NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

AS OF AND FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following is a general description of The Scripps Pension Plan-Albuquerque Publishing Company (the “Plan”). Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General-The Plan represents the participation of the Albuquerque Publishing Company (the “Company”) in The Scripps Pension Plan, a defined benefit pension plan maintained by The E. W. Scripps Company (“Scripps”). Russell Investments Trust Company (the “Trustee”) serves as the trustee of the Plan and manages the Plan’s investments. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

On March 31, 2009, the Plan was amended to freeze the accrual of participants’ plan benefits.

Pension Benefits-The Plan covers certain employees of the Company (principally employees not covered under a bargaining agreement). Normal retirement occurs upon attainment of age 65; however, early retirement may be elected if certain conditions are met. Vesting occurs after five years of credited service or upon normal retirement. The amount of monthly benefits is a function of participants’ compensation, years of credited service, and in some circumstances, age. Retirement benefits are reduced 0.5% for each month participants are under age 65 at the time benefits commence. For participants who are considered to be early retirees (age 55 and 10 years of credited service), retirement benefits are reduced 5% for each year the participant is under age 62 at the time benefits commence. There is no post-retirement death benefit for participants retiring after December 31, 2010. Participants who became permanently and totally disabled before December 31, 2010 and after completing 15 years of credited service are entitled to accrued benefits, with no reduction for commencement prior to normal retirement age. The surviving spouses of participants may be entitled to death benefits under certain conditions. Contributions by participants are not required or permitted.

2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting-The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“US GAAP”).

Subsequent Events-The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Investments-The Plan’s investments in commingled trust funds are presented at fair value, which has been determined based on the fair value of the underlying investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Use of Estimates-The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits and changes therein at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties-The Plan invests in commingled trust funds which have underlying investments including corporate debt instruments, mutual funds and corporate stocks. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to the uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

Expenses-Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan as provided in the Plan document.

Administration-Scripps is responsible for the administration of the Plan. Scripps provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged.

Payment of Benefits-Benefit payments to participants or their beneficiaries are recorded upon distribution.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

As permitted by US GAAP, the Plan uses net asset value as a practical expedient to determine the fair value of all investment funds which do not have a readily determinable fair value and have the attributes of an investment company. In accordance with US GAAP, the investments that are measured at net asset value have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. For all years presented, all investments have been valued using the net asset value.

The Plan’s investments in commingled trust funds are based on the net asset value of the funds, all which have a daily redemption frequency and do not require a notice of redemption. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no unfunded commitments from redemption of commingled trust funds.

4. FUNDING POLICY

Contributions to provide benefits under the Plan are made solely by the Company. The Company’s funding policy is to make cash contributions to the Plan in amounts as determined by the Plan’s independent actuary. The Company met the minimum funding requirements of ERISA for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

5. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED INFORMATION)

The following is a summary of the unaudited information as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedules, that was prepared by the Trustee or derived from information prepared by the Trustee. The plan administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustee that such information prepared by the Trustee is complete and accurate in accordance with Section 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

6. ACCUMULATED PLAN BENEFITS

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan’s provisions to service rendered by employees as of the valuation date.

Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (1) retired or terminated employees or their

beneficiaries, (2) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (3) present employees or their beneficiaries. The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by an independent actuary and is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuations as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, were:

- a. Life expectancy of participants - Pri-2012 generationally projected using Scale MP-2021 in both 2024 and 2023.
- b. Average retirement age - 62 years in both 2024 and 2023.
- c. Discount rate - 5.50% in both 2024 and 2023.

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. If the Plan were to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of accumulated benefits. The computations of the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits were made as of January 1, 2025 and 2024. Had the valuations been performed as of December 31, there would be no material differences.

7. EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain investments of the Plan are shares of commingled trust funds managed by the Trustee of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were approximately \$60,500 and \$63,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

8. FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated December 3, 2013, that the Plan was designed in accordance with applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code. The

Company and Plan management believe that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and the Plan continues to be tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by federal and state tax authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

9. **PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan, in certain circumstances, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated for payment of plan benefits to the participants in an order of priority determined in accordance with ERISA, applicable regulations thereunder and the Plan document.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested, normal-age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination, subject to a statutory ceiling on the amount of an individual's monthly benefit.

Whether all participants receive the benefits should the Plan be terminated at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide these benefits, the priority of benefits to be paid, and the level and type of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC at that time. Some benefits may be fully or partially provided for by the then existing assets and the PBGC guaranty, while other benefits may not be provided for at all.

Plan Provisions

The plan was amended and restated effective January 1, 2018. All benefits are frozen as of March 31, 2009. We have taken into consideration through Amendment 2018-3, which changes the actuarial equivalence for the plan effective January 1, 2019 to use the greater of 417(e) segment rates and mortality and the current basis.

Covered Employees	All employees of Albuquerque Publishing Company not covered by a collective bargaining agreement, if hired on or before March 31, 2008.
Participation Date	Completion of 1,000 hours in first anniversary year or any subsequent plan year calendar. The plan was frozen as of March 31, 2009 and is closed to new entrants.

Forms of payment Preretirement death benefits are payable only as described above. Monthly pension benefits are paid as described above as a life annuity, if the participant has no spouse as of the date payments begin, or if the participant so elects. Otherwise, benefits are paid in the form of 100% joint and survivor annuity option or, if the participant elects and the spouse consents, another actuarially equivalent optional form offered by the plan.

Optional forms are 50% joint and survivor annuity, 5-year or 10-year certain and life annuity, lump sum for values less than \$10,000, a full lump sum benefit with ten years Vesting Service as of January 1, 1984 and a life annuity (for married participants).

To receive a full lump sum benefit, the participant must meet the following criteria:

- Ten years of vesting service as of January 1, 1984
- Active participant in the Scripps/Journal Pension Plan – Albuquerque Publishing Company on January 1, 1984

Lump sums are paid only if reason for termination is retirement.

Actuarial equivalence for the annuity options is based on the greater of the benefit determined by tabular factors as defined in the plan document and the benefit determined using 417(e) interest and mortality. Actuarial equivalence for the lump sum option is based on the segment interest rates determined according to Code Section 417(e)(3)(C) for the month of October in the year preceding the benefit commencement date and the mortality table in effect under 417(e)(3).
