits in progress. The plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

6 – Transactions with Parties-In-Interest

The Plan engaged in transactions involving the custodian, Transamerica, which is a party-in-interest with respect to the Plan. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are not considered "prohibited transactions" under the Code and are not prohibited by ERISA.

7 – Prohibit Transactions – Late Remittances

During 2024 and 2023, the Company experienced delays in remitting certain participants' deferrals to the Plan's trust within the time period prescribed by ERISA. The delayed amounts totaled \$1,978 in 2024 and \$35,893 in 2023 (including \$3,762 of loan repayments in 2023). These delays constituted prohibited transactions. As of October 15, 2025, management has corrected the effects of these transactions in accordance with IRS correction procedures. Additional details regarding these transactions are presented in the accompanying supplemental schedules under the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions.

8 – Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events subsequent to December 31, 2024, and through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and determined that there were no events that require adjustments to these financial statements.
