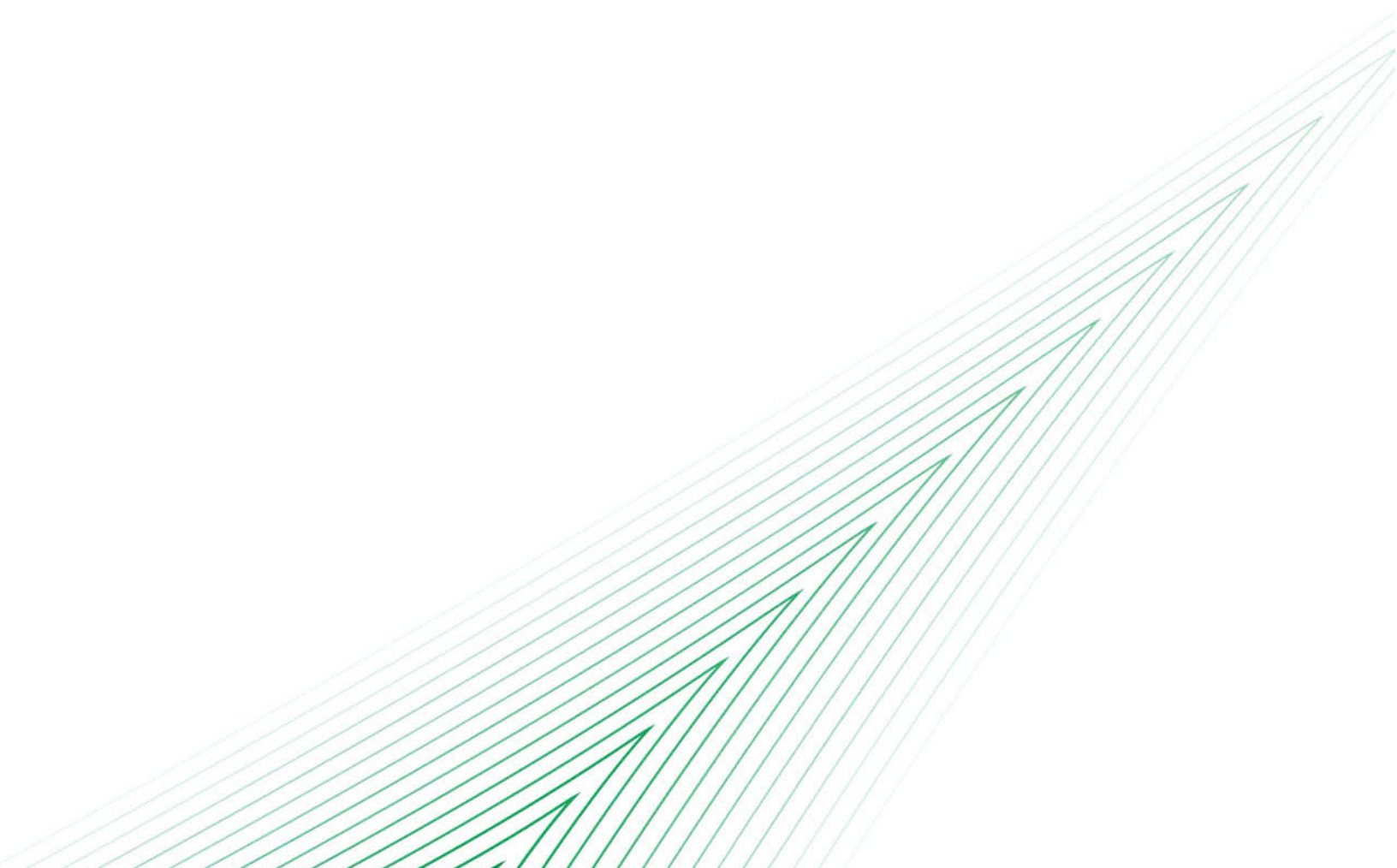

To the Plan Administrator of
Hitachi Employee 401(k) Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of Hitachi Employee 401(k) Retirement Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(1) Description of plan

The following description of the Hitachi Employee 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all employees of Hitachi America, Ltd. and its participating subsidiaries and affiliates (collectively, the "Company" or "plan sponsor") who are eligible to become a participant as of the earlier of: (a) the first entry date coinciding with, or immediately following, the date the eligible employee attains age 18 and completes at least one hour of service and, effective until January 1, 2007, is regularly scheduled to work at least 25 hours a week or (b) the January 1st or July 1st immediately following the date the eligible employee attains age 18 and completes his or her service requirement. Employees whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by a collective bargaining agreement are only eligible to participate if their contract states that they are eligible. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions - Employees who are eligible to participate in the Plan may elect to defer between 1% and 100% of their compensation up to the maximum amount allowable by law in accordance with Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations. The Company's match ranges from 25% to 100% of elective deferral contributions up to 3% to 6% of compensation, depending on the entity in which the participant is employed. In addition, the Company may, at its sole discretion, elect to make a profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company declared profit-sharing contributions of approximately \$400,000 and \$278,000, respectively. Participants may rollover all or a portion of a lump sum distribution from another employer's qualified retirement plan or from a rollover individual retirement account into the Plan. Additionally, participants age 50 or older, who are making contributions to the Plan, are allowed to make catch-up contributions as defined in the Plan. All contributions are participant-directed and subject to certain limitations.

Participant investment account options - Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, collective investment trusts, and common/collective trust funds, a money market fund, and a self-directed brokerage account.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of: (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are 100% vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon at all times. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution and profit-sharing contribution is based on continuous years of service, as follows:

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. Note terms range from 1 to 5 years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes receivable are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the plan administrator. Interest rates range from 3.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits - A participant may withdraw all or a portion of his or her vested balance at any time after attaining age 59½. Only one such withdrawal is allowed in any twelve-month period. On termination of service, a participant will receive a lump sum payment equal to the value of his or her vested account unless the participant's account balance is over \$7,000, in which case he or she may elect to leave his or her account in the Plan until he or she reaches the later of retirement or age 72. If a participant dies before receiving a distribution of his/her vested account, his/her beneficiary(ies) shall receive the participant's vested balance in the form of a lump sum payment or installments over a specified period of time. However, if the participant's account balance is \$1,000 or less upon death, the balance will be distributed to the beneficiary(ies) in the form of a lump sum payment.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$1,311,534,180 and \$1,150,228,190, respectively, of the Plan's assets were allocated to the vested accounts of persons who have terminated employment with the employer but have not been paid.

The Plan also contains limited withdrawal benefits in the event of a participant's financial hardship.

Forfeited accounts - As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$2,667,050 and \$3,277,242, respectively. Any forfeited nonvested accounts will be used to pay Plan expenses and/or reduce future employer contributions. Also, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Plan expenses and employer contributions of \$2,739,937 and \$4,190,716, respectively, were paid or reduced from forfeited nonvested accounts.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Investment valuation and income recognition (continued) - Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Contributions - Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses - Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are not included in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(3) Fair value measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820, "*Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*," provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

(3) Fair value measurements (continued)

Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly manner.

Self-directed brokerage account: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded or valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Money market fund: Valued using unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.

(4) Information prepared and certified by the trustee

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from the information certified as completed and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

(5) Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(6) Related-party transactions and party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and investments managed by affiliates of the trustee; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management and recordkeeping services amounted to approximately \$631,000 and \$996,000, respectively, for the year ended December 31, 2024, and approximately \$585,000 and \$854,000, respectively, for the year ended December 31, 2023. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan paid fees for ERISA legal counsel, audit fees, and administrative expenses of approximately \$407,000 and \$384,000, respectively. Additional fees paid by the Plan for investment management services for mutual funds and common/collective trust funds are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(7) Tax status

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined and informed the Company by letter dated October 25, 2013, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that “more likely than not” would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(8) Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(9) Excess contributions refundable

Contributions received from participants for 2024 and 2023 are net of payments of \$9,588 and \$164,904, respectively, that were made to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$9,588 and \$164,904, respectively, have been included in the Plan’s statements of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions refundable.

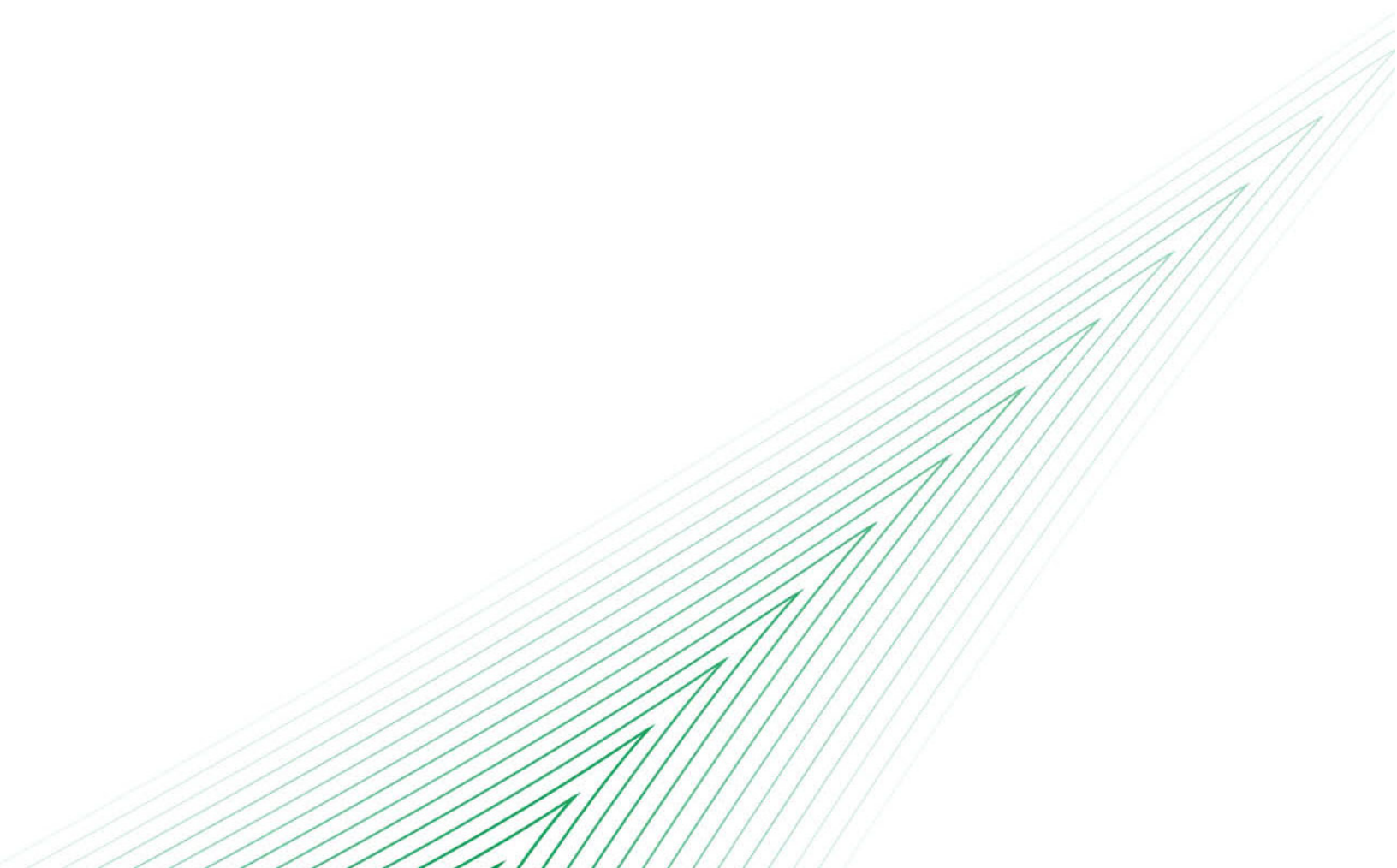

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INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator of
Hitachi Employee 401(k) Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of Hitachi Employee 401(k) Retirement Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(1) **Description of plan**

The following description of the Hitachi Employee 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan covering all employees of Hitachi America, Ltd. and its participating subsidiaries and affiliates (collectively, the "Company" or "plan sponsor") who are eligible to become a participant as of the earlier of: (a) the first entry date coinciding with, or immediately following, the date the eligible employee attains age 18 and completes at least one hour of service and, effective until January 1, 2007, is regularly scheduled to work at least 25 hours a week or (b) the January 1st or July 1st immediately following the date the eligible employee attains age 18 and completes his or her service requirement. Employees whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by a collective bargaining agreement are only eligible to participate if their contract states that they are eligible. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions - Employees who are eligible to participate in the Plan may elect to defer between 1% and 100% of their compensation up to the maximum amount allowable by law in accordance with Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations. The Company's match ranges from 25% to 100% of elective deferral contributions up to 3% to 6% of compensation, depending on the entity in which the participant is employed. In addition, the Company may, at its sole discretion, elect to make a profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company declared profit-sharing contributions of approximately \$400,000 and \$278,000, respectively. Participants may rollover all or a portion of a lump sum distribution from another employer's qualified retirement plan or from a rollover individual retirement account into the Plan. Additionally, participants age 50 or older, who are making contributions to the Plan, are allowed to make catch-up contributions as defined in the Plan. All contributions are participant-directed and subject to certain limitations.

Participant investment account options - Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, collective investment trusts, and common/collective trust funds, a money market fund, and a self-directed brokerage account.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of: (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are 100% vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon at all times. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution and profit-sharing contribution is based on continuous years of service, as follows:

(1) Description of plan (continued)

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. Note terms range from 1 to 5 years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes receivable are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the plan administrator. Interest rates range from 3.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits - A participant may withdraw all or a portion of his or her vested balance at any time after attaining age 59½. Only one such withdrawal is allowed in any twelve-month period. On termination of service, a participant will receive a lump sum payment equal to the value of his or her vested account unless the participant's account balance is over \$7,000, in which case he or she may elect to leave his or her account in the Plan until he or she reaches the later of retirement or age 72. If a participant dies before receiving a distribution of his/her vested account, his/her beneficiary(ies) shall receive the participant's vested balance in the form of a lump sum payment or installments over a specified period of time. However, if the participant's account balance is \$1,000 or less upon death, the balance will be distributed to the beneficiary(ies) in the form of a lump sum payment.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$1,311,534,180 and \$1,150,228,190, respectively, of the Plan's assets were allocated to the vested accounts of persons who have terminated employment with the employer but have not been paid.

The Plan also contains limited withdrawal benefits in the event of a participant's financial hardship.

Forfeited accounts - As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$2,667,050 and \$3,277,242, respectively. Any forfeited nonvested accounts will be used to pay Plan expenses and/or reduce future employer contributions. Also, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, Plan expenses and employer contributions of \$2,739,937 and \$4,190,716, respectively, were paid or reduced from forfeited nonvested accounts.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Investment valuation and income recognition (continued) - Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Contributions - Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payments of benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses - Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are not included in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(3) Fair value measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 820, "*Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*," provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

(3) Fair value measurements (continued)

Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trust funds: Valued at NAV of units of a bank collective trust fund. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund, less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust fund, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the fund in order to ensure that the securities’ liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Collective investment trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of the collective investment trusts. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly manner.

Self-directed brokerage account: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded or valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Money market fund: Valued using unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.

(4) Information prepared and certified by the trustee

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from the information certified as completed and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

(5) Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

(6) Related-party transactions and party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and investments managed by affiliates of the trustee; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management and recordkeeping services amounted to approximately \$631,000 and \$996,000, respectively, for the year ended December 31, 2024, and approximately \$585,000 and \$854,000, respectively, for the year ended December 31, 2023. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan paid fees for ERISA legal counsel, audit fees, and administrative expenses of approximately \$407,000 and \$384,000, respectively. Additional fees paid by the Plan for investment management services for mutual funds and common/collective trust funds are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(7) Tax status

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined and informed the Company by letter dated October 25, 2013, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that “more likely than not” would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(8) Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(9) Excess contributions refundable

Contributions received from participants for 2024 and 2023 are net of payments of \$9,588 and \$164,904, respectively, that were made to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$9,588 and \$164,904, respectively, have been included in the Plan’s statements of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions refundable.

(11) Transfers

In January 2024, there was a transfer in of assets from the Hitachi Astemo Michigan, Inc. Plan totaling approximately \$1,400,000. (12) Delinquent participant contributions

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets. While the Company remitted all employee contributions to the Plan, contributions of \$1,397,000 were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2023. The Company has remitted these delinquent contributions, including any lost earnings as a result.
