We have performed audits of the financial statements of Teya 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements (2024 and 2023 financial statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the 2024 and 2023 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying 2024 and 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying 2024 and 2023 financial statements related to assets held by a qualified institution and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 10 to the financial statements, Teya 401(k) Plan was merged into Salamatof Native Association, Inc. 401(k) Plan and legal responsibility was transferred to the Salamatof Native Association, Inc. 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2025. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the 2024 and 2023 ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2024 and 2023 Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Plan Description

The following description of Teya 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Teya Development LLC and its subsidiaries (the Company) who are age 21 or older, and not covered by a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA), unless the CBA specifically provides for plan participation. The Leadership Team of the Company is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan amendment: The Plan was amended effective January 1, 2025, to merge the Plan into the Salamatof Native Association, Inc. 401(k) Plan.

Contributions: Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants are also permitted to contribute Roth after-tax deferrals to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

The Company may make matching contributions, profit sharing contributions and prevailing wage contributions to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made prevailing wage contributions and did not make matching contributions or profit sharing contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations.

Investment options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct all contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan Administrator in 1% increments. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, discretionary employer matching contributions, and prevailing wage contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are vested immediately in their elective contributions and the Company's prevailing wage contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are vested in the Company's matching and profit sharing contributions plus actual earnings thereon based on years of continuous service. Participants vest 25% per year beginning after two years of service and are 100% vested after five years of service.

Payment of benefits: The Plan permits withdrawals when a participant terminates employment, reaches retirement age, or becomes disabled or deceased. In-service withdrawals are also permitted for certain financial hardships or when a participant attains the age of 59½. Benefits are payable in lump-sum payments with certain exceptions allowed.

Forfeitures: Forfeitures are used to reduce future Company contributions or pay plan expenses. There were no forfeited nonvested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and no forfeitures were used to reduce Company contributions or pay administrative expenses during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 1. Plan Description (Continued)

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by any outstanding loan balance, or \$50,000, reduced by any outstanding loan balance. Loan terms range up to five years or over a reasonable period of time for the purchase of a participant's primary residence, as established by the Plan Administrator at the time of the loan. The loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of prime plus 2% at the time of the loan. These rates range from 6.75% to 10.5% on loans outstanding at December 31, 2024, and the loans mature through 2038. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Contributions: Contributions from plan participants and matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the underlying compensation is paid. Profit sharing contributions are recognized upon formal authorization. Prevailing wage contributions are recognized as the hours to which they relate are worked. Participant contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction in contributions.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees related to the administration of notes receivable that are charged directly to the participant's account, certain recordkeeping fees and financial advisor fees paid by the Plan. Certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent events: The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares in each account held by the Plan at year end. The NAV is not a publicly-quoted price in an active market. The NAV, as provided by the insurance carrier, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value.

- (g) Invests in a combination of assets determined at the discretion of the manager to achieve the best risk-adjusted performance based on risk tolerance or length of time to investment goal.

Note 5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan has a traditional, fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya that is reported at contract value. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with contributions, earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC
2. Premature termination of the contracts
3. Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract

3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer

Note 6. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Voya is the trustee of the Plan; therefore transactions with the trustee qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company also paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan.

Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their entire account.

Note 8. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated November 30, 2020, stating that the form of the preapproved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since adopting the preapproved plan document; however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10. Plan Merger

The Plan Sponsor approved the merger of the Plan into Salamatof Native Association, Inc. 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2025. Legal title and responsibility was transferred to the Salamatof Native Association, Inc. 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2025. Employees who were participating in this plan became participants in the Salamatof Native Association, Inc. 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2025.

Note 11. Nonexempt Transactions

During 2024, the Company inadvertently failed to deposit \$240 of participant deferrals within the required timeframe as stated by the DOL. The Company intends to deposit lost interest to correct this failure in 2025.
