We have performed audits of the financial statements of Brooks Rehabilitation 403(b) Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements (the "financial statements").

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Brooks Rehabilitation 403(b) Retirement Plan (“Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

All eligible employees of Genesis Health, Inc. dba Brooks Rehabilitation and participating employers (collectively known as the “Company” or “Brooks”) are eligible to enroll on their date of hire. The Retirement Plan Committee of the Company controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Transamerica Life Insurance Company (“Transamerica”) and Corebridge Financial, fka The Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company, (“Corebridge”) serve as the Plan’s custodians (collectively, the “Custodians”). The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code and provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to contribute pretax deferrals of compensation, as defined in the Plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations. Participant salary deferrals may be traditional 403b (pretax) or Roth 403b (after-tax). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

For participants that make elected deferrals, Brooks matches six percent (6%) of the participants’ compensation after participants complete one year of employment and 1,000 hours of service. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, money market funds and insurance investment contracts as investment options for participants. In addition, participants may utilize an individual self-directed brokerage option, through which participants are able to invest in a variety of securities including stocks, bonds, mutual funds and government securities in accordance with the Plan document Participant accounts.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of the Brooks’ contributions, and Plan earnings (losses), and charged with benefit payments, transaction fees related to notes receivable from participants and distributions, and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contributions portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service, with a minimum of one thousand (1,000) hours a year, according to the following schedule:

Additionally, 100% vesting occurs upon death, disability, early or normal retirement age, or termination of the Plan.

Collateral For Corebridge Loans to Participants

A group annuity contract ("annuity") is an investment vehicle issued by an insurance company that offers guaranteed interest and principal protection for retirement plan participants. Participants that borrow from the annuity account receive loans directly from Corebridge. They may borrow from Corebridge a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by collateral in the amount of the loan which is transferred from the participant account into a collateral fund. An additional amount equal to one quarter of interest plus all applicable surrender charges is transferred from the participant's account and held in escrow until the loan is repaid. Both of these amounts are invested in guaranteed interest accounts and bear interest at rates ranging from 3% to 4.5% as of December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are paid directly by the participant to the Corebridge over a period not to exceed five years, unless the loan proceeds are applied to the purchase of the principal residence of the participant. In such cases, the term of the loan may be prepaid over a reasonable period of time that exceeds five years. In the case of default, the note and collateral are not foreclosed on until the occurrence of a distributable event. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$145,268 and \$164,742, respectively, of such loans were collateralized by plan assets and included in investments at contract value.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 5.25% to 10.5%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount, or various installment and annuity options as provided by the Plan. Amounts contributed on a before-tax basis may only be withdrawn upon demonstration of financial hardship, disability, or after the participants reach the age of 59.5 years.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$580,534 and \$94,346, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce employer contributions and administrative expenses. During 2024, forfeitures of \$228,379 were used to offset employer contributions and \$61,907 used to pay administrative expenses.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transaction under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded when received. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from plan participants and safe-harbor contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which participants’ contributions are withheld from amounts paid. All participant and Company contributions are participant-directed.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan’s administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or Brooks, as provided by the Plan document. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of Brooks. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Expenses relating to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant’s account.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective August 18, 2025, the Plan transferred a majority of its assets to Empower Trust Company.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value as defined under GAAP is an exit price, representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1** Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.
- Level 2** Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts

Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Money Market Fund

The Plan invests in money market funds for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes a third-party pricing service to determine the fair value of each of these investment securities. Because quoted prices in active markets for identical assets are not available, these prices are determined using observable market information such as quotes from less active markets and/or quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan holds a portfolio of investment contracts that is comprised of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts with Corebridge and Transamerica and maintains the contributions in a general account. These contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The following represents the disaggregation of contract value between types of investment contracts held by the Plan.

The traditional investment contracts held by the Plan are guaranteed investment contracts. The contract issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuers or otherwise. The interest crediting rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuers. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuers' ability to meet their contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuers. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) premature termination of the contracts, (4) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (5) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

In addition, certain events allow the issuers to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material representation or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

Note 5. Unaudited Information Certified by Custodians

The accompanying financial statements include the following unaudited information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 that was obtained from data prepared and certified to be complete and accurate by the Plan's Custodians.

Note 6. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are funds managed by the Plan's Custodians and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid to the Plan's Custodians for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Fees paid to the Custodians and recordkeepers by the Plan for administrative services were \$244,934 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 7. Plan Termination.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, Brooks has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note 8. Tax Status

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirement of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the volume submitter plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the custodian by a letter dated March 31, 2017 that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10. Non-Exempt Party-in-Interest Transaction

During the 2021 through 2023 plan year, there were unintentional delays by the Company in submitting participant contributions in the amount of \$1,374,960 to the trustee. These delinquent contributions constitute prohibited transactions, and the Company will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants and for potential lost income due to the delays.
