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INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator and Participants

Opinion

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(1) Description of the Plan

The following information provides only general information about the Ernst & Young (“EY” or the “Firm”) Group Term Life Insurance Plan (the “Plan”). Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan is funded using a Voluntary Employment Benefits Association (“VEBA”) trust, the Ernst & Young U.S. LLP Trust for Life Insurance Benefits (“VEBA trust”). The VEBA trust serves as an investment vehicle for life insurance benefits of all eligible employees and retirees. BMO Bank N.A. is the custodian and trustee of the VEBA trust. BMO Bank N.A. was integrated into Midwest Institutional Trust Company (“MITC”) in 2023 through the acquisition of its institutional trust and custody businesses. Effective January 1, 2024, MITC assumed the role as custodian and trustee, succeeding BMO.

Full-time and part-time employees who work at least an average of 20 hours per week are eligible for coverage under the Plan.

Effective with the 2021 Plan Year, the Firm made changes to the active employee Group Term Life Insurance benefits. Previously, the Firm allowed employees to elect up to \$50,000 in group life benefits on a pre-tax employee paid basis. Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan provides a group term life insurance benefit of \$50,000 to eligible active staff members, as defined. Staff participants continue to have the option to purchase additional coverage of \$10,000 or \$50,000 at their own expense.

Effective December 12, 2019, the Executive Committees of Ernst & Young LLP and Ernst & Young U.S. LLP (the “Committees”) established the VEBA Trust Investment Committee, to be responsible for overseeing the investment of assets in the VEBA trust. In addition, the Committee established the VEBA Trust Administrative Committee, to be responsible for non-routine administrative matters relating to the VEBA trust.

Effective March 12, 2020, the VEBA Trust Administrative Committee passed a Resolution authorizing, as soon as practicable, upon the depletion of the funds held in the VEBA trust that the VEBA trust be dissolved. Upon dissolution of the VEBA trust, the Plan intends to continue to provide benefits using the general assets of the Firm.

The Plan assets held by MITC were depleted to zero and the VEBA Trust was dissolved effective April 1, 2025.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

(a) Benefits

Eligible staff employees who have employee paid coverage of \$10,000 or \$50,000 upon retirement will receive a \$10,000 group term life insurance benefit for life, paid for by the Plan.

As communicated to certain employees effective January 1, 2018 and included in the January 1, 2018 and January 1, 2020 Summary Plan Descriptions of the Ernst & Young Medical Plan for Certain Retirees not Eligible for Medicare and included in the Plan's February 2023 and 2021 Summary Plan Descriptions, the retirement eligibility for the Plan changed to tie to staff members eligibility for the EY Medical Plan for Certain Retirees not Eligible for Medicare. Eligibility is as follows:

Executive Director and Director not yet fully eligible on January 1, 2018:

- Age and Service:
 - Age 55 with 15 years of service

All staff retirees eligible on or before January 1, 2018:

- Age and Service:
 - Age 50 with 75 points
 - Age 55 with 15 years of service
 - Age 60 with 30 years of service

Previously the Plan provided death benefits, as defined, for Firm personnel, including the regular full time or eligible part-time staff members eligible to enroll and retirees of Arthur Young (AY) and Ernst & Whinney (E&W), who elected to participate and if they retired from the Firm and were entitled to normal or early retirement benefits under the Firm's Defined Benefit Retirement Plan and had employee paid Group Term Life Insurance Plan coverage of \$10,000 or \$50,000 upon retirement, they were granted \$10,000 of coverage for life, paid by the Plan. Current Ernst & Young U.S. LLP Partners are not eligible to participate in this Plan.

The insurer for life insurance benefits is the Prudential Insurance Company of America ("Prudential"). These premiums are funded through the VEBA trust for certain of the Plan's participants, who are E&W retirees.

(b) Contributions

In addition to the Firm-provided \$50,000 coverage, eligible active participants may elect to pay for additional coverage based on rates according to schedules which relate to benefit coverage elected by the participant. Participants can elect no additional coverage, \$10,000 coverage or

\$50,000 coverage. Premiums for coverage that are paid by active participants are \$0.25 per pay cycle and \$1.26 per pay cycle for \$10,000 coverage and \$50,000 coverage, respectively. Retired partners from E&W directly pay \$9.60 per \$1,000 of coverage.

During 2024, active participants contributed approximately \$1,233,000 into the Plan, retired partners from E&W contributed approximately \$6,000 to the Plan and direct payments of approximately \$9,000 were received.

(2) **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

(a) Basis of Accounting

As permitted under the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations, the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). Under this modified cash basis, investment assets are reported at fair value, interest income and contributions are recognized when received rather than as earned, and premiums and expenses are recognized when paid rather than as incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present net assets under the Plan and changes in net assets available for benefits in conformity with U.S. GAAP

(b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with a modified cash basis of accounting requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes and supplemental schedules. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) Valuation of Investments

The Plan's investment in a money market fund is stated at fair value based on quoted market prices. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis.

(d) Risk and Uncertainties

The actuarial present value of benefit obligations is reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimates and assumptions process, it is a least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

(e) Administrative Expenses

The Firm bears the majority of the costs of administering the Plan.

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(f) Plan Benefit Obligations

Plan benefit obligations at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are estimated by the Plan's actuary and represent the value of fully insured premium payments for actives and retirees in accordance with accepted actuarial principles. Such estimated amounts, reported in Note 5, are based on historical premium payments. The present value of future premium payments is included in the calculation of the postretirement benefit obligation. Significant assumptions used in estimating the postretirement benefit obligation are as follows:

Weighted average discount rate	6.01% (5.08% in 2023)
Retirement age	Between ages 55 to 72 (for 2024 and 2023)
Mortality	A variation of the Pri-2012 mortality table and MP-2019 generational projection scale, adjusted to reflect EY's experience and expectations.

The foregoing assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of the postretirement benefit obligation.

(g) Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for an asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- *Level 1* – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities

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- *Level 2* – Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- *Level 3* – Significant unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity).

(4) Income Tax Status

The VEBA trust funding the Plan has received an exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated January 18, 1982, stating that the VEBA trust is tax-exempt under the provisions of Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) as a VEBA. The Plan and the VEBA trust are required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status of the VEBA

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trust. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the related VEBA trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(5) Plan Benefit Obligation

The actuarial valuations are as of January 1, 2025 and 2024. Had the valuations been performed as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 there would be no material differences.

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The change in actuarial assumptions represents the discount rate increasing from 5.08% at December 31, 2023 to 6.01% at December 31, 2024. In addition, the reduction in the obligation is attributable to changes in the census data and a change in the participation assumption from 100% to 90%. The Plan has a deficiency of net assets available for benefits as compared to its accumulated postretirement benefit obligation at December 31, 2024. However, the Plan sponsor believes that net assets plus future contributions and investment earnings will be sufficient to pay benefits as they are due. The Firm reserves the right to charge premiums to retirees in the future.

(6) Related Parties and Party In Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are currently cash equivalents and are managed by MITC. MITC also serves as Trustee defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. Fees paid by the Plan to MITC were \$2,418 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

(7) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Firm has the right to terminate or amend the Plan. Coverage terminates when a participant leaves the Firm, excluding retirement, if premiums for coverage are not paid by the required due date, or if the Plan terminates or is amended to exclude a class of individuals. No amendment of the VEBA trust may be made which permits any part of the assets to be used for or diverted to purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the participants. In the event the Plan is wholly or partially terminated, each participant is entitled to convert their coverage under the Plan. The conversion insurance may be a type of life insurance currently being offered by the insurance company at the insured's age and in the amount requested. The cost will be based on the individual policy rates in effect at the time of conversion. All premiums for converted insurance become the responsibility of the participant.
