We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and

disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.



(1) Description of Plan

The following description of PROCESS TECHNOLOGIES & PACKAGING 401(K) PLAN (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

(a) *General*

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of HK KOLMAR USA, LLC (the “Company” or the “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan began on July 1, 2019 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of the Plan administrator appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company. The Plan’s trustee and record keeper are Reliance Trust Company (“Reliance”) and Automatic Data Processing (“ADP”), respectively.

(b) *Eligibility Requirements*

In order to participate in the Plan, an employee must be at least age 21 and have completed one year of eligibility service. A year of eligibility service is accomplished after completing 1,000 hours of service during your first 12 months of employment. If 1,000 hours of service is not completed in the first 12 months of employment, an employee will be credited with a year of eligibility service, provided an employee completes 1,000 hours of service in any following calendar year.

(c) *Contributions*

Every pay period, participants may elect to defer amounts from 1% to 90% of pre-tax or after-tax eligible earnings as defined in the Plan. Participants of age 50 or over may be eligible to make catch-up contribution up to \$7,500 in 2024. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (“Rollover”). However, the total contributions in any taxable year may not exceed the dollar limit set by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”), which is \$23,000 for 2024.

No participant may have elective deferrals made under the Plan during any calendar year in excess of the dollar limitation in Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) §402(g) in effect for the participant’s calendar year. Excess deferral amounts and income or loss allocable to those amounts will be distributed no later than April 15th of each year to any participant to whose accounts excess deferral amounts were assigned for the preceding year.

The Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of participant’s elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of participant’s eligible compensation, plus 50% of participant’s elective deferrals between 3% and 5% of participant’s eligible compensation. This safe harbor matching contribution is always 100% fully vested.

The Company may decide to make a nonelective contribution to the Plan, although the Company is not required to do so. The nonelective contribution will be allocated to all employees eligible to participate in the Plan. A participant’s share of the nonelective contributions is integrated with the Company’s contributions to social security. A certain amount is contributed to the Plan based upon the participant’s eligible earnings not in excess of the taxable wage base under social security, and a certain amount is contributed to the Plan in excess of the taxable wage base. The nonelective contribution, if made, will be allocated as of the end of each Plan Year based on eligible earnings within the computation period.

(d) Vesting

Participants are always 100% fully vested in their elective deferrals, rollover contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, and related earnings. Participants become vested in the nonelective contributions at varying rates depending on the length of continuous service as follows:

Years of Service	Vesting Percentage
Less than 2	0%
2	20%
3	40%
4	60%
5	80%
6 or more	100%

Certain events such as death, disability, or normal retirement result in immediate full vesting if such events occur while the participant is employed by the Company.

(e) Participant Accounts

A participant directs the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan, except for the common collective trust fund. The investments of the Plan are held by Reliance who maintains the investments in various mutual funds and a common collective trust fund.

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contributions and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

(f) Participant Loans

Participants may borrow funds from their accounts a minimum of \$500 up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000. Loans must be fully repaid through payroll deductions within five years, unless for the purchase of a primary residence. Participants may have no more than one outstanding loan at a time, and repayment of the loan is secured by participants' account balance. The interest rate is the prime rate as published in the Wall Street Journal on the fourteenth day of each month plus 2.00% per annum and effective for any loan processed as of the sixteenth day of the month.

(g) Distribution of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or attainment of normal retirement age, all amounts credited to the participant's account become fully vested, and distribution will be made pursuant to the election of the participant or beneficiary. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in a single lump-sum payment or have the payment paid as a direct rollover to an individual retirement plan or individual retirement annuity ("IRA") or to another employer's tax-qualified plan.

If the Plan is terminated for any reason including attainment of a normal retirement age of 65 and the value of participant's vested benefit (excluding any rollover contribution account but including any outstanding loan balance) is more than \$5,000, the participant may choose to receive installments or

defer receiving payments until age 73. If the vested benefit in the Plan (excluding any rollover contribution account but including any outstanding loan balance) does not exceed \$5,000, then the Plan can distribute a participant's entire vested account balance in a lump sum as soon as practicable.

If a participant continues working for the Company after age 73 and is a more than 5% owner, distributions are required to begin by the April 1st following the year in which a participant reaches age 73, even if he or she is still employed at the time. If a participant is not a 5% owner, he or she must begin to receive benefits no later than the April 1st, following the later of the year in which a participant reaches age 73 or terminate employment.

Participants may withdraw all or part of their vested account balances once the age of 59 ½ is reached. Participants may also withdraw any or part of their rollover contribution amounts that may be held in their accounts in the Plan at any time and any age.

(h) *Hardship Withdrawals*

Participants may withdraw their elective deferrals as well as any vested nonelective contributions, if applicable, to satisfy immediate and heavy financial needs. In accordance with IRS regulations, participants must first exhaust all other assets available before obtaining a hardship withdrawal. All hardship withdrawals must be approved by the Plan administrator.

(i) *Forfeitures*

If a participant terminates employment before becoming 100% vested in his or her account balance but do not take a distribution from the Plan, the non-vested portion will be forfeited as of the date he or she has a five-year period of severance. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeited non-vested accounts. The forfeiture balance will be used either to pay the Plan expenses or to reduce future employer contributions.

(j) *Top-Heavy Provisions*

If the Plan becomes top-heavy, with more than 60% of the Plan's assets in the accounts of key employees in any plan year, non-key employees will be entitled to certain "top-heavy minimum benefits", and other special rules will apply. Among these top-heavy rules are, the Company may be required to make a contribution on a participant's behalf in order to provide with at least "top-heavy minimum benefits".

(k) *Plan Termination*

The Plan Sponsor reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA and IRC. Upon termination, no further contributions will be made to the Plan, and all amounts credited to participants' accounts will become 100% vested.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) *Basis of Accounting*

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP"), under the accrual basis of accounting.

(b) *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of the Plan assets and liabilities at the financial statement date. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

(c) *Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participant loans are classified as notes receivable from participants, which are segregated from plan investments and measured at their unpaid principal balance plus unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

(d) *Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Shares of mutual funds are valued using quoted prices. Investments in the common collective trust fund are reported at fair value as determined by the fund manager based on the net asset value ("NAV") of the fund, which is based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the funds divided by units outstanding at the valuation date. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments consists of realized gains and losses and the change in unrealized gains and losses in the Plan's investments. Realized gains and losses from the sales of investments are computed on a moving average using a current value cost basis. Net changes in unrealized appreciation (depreciation) in investments represent the difference between the fair values of investments held at year-end and the cost of investments purchased in the current fiscal year or the fair value of investments held at the end of the preceding year.

(e) *Payments of Benefits*

Benefit payments to participants and beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

(f) *Administrative Expenses*

Certain expenses to maintain the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

(g) *Risks and Uncertainties*

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of mutual funds, a common collective trust fund as offered to participants. These investments, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of these investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the risks noted above in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

The Plan may indirectly invest in securities with contractual cash flows, such as asset backed securities, collateralized mortgage obligations, and commercial mortgage backed securities, including securities backed by subprime mortgage loans. The value, liquidity, and related income of these securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.

(3) Certified Investments

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Reliance (the trustee of the Plan).

(4) Tax Status

The Plan document is a prototype document that the Company adopted with specific provisions customized to meet the needs of the Plan Sponsor and the participants. The prototype document has received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS that the form of the Plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the IRC for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the original opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that, more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The IRS is one of the primary tax oversight bodies of the Plan and generally has the ability to examine the Plan's income tax returns; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

The Plan Sponsor has discovered the improper exclusion of certain eligible compensation from employee contributions due to specific administration errors for certain limited period in the 2024 Plan year. The Company determined to correct the errors in accordance with the IRS' Self Correction Programs ("SCP"), and to deposit the total correction amounts into participant accounts. These amounts were recorded as employer contributions receivable in the statements of net assets available for benefits in the amount of \$7,074 as of December 31, 2024. The operational errors do not have a material impact on the Plan's net assets available for benefits, and the Plan Sponsor does not expect the SCP corrections to impair the Plan's tax status.

(5) Investments

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan's investments in mutual funds and common collective trust fund appreciated in value by \$169,636, including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

(6) Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to those valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical

assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820-10 are described as follows:

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and to minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodologies used for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Level 1 measurements	Inputs are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access
Level 2 measurements	Inputs are inputs other than quoted prices within Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly. These inputs include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets and other inputs such as interest rates and yield curves that are observable at commonly quoted intervals.
Level 3 measurements	Inputs are unobservable inputs, including inputs that are available in situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the related assets or liability.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

- * This investment generally invests all or a portion of its assets in one or more commingled funds, and its primary objective is to achieve broader diversification and more competitive rates than if beneficial owners were to attempt to purchase general account guaranteed investment contracts on an individual basis. Units of the fund can be redeemed daily with no restriction.

The Plan does not have any liabilities that are measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

(7) Notes Receivable from Participants

The notes receivable from participants bear interest at rates ranging between 5.25% and 10.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and have original maturities that range from one to five years. For the year ended December 31, 2024, interest income on notes receivable from participants amounted to \$8,391.

(9) Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Reliance. Reliance is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, purchases and sales of these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

(10) SECURE 2.0 Act

On December 29, 2022, the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 (“SECURE 2.0 Act”) was enacted to help improve retirement savings. The SECURE 2.0 Act made wide-ranging changes, both mandatory and elective, to qualified plans and its provisions have various effective dates. Significant provisions include the following:

- Increase the required minimum distribution (“RMD”) age from 73 to 75, effective January 1, 2033;
- Reduce the service requirement from 3 years to 2 years for long-term part-time employees who work at least 500 hours per year, effective for the plan years beginning after December 31, 2024; and
- Require all catch-up contributions for participants with compensation of more than \$145,000 (indexed for inflation) to be designated as Roth 401(K) contributions beginning after December 31, 2025.

The Plan has incorporated or will incorporate changes in its Plan document and administration to the extent required by the SECURE 2.0 Act.

(11) Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan Sponsor amended the Plan to change eligibility requirements for plan participation. Under the amended provision, employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after completing 6 months of service, instead of 12 months of service based on 1,000 hours.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan name was changed to HK Kolmar USA LLC 401(K) Plan to reflect the corporate restructuring of the Plan Sponsor. This change does not affect the Plan’s operations, participant benefits, or the financial statements presented herein.

The Plan Sponsor has evaluated subsequent events from the balance date through September 30, 2025, the date at which the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no other items to disclose.
