Scope and nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Stepan Company Savings and Investment Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of management for the financial statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with US GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with US GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other matter - supplemental schedule required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such supplementary information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures. These additional procedures included comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with US GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Stepan Company Savings and Investment Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document, as amended, for more complete information regarding the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established to assist all U.S. employees of Stepan Company (the “Company”) in providing for their future security. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

The Plan is administered by the Company. The trustee of the Plan is Fidelity Management Trust Company (the “Trustee”). The Plan Committee of the Stepan Savings and Investment Retirement Plan controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan.

Eligibility

Participants are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of employment with the Company.

Participant Contributions

Participants may elect to defer up to 50% of their base compensation and up to 50% of their bonus as defined by the Plan. The Plan also allows employees who have reached age 50 to contribute additional catch-up amounts as provided by the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act. Automatic enrollment is set at 6%, which is defaulted to a life cycle fund targeted closest to the participant’s 65th birthday. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollovers from other qualified plans.

Company Contributions

There are two sources of company contributions: a per pay period and an annual discretionary contribution. On a per pay-period basis, the Company makes a matching contribution in the amount of the employee’s contribution, up to 6% of eligible compensation. Each year, at its discretion, the Company may make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. Profit-sharing contributions shall be allocated between the Plan and/or the Stepan Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan II (“ESOP II”) at the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Company (the “Board”). There was no discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024, as the Board approved a 100% allocation to the ESOP II.

Participants need to be actively employed on December 31, 2024, or if terminated have obtained age 55 and completion of five years of service to be eligible for the discretionary profit-sharing plan or due to death or disability.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each of the Plan’s participants. The accounts reflect the participant’s payroll contributions, rollover contributions from a previous employer’s plan, and assets diversified and transferred into the Plan from the Stepan Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan II. Earnings (losses) on investments are credited (charged) to each individual investment fund held within participant accounts based on the fair value of each of the investment funds as determined by the Trustee. Transfers from the Stepan Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan II occur quarterly. For the year ended December 31, 2024, \$1,108,468 was transferred into the Plan from the Stepan Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan II.

Notes Receivable From Participants

The Plan permits participants to borrow funds from the Plan with the approval of the Plan Administrator. The maximum loan amount is the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's current account balance. Loan terms shall not exceed five years. Only one loan may be outstanding at any time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a fixed rate of interest one point above the prime rate at the time the loan was taken. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Participants may take withdrawals prior to termination of employment under an age 59½ withdrawal, from a rollover or a qualified reservist distribution. The Plan was amended to allow hardship withdrawals. Upon retirement, death or termination of employment with the Company, participants whose balances are less than \$1,000 will receive a lump-sum distribution in the amount of the balance in their accounts. Participants with account balances greater than \$1,000 have the choice of leaving their account invested in the Plan, receiving a lump-sum distribution, or requesting systematic distributions from the Plan. All lump-sum distributions are in the amount of the participant's account balance less any outstanding loan balance at the time of termination.

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 ("SECURE Act") changed the age at which participants are required to take Required Minimum Distributions from their accounts. Under the new law, effective January 1, 2020, participant distributions may not be deferred past April 1 following the year in which the participant reached the age of 72. The SECURE 2.0 Act increased the age to 73 in 2023 and established an additional increase that will bring the starting age to 75 by 2033.

The participant account may be distributed in systematic annual, quarterly, semi-annual, monthly, semi-monthly or biweekly distributions, after retirement, death, disability or severance from employment at a fixed percentage or in amounts determined in accordance with the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS").

Vesting

Participants are fully vested in their elective deferral and the matching Company contribution account balances at all times. Vesting in the profit-sharing contribution requires two years of service.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$10,656 and \$27,766, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay Plan expenses or reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, \$87,653 was used to pay Plan expenses and \$63,197 was used to pay Contributions from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Investment Options

Participants direct investment of their account balance and contributions, including rollover contributions and assets transferred from other plans, into investment options offered by the Plan. Investments among the options must be made in whole percentage increments. Participants may change their investment elections daily.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Company pays certain expenses of administering the Plan. Investment fees are paid by the Plan.

Transfers

Diversification transfers from the Stepan Company Employee Stock Ownership Plan II to the Plan are recorded when transacted.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") has issued guidance that defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value under current accounting pronouncements that require or permit fair value measurements and enhances disclosures about fair value measurement. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the FASB guidance are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;

- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the quoted net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Collective trust fund: Valued at the NAV of shares of a bank collective trust held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund. This fund seeks to preserve principal investment while earning interest income. The Fidelity Managed Income Portfolio (MIP) will try to maintain a stable \$1 unit price, but it cannot guarantee that it will be able to do so. The MIP invests in investment contracts (wrap contracts) issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions, fixed income securities and money market funds to provide daily liquidity. There are no unfunded commitments of the MIP.

The collective trust fund allows for daily liquidity with no additional days' notice required for redemption for participant-directed transactions at the constant NAV of \$1 per unit. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the MIP, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust for up to 12 months in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustee has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS

The Plan received a favorable determination letter, dated January 11, 2016, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or other applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any periods in progress.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

NOTE 7 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and a collective trust managed by the Trustee or an affiliate thereof. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from participants held by the Plan also represent party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan management has evaluated the Plan's December 31, 2024 financial statements for subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Plan management is not aware of any subsequent events that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.
