Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Health Plus Management LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Health Plus Management LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Health Plus Management LLC (the “Company”) 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

- A. General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan originally adopted on January 1, 2018 and amended effective June 24, 2022. The Plan was established to provide benefits to eligible employees of Health Plus Management LLC (referred to hereafter as the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”) who are age eighteen or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).
- B. Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute an amount equal to a dollar amount or percentage of the contributing participant’s compensation within statutory limits. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investments of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds as investment options for participants. The Company may, at its discretion, make an employer matching contribution to qualified participants of the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company elected to make a matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 1.5% of base compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan. Additionally, the Plan allows for discretionary profit-sharing contributions by the Company, subject to certain statutory limitations. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not make any profit-sharing contribution to the Plan.
- C. Participant Accounts - Each participant’s account is: (1) credited with the participant’s contributions, Company matching contributions, if any, and earnings on the participant’s investments; and (2) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Administrative expenses will be allocated either proportionally based on the value of the account balances or as an equal dollar amount based on the number of participants in the Plan, as defined by the Plan. The participant is entitled to the benefit provided from the participant’s vested account.
- D. Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus the actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company contributions are based upon completion of the following number of years of service:

- E. Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 95% of one-half of their vested account balance or 95% of their total vested account balance excluding the Roth Elective Deferral balance. The \$50,000 maximum will be reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the one-year period ending on the day before the date the loan agreement becomes effective. Loan repayment terms may not exceed five years

unless the loan is used to purchase a participant's residence, in which case repayment terms may not exceed ten years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Principal and interest are paid ratably through biweekly payroll deductions.

- F. Payment of Benefits - Upon termination of service other than death, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or rollover into a qualifying individual retirement arrangement. Upon termination of service due to death, a beneficiary can directly rollover their portion of the individual account to an inherited individual retirement arrangement. Minimum distributions shall be made in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section 1.401(a)(9). If the value of a terminated participant's account is \$5,000 or less, the Plan shall immediately distribute the participant's entire vested account balance in a lump sum or at the participant's election to another qualified retirement plan.
- G. Forfeited Accounts - Forfeitures of terminated participant's non-vested matching contributions are segregated to a separate forfeiture account that will be used to reduce employer contributions, pay Plan expenses, or allocated to Participant's accounts at the discretion of the Plan Sponsor. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the unallocated forfeiture account totaled \$118 and \$608, respectively.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A. Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- B. Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.
- C. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.
- Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.
- D. Notes Receivable from Participants - Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. There are no allowances for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are generally received through payroll deductions and the notes are fully collateralized by the participants' account balances.
- E. Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

- F. Administrative Expenses - All expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by either the Plan or the Company, at the Company's election. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participant's are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Mid-Atlantic Trust Company, the Trustee, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

The Plan failed the discrimination test for the year ended December 31, 2024. Excess contributions amounting to \$37,823 are recorded as a liability in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits and as a reduction of participant-directed contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan has reimbursed these excess contributions to its participants during 2025. There were no excess contributions payable for the year ended December 31, 2023.

NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Administrative fees related to investment management services that were paid by the Plan to the Trustee amounted to \$21,493 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a non-standardized prototype plan for which the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has issued an opinion letter dated April 10, 2014, covering the qualification of the Plan under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
