Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Rockpoint Group, L.L.C. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Rockpoint Group, L.L.C. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust was established on October 1, 2003. The Plan covers eligible employees of Rockpoint Group, L.L.C., and Rockhill Management LLC (collectively the "Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan excludes from participation, among others, employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement and employees who are nonresident aliens.

As of December 31, 2024, all investments of the Plan were and are held by Charles Schwab Trust Bank (the "Trustee"). The Trustee holds the Plan's assets in a single trust and invests the assets among several investment options designated by the participant.

Participant Eligibility

All individuals employed by the Company will be eligible to participate in the Plan on the date they are hired. They are entered into the Plan on the first day of the following month.

Contributions

The Plan permits participants to defer not less than 1% and not more than 100% of eligible compensation on a pre-tax basis or after-tax basis under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Contributions were limited to a maximum of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, or such other limit prescribed by Section 402 of the Code. In addition, for any calendar year in which a participant is age 50 before the end of the Plan year, such participants are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Catch-up contributions were limited to a maximum of \$7,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. All contributions are made through payroll deductions. The contribution percentage(s) can be changed or stopped entirely at any time.

Matching Contributions

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan in order to match all or a portion of a participant's elective deferrals. The formula, the amount of the contribution, and the frequency of the contribution will be determined at the Company's discretion. Matching contributions may also be made with respect to any "catch-up contributions" made to the Plan. Certain participant classes must satisfy a three-month service eligibility condition prior to being eligible for the discretionary match.

Safe Harbor Contributions

In order to satisfy certain testing requirements, the Company may make a safe harbor profit sharing contribution to the Plan that is equal to at least 3% of eligible compensation of each eligible participant for the allocation period. The Company may use this contribution to offset the allocation of any non-safe harbor profit sharing contribution that would otherwise be allocated to a participant's account. Participants classified as highly compensated under ERISA rules are not eligible to receive an allocation.

Non-Safe Harbor Contributions

The Company may make a discretionary non-safe harbor contribution equal to a uniform percentage or dollar amount. Each year, the Company will determine the formula for the non-safe harbor contribution.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Non-Safe Harbor Contributions (Continued)

For the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company's safe harbor and non-safe harbor contributions amounted to \$2,069,529 and \$2,155,310, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the full amount of the Company's contributions were outstanding and are booked as receivables on the statements of net assets available for benefits. The Company did not make matching contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested at all times in the value of their cumulative contributions, employer matching contributions, safe harbor contributions, non-safe harbor contributions, and earnings thereon.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution (if any) and, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. The expenses charged to the Plan may be charged pro rata to each participant in relation to the size of each participant's account balance or may be charged equally to each participant.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or in a number of substantially equal installments (if elected by the beneficiary). For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow against their individual accounts under certain conditions. Participant loans range between a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of the smaller of \$50,000 or 50% of the employee's vested account balance. Participant loans carry an interest rate of prime plus 1% and must be repaid within five years or a period not to exceed fifteen years if such loan is to be used for the purchase of a participant's principal residence. Participants may only have one loan outstanding at any time.

2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - GAAP

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Investments Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation included the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

A significant portion of the administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company.

Use of Estimates in the Preparation of Financial Statements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires plan administrators to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Accordingly, results could differ from those estimates.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

ASC 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Observable market based inputs or unobservable inputs that are corroborated by market data. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The following is a description of the techniques and inputs used for each major class of assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds: The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Money Market Funds: Valued based on the funds' reported closing net asset value ("NAV") as of the last business day of the plan year. The money market funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table presents by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan investment assets at fair value, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. As required by ASC 820, investment assets are classified in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

4. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has received an IRS opinion letter dated September 21, 2020, stating that the Plan, in form, is acceptable under the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTION

Parties in interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. From time to time, Certain Plan investments are managed by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the trustee of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. No such investments were held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Certain administrative fees related to the administration of the Plan were paid by the Plan or by the Company. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Total fees and commissions paid by the Plan for the investment management and plan administration services amounted to \$11,697 and \$7,301 for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

6. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risk such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits

The Plan is subject to risks associated with unforeseen or catastrophic events, including terrorist attacks, natural disasters, geopolitical events, and the emergence of a pandemic, such as COVID-19, or other public health emergencies, which could create economic, financial, and business disruptions. These events could lead to operational difficulties that could materially impair the trustees of the Plan to manage the Plan’s activities potentially resulting in material financial losses to the Plan and its participants. The trustees of the Plan seek to manage these risks through continuity and resiliency planning although no assurance can be made that the trustees will successfully implement such plans or that such plans would successfully avoid or mitigate adverse consequences.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

The Company intends to continue the Plan indefinitely; however, it may discontinue its contributions and terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, all participants have a non-forfeitable right to the entire value of their accounts.

8. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The December 31, 2024 and 2023, statements of net assets available for benefits, the investment activities included on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the accompanying notes to the financial statements were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by the Charles Schwab Trust Bank (the trustee of the Plan) in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The information certified includes total investments, cash, and notes receivable from participants as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the net appreciation in the fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
