INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of the
Physicians Alliance of Connecticut, LLC Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the Physicians Alliance of Connecticut, LLC Retirement Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the 2024 Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the 2024 financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the 2024 financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Auditors' Report on the 2023 Financial Statements

The financial statements of the Plan as of December 31, 2023 were audited by predecessor auditors. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated October 8, 2024 indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulation for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Notes to the Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Physicians Alliance of Connecticut, LLC Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan which has been amended and restated effective December 1, 2021, covering all employees of Physicians Alliance of Connecticut, LLC (the “Plan Sponsor”) and its affiliate, PACT MSO LLC (collectively, the “Company” or “Employer”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employment Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (“IRC”), as amended.

Eligibility - Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan after completing three months of service and attaining at least 21 years of age. The employee’s entry date into the Plan will be on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date satisfaction of eligibility is met.

Contributions - Participants may elect to defer pre-tax or after tax eligible compensation as defined in the Plan, subject to the maximum annual limits as established by the Internal Revenue Services (“IRS”). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distribution from other qualified benefit or contribution plans, and participants that are 50 years old or older can make additional “catch-up” contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers several mutual funds as investment options for participants.

The Company also has an automatic enrollment provision with a starting contribution of 3% with annual increases of 1% until a maximum of 7% is reached.

Consistent with the Plan document, the Company is required to make a minimum safe harbor contribution of at least 3% of each participant’s annual eligible compensation for all eligible employees. Employees become eligible for safe harbor contributions when meeting all of the following requirements: attaining at least 21 years of age, completing 1 year of service, and upon completion of 1,000 hours of service. The first eligibility period is the 12-month period commencing on the employee’s date of hire. The safe harbor contributions are immediately 100% vested.

The Plan also includes an option for the Company to provide eligible employees with a discretionary profit-sharing contribution on an annual basis. Participants must be employed on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible to receive profit sharing contributions.

Participant Accounts - Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s voluntary contribution, the Company’s safe-harbor contribution, the Company’s discretionary profit-sharing contribution, investment income and an allocation of the Company’s discretionary contribution, if such is made. Allocations are based on participant earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)

Vesting - Participants are fully vested in both their contributions and the Employer safe harbor contribution plus actual earnings. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's discretionary profit-sharing contributions are as follows:

<u>Years of Vesting Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than 2 years	0%
2 years of service	20%
3 years of service	40%
4 years of service	60%
5 years of service	80%
6 years of service	100%

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from the vested interest in their accounts with a minimum loan amount of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. A participant may have up to two loans outstanding at any one time. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate equal to the prime rate plus 1%, set at inception of the loan and fixed for the duration. Interest rates in effect on outstanding notes receivable at December 31, 2024 and 2023 range from 4.25% to 9.50%.

If a participant fails to make a payment when the notes are due under the terms of the note, the participant will be in default. In the event of default, the note shall become due and payable immediately and interest will continue to accrue until the entire note balance is repaid. The Plan Sponsor will take all reasonable actions to collect the balance owed on the note. Under certain circumstances, the note in default could be considered a distribution from the Plan and could be considered income to the participant.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic installments (at least annually) subject to the minimum distribution rules, and partial distributions. For the termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested amount in his or her account as a lump sum distribution.

Withdrawals from a participant's salary deferral account may also be made in the event of a financial hardship, or for adoption or childbirth expenses, in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan. Additionally, participants who are at least 59½ years of age may withdraw all or a portion of the balance in their account prior to termination for any reason.

The Plan also has an involuntary cash out provision for account balances of terminated vested participants. Account balances of \$5,000 or less will be subject to involuntary cash out or automatic rollover (if applicable). Rollover amounts will be included in calculating the \$5,000 minimum balance.

Forfeited accounts - As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$49,967 and \$7,377 respectively. These accounts may be used first to offset Plan expenses, then to reduce future Employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeited nonvested accounts were utilized.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make certain estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by investment advisers and the trustees. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events for the year ended December 31, 2024 through October 15, 2025, the date on which financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the input to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or 3 inputs for the periods presented and there were no changes in the methods used to measure fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements - Mutual Funds: The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Investments Not Classified in the Fair Value Hierarchy - Common/Collective Trust Fund: The Plan invests in a common/collective trust fund for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes the NAV provided by the trustee as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the common/collective trust fund, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations would be carried out in an orderly business manner. The common/collective trust fund is not required to be classified within a level on the fair value hierarchy.

There were no participant redemption restrictions for the common/collective trust fund; the redemption notice period was only applicable to the Plan. As of December 31, 2024, there were no unfunded commitments, daily redemption restrictions and a 12-month redemption notice period.

NOTE 4 - CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including all investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by State Street Bank and Trust Company and Reliance Trust Company, the trustees of the Plan.

NOTE 5 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments are managed by State Street Bank and Trust Company and Reliance Trust Company. State Street Bank and Trust Company and Reliance Trust Company serve as the trustees of the Plan, therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. State Street Bank and Trust Company and Reliance Trust Company also perform certain administrative, advisory and recordkeeping services for the Plan.

The Plan provides for loans to participants. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company have the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Plan operates under a pre-approved plan that is intended to operate as a qualified tax-exempt plan under the appropriate section of the IRC. The Plan's third-party administrator has provided the Company a copy of a letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, in which the IRS issued an opinion that the pre-approved plan, as designed, was acceptable under the applicable requirements of the IRC and that, therefore, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the IRC and is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 401(a) of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
