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Independent Auditor's Report

To the Plan Administrator of

Report on the Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Morton Comprehensive Health Services 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

A. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Morton Comprehensive Health Services, Inc. (the Organization or Employer) sponsors the Morton Comprehensive Health Services 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan). The following description provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of the Organization's employees. The Plan is intended to satisfy all of the requirements for a 403(b) plan under the appropriate provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and similar state tax laws. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan is administered by the Retirement Plan Committee, which is a committee appointed by the Organization's board of directors. Bank of Oklahoma (the Custodian), a division of BOKF, N.A. serves as the custodian of the Plan, processes and maintains the records of the participant data and holds the Plan's assets.

Eligibility

Employees of the Organization are eligible to participate in the Plan upon their first day of employment with the Employer.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax compensation, as defined by the plan document. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants may direct the investment of their contributions into various mutual funds held in custodial accounts in accordance with Code 403(b)(7).

The Plan provides for Employer matching contributions. During 2024 the Organization matched 100% of deferrals, excluding catch-up contributions, up to 4% of a participant's eligible compensation.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Employer matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in Employer contributions is based upon years of continuous service as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vesting Percentage</u>
Less than three years	0%
Three years or more	100%

Participants automatically become 100% vested upon: 1) normal retirement (attainment of age 65); 2) early retirement (attainment of age 55 for employees hired before October 1, 2010); 3) disability; or 4) death. Participants who terminate for any other reason are entitled to the vested amount of their accounts.

Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the preceding 12-month period, or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of 4.25% - 9.50%, which is based on prime rate plus 1% on the date of origination. Only one loan may be outstanding at any given time. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions, over a term not to exceed five years (except for loans used for the purchase of a principal residence).

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, termination, disability or death, a participant, or his or her beneficiary in the event of death, may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Additionally, participants may take an in-service distribution upon reaching the age of 59 ½. Upon termination, automatic distributions are required for balances of less than \$5,000. Automatic distributions above \$1,000 made without the participant's consent are rolled into an individual retirement account designated by the Custodian. Generally, certain minimum distributions are required for participants who have separated from service and have reached at 70 ½.

The Plan allows hardship withdrawals from participant deferral amounts, subject to account balance limits and applicable laws.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are used first to pay administrative expenses and then to reduce Employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures in the amount of \$26,426 were used to pay for administrative expenses. Amounts forfeited by participants during the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$72,790. The Plan had \$50,086 and \$2,787 in unallocated forfeitures at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

B. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Custodian. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recognized over the life of the loan based on the stated interest rate. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. There were no benefits requested before year-end that were not paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Organization or the Plan, at the Organization's discretion. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to participant's accounts.

C. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Custodian has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- Net investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024;
- Investment information included in the footnotes as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and on the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits.

Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs have the highest priority, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Fair values are based on quoted market prices in active markets for identical issues that the plan has the ability to access at the measurement date. The Plan's Level 1 investments include mutual funds and are valued based on quoted prices for identical assets on the measurement date.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Fair values are based on inputs rather than quoted market prices included within Level 1 that are observable for valuing the asset, either directly or indirectly. Observable inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active or non-active markets. Level 2 inputs may also include insignificant adjustments to market observable inputs. The Plan holds no Level 2 investments.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

Fair values are based on unobservable inputs used for valuing the asset. Unobservable inputs are those that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset, based on the best information available in the circumstances. The Plan holds no Level 3 investments.

E. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

F. TAX STATUS

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Code. The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform to the sample language provided by the Internal Revenue Service in Revenue Procedure 2007-7. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status for Plan participants under Section 403(b). Plan management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that contributions to the Plan are tax-exempt.

G. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risks associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Rising inflation and international military conflicts have led to volatility in financial markets and have affected, and may continue to affect, the market price of the Plan's assets. The potential economic impact brought by, and the duration of these events is difficult to assess or predict and will depend on future developments that are highly uncertain and cannot be predicted.

H. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan incurs expenses related to the general administration, recordkeeping and trust administration. These expenses and certain accounting and auditing fees related to the Plan are paid by the Organization. The Organization does not expect reimbursement from the Plan for these services. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Organization. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services.

Certain Plan investments are held in funds of the Custodian. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan paid \$62,797 of recordkeeping fees to the Custodian during 2024. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing rather than a direct payment.

I. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the independent auditor's report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
