### Summary of Significant Accounting Policies December 31, 2024 and 2023

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The Quantum Retirement Plan presents its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting.

#### **Use of Estimates**

In preparing financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, Plan management is required to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for Plan benefits and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's custodian. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Guaranteed investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for Plan benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The statements of net assets available for Plan benefits present the contract value of the guaranteed investment contract. The statement of changes in net assets available for Plan benefits includes the changes in contract value of the guaranteed investment contract.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as investments held during the year.

#### **Receivables and Allowance for Credit Losses**

Receivables are stated at the amount management expects to collect from balances outstanding at year-end. The allowance estimate, if any, is derived from a review of the Plan's historical losses in relation to the Plan's historical receivable balances as well as management's assessment of current conditions, reasonable and supportable forecasts regarding future events, and any other factors deemed relevant by the Plan. Management has concluded that realized losses on balances outstanding at year-end will be immaterial. Accordingly, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. There were no write-offs or recoveries during the year ended December 31, 2024.

#### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

### Summary of Significant Accounting Policies December 31, 2024 and 2023

#### **Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching and profit-sharing contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

#### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### **Expenses**

Certain expenses for administering and maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the participating employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and payments of benefits are charged directly to the participants' accounts when incurred and are administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

### **1. Description of Plan**

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which is available from the plan administrator.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan (401(k) plan) sponsored by Quantum Health Professionals, Inc. (the Company) for the benefit of its employees who have 30 days of service and are age 21 or older, entry dates are the first of the month after meeting the eligibility requirements. Participants hired after January 1, 2023, are automatically enrolled a 3% contribution rate unless the participant makes a contrary election. Collective bargaining employees, nonresident aliens and employees required to contribute to a state retirement plan are excluded from the Plan.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is administered by members of management of the Company (Management). Management has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. Management, along with the Plan's investment advisor, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

#### Plan Change and Amendment

Effective September 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to exclude contributions from employees who are required to make contributions or receive contributions in a state retirement plan.

#### Contributions

Each year, a participant specifies the amount of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan to be contributed to the Plan. Additionally, participants age 50 or older, who are making contributions to the Plan, are allowed to make catch-up contributions as defined in the Plan. Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (employee rollover contributions). Rollover contributions are not subject to contribution limitations.

The Company may make discretionary employer match contributions and discretionary profit-sharing contributions to participants. Discretionary employer match contributions may not exceed 6% of the participants compensation. At December 31, 2023, the Company accrued \$20,864 of employer match contributions, which was paid in 2024. At December 31, 2024, the Company accrued \$20,000 of profit-sharing contributions, which was paid in 2025. There was no discretionary employer match for the year ended December 31, 2024. Additional amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations.

#### Participant Investment Account Options

The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trust funds and a guaranteed interest account as investment options for participants. Each investment option has its own investment strategy, which can be obtained through the prospectus of the respective fund. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

#### 1. Description of Plan (continued)

##### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's discretionary contribution, if any, and (b) plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant account balances or may be charged equally to each participant, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

##### Loans

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance of the participant's account and bear interest at rates ranging from 9.00% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and ranging from 9.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2023. The rate of interest is based on the prime rate as published by the Wall Street Journal plus 1.00%. Loan terms range from one to five years, or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

##### Vesting

Participants' contributions and rollover contributions plus actual earnings are 100% vested immediately.

To be created with a year of service a participant must be created with at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year.

##### Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, participants with vested account balances less than \$1,000 receive a lump-sum distribution automatically. Through December 31, 2023, participants with a vested account balance of more than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000, receive an automatic rollover into an IRA, unless otherwise directed. Participants with vested account balances exceeding \$5,000 have the option to receive a distribution or keep their funds in the Plan until the time that payments begin under federal law. Effective January 1, 2024, as part of SECURE Act 2.0, if a participant's benefits are over \$1,000 and less than \$7,000, they will receive an automatic rollover into an IRA, unless otherwise directed. Participants with vested account balances exceeding \$7,000 have the option to receive a distribution or keep their funds in the Plan until the time that payments begin under federal law. Under terms of the Plan, normal retirement is the date the participant attains age 65.

#### 1. **Description of Plan** (continued)

##### Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$9,163 and \$920, respectively. These amounts can be used to reduce plan expenses or employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions paid were reduced by \$1,623 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

##### SECURE Act 2.0

On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was signed into law, which includes the package of retirement provisions referred to as "SECURE Act 2.0." These provisions continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act, focusing on getting more participants into the retirement system, finding ways for them to accumulate more assets, and then ensuring they get connected with those assets when retirement comes. Plan management is monitoring the SECURE Act 2.0 provisions and will implement mandatory provisions as they become effective and relate to the plan.

#### 2. **Certified Information**

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments, cash and notes receivable from participants held as of the date of the financial statements under audit and covered by the certification, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC (collectively, "Empower"), the custodian of the Plan.

#### 3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable. These include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used to determine the fair value of investments. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- Common collective trust funds are valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year end. The NAV, as provided by Empower at December 31, 2024 and 2023, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust, less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding valuation method may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

#### 3. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no transfers.

- (a) In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, certain investments measured at NAV per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statements of net assets available for Plan benefits. These investments are valued daily, participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the common collective trusts, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the account in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Additionally, there are no unfunded commitments.

#### **4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than one percent. The crediting interest rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The average crediting rate was 1.41% during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan or Empower may terminate the contract with 30 days advance written notice.

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendment to the Plan document (including complete or partial termination or merger with another plan.), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

#### **5. Tax Status**

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan which has received an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022 from the IRS indicating that the Plan, as then designed, was qualified for tax-exempt status under the appropriate sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is qualified and tax-exempt as of the financial statement date and no provision for income taxes has been recorded in the financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

#### 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will be 100% vested in their accounts.

#### 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for Plan benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for Plan benefits.

#### 9. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are a guaranteed interest account managed by Empower. Empower is the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments. The Plan paid fees directly to Empower of \$15,443 for the year ended December 31, 2024, for certain administrative services. The fees paid to Empower are included in administrative expenses.

The Plan paid fees directly to OneDigital Investment Advisors, LLC of \$8,045 for the year ended December 31, 2024, for investment advisory services. The fees paid to OneDigital Investment Advisors, LLC are included in administrative expenses.

#### 9. **Party-in-Interest Transactions** (continued)

The Plan paid fees directly to Resources Investment Advisors, LLC of \$2,445 for the year ended December 31, 2024, for investment advisory services. The fees paid to Resources Investment Advisors, LLC are included in administrative expenses.

The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. In addition, notes receivable from participants and related transactions are party-in-interest transactions exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

#### 10. **Subsequent Events**

Management of the Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
