Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Black Hills Federal Credit Union 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section –

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain other internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. (1) Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Black Hills Federal Credit Union (the Employer and Plan Sponsor) is a federally chartered credit union which operates in South Dakota, Wyoming, and Montana.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting. The Plan was formed on January 1, 1997.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, guaranteed income contracts, and collective investment trusts are stated at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are recorded at contract value) on a recurring basis as determined by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (the Trustee) (Note 8). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and collective investment trusts are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan. Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported as Guaranteed Investment Contracts (GIC) within the notes to the financial statements.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and contributions from the Plan Sponsor are recorded in the year in which the employee's compensation is paid.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payments based on the terms of the Plan document.

(1) Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Net Change in Fair Value

The net appreciation in fair market value of investments is composed of the realized gains and losses in securities that were sold or otherwise disposed of during the year and the unrealized gains and losses in securities held at the end of the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated significant subsequent events through August 20, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available for use.

(2) Description of the Plan

The following description of the Black Hills Federal Credit Union 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General and Eligibility

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Black Hills Federal Credit Union, its wholly-owned subsidiaries, Horizon Diversified Services, LLC, and BHFCU Insurance Services, LLC (collectively the Company) who are age eighteen or older. The Plan includes provisions for discretionary profit sharing contributions, matching contributions, and 401(k) deferral contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of their annual compensation up to certain limits as established by the Internal Revenue Service. Participants may also contribute (rollover) amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan provides for matching contributions by the Company equal to the participant's elective deferral contributions not exceeding six percent of their pretax annual compensation. The Plan also allows for additional discretionary profit sharing contributions by the Company. The Company did not make a profit sharing contribution during both the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan instituted automatic enrollment for those employees eligible, the Plan Sponsor automatically withholds 6 percent of the employee's compensation upon becoming eligible to participate unless otherwise elected by the participant. Contributions are automatically invested in the appropriate target date fund unless the participant elects other investment options. The Plan also includes an automatic deferral increase, the increase is equal to one percent annually up to a maximum of 10 percent of compensation.

The Plan allows Roth elective deferrals. Contributions to Roth 401(k) accounts are made on an after-tax basis and contributions to a Roth 401(k) account are included in the participant's gross income. Future distributions of Roth elected contributions and earnings thereon will not be taxed, if certain criteria are met. Roth elective deferrals to the Plan are permanently designated as Roth elective deferrals in participant accounts. The participants' Roth deferrals and gains and losses attributable to such deferrals are accounted for separately.

(2) Description of the Plan

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of the employer's matching contribution, the employer's profit sharing contribution, plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan Document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and employer safe harbor matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contribution plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of credited service. A year of credited service requires 365 days elapsed time. A participant is 20 percent vested after two years of credited service, and continues to vest at a rate of 20 percent for each successive year of service. A participant becomes fully vested after six years of credited service, or if less than six years, upon reaching normal retirement age, upon total disability or death, or upon termination of the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeited, non-vested account balances were \$20,729 and \$19,796 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to either reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative costs of the Plan. Forfeited balances used to offset employer contributions totaled \$19,942 and \$183 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited balances used to offset administrative expenses totaled \$77 and \$5,272 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participants' Investment Options

Participants may direct contributions to selected investments as made available by the Trustee and determined by the Plan Administrator. Participants may change their investment options as often as they wish. Participants may elect to discontinue contributions at any time.

Participant Notes Receivable

Loans may be made from the participants' accounts upon an electronic request submitted to the trustee. Participants may borrow up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of 50 percent of their vested benefit or \$50,000, with a minimum of \$1,000. Loans bear interest commensurate with rates for similar loans from commercial lending institutions. Loans are repaid in equal amounts over the repayment term. Repayment terms are five years or less except for loans to acquire a principal residence, which are paid over a reasonable time period not to exceed fifteen years, as determined by the Trustee.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are made as soon as administratively feasible following the date on which a distribution request is made or is otherwise payable. On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant, or his or her beneficiary, may receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or one of various annuities. In the event a participant has an outstanding note balance at the time of such termination, the unpaid balance is treated as a benefit payment to that participant. Benefits less than \$1,000 are made as soon as administratively feasible after the participant's termination of employment. A participant with an account balance of greater than \$1,000, but less than \$5,000, may receive a rollover distribution into an individual retirement account set up by the Plan Administrator.

(2) Description of the Plan

Hardship Withdrawals

Should a plan participant experience a hardship, they may elect to withdraw a maximum of 50 percent of their vested account balance or up to \$50,000 less the highest outstanding loan balance during the past twelve months. All cases of hardship must be presented in writing to, and approved by, the Company. The Company may request additional supporting documentation from plan participants to substantiate any case of hardship. The Company may, at its discretion, approve all or part of the withdrawal request. Hardship withdrawals are recorded as distributions in the period in which they are paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. If not paid by the Company, the administrative expenses become the responsibility of the Plan.

(3) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA, at which time, participants would become 100 percent vested in their account balance.

(4) Investments – Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan's investments are held by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (the Trustee), who perform all accounting functions associated with the Plan's investments. The Trustee determined the fair value of investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

In accordance with Section 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator has received certifications from the Trustee as to the accuracy and completeness of certain financial information of the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Trustee has certified information contained in the following:

Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits (except for Contribution Receivable)
Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits (except for Contributions, Benefits Paid to Participants and Administrative Expenses)
Supplemental Schedule of Assets Held at Year End

The Plan invests in mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, guaranteed investment contracts, and collective investment trusts with underlying assets consisting of any combination of stock, bonds, fixed income securities, and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefit.

Market volatility of equity-based investments may substantially impact the value of such investments at any given time. It is possible that the value of the Plan's investments, both in total and in individual participant accounts, has changed significantly since December 31, 2024.

(5) Income Tax Status

A determination letter dated June 30, 2020, was obtained for the prototype plan document, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since the issuance of this determination letter; however, the Company believes the Plan remains in compliance with those requirements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(6) Participant Withdrawals

Terminated participant accounts of the Plan that had not been paid at December 31, 2024 and 2023, totaled \$13,788,831 and \$12,579,195, respectively.

(7) Guaranteed Investment Contract

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal) totaling \$3,059,745 and \$3,885,973 for December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1 percent or greater than 3 percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. The average yield and interest rate credited to participants was 1.55 percent for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

(8) Recurring Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level One: inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access
- Level Two: inputs include
 1. quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 2. quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 3. inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 4. inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability
- Level Three: inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Fair value represents the value of the fund shares, which is calculated daily based on the valuation of the funds' underlying investments at fair value. The pooled separate accounts value consists entirely of a Level 1 mutual funds which is valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual fund is traded.

Collective Investment Trust: The collective investment trusts are composed of mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and collective investment contracts issued by both Principal and multiple sub-advisors. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) occur daily.

The following tables present the assets carried at fair value in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits by fair value hierarchy, as described above. All are measured on a recurring basis. There are no liabilities measured on a recurring or non-recurring basis.
