Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We were engaged to perform audits of the financial statements of Faith Regional Health Services Tax Deferred Annuity Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Disclaimer of Opinion

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of the Plan. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion

The Plan has not maintained sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the accompanying financial statements may have been affected by these conditions.

Further, as described in Note 2 to the financial statements, the Plan has excluded from investments in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009, as permitted by the DOL's Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2009-02, *Annual Reporting Requirements for 403(b) Plans*. The investment income and distributions related to such accounts have also been excluded in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. The amount of these excluded annuity contracts and custodial accounts and the related income and distributions are not determinable. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that these accounts and the related income and distributions be included in the accompanying financial statements.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of the Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and to issue an auditor's report. However, because of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of the Plan, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule H, line 4i – schedule of assets held at end of year and schedule H, line 4a – schedule of delinquent participant contributions as of or for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section, it is inappropriate to and we do not express an opinion on the supplemental schedules referred to above.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Faith Regional Health Services Tax Deferred Annuity Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering qualified employees, as defined by the Plan, of Faith Regional Health Services. Faith Regional Physician Services, LLC, a related entity, is also a participating employer in the Plan. Faith Regional Health Services and Faith Regional Physician Services, LLC are collectively referred to as the Employers or Faith. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Retirement Plan Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan as well as determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees become eligible for the Plan on their first day of employment with Faith. Student employees are an excluded class of employees.

Entry Date

Employees may enter the Plan on their first day of employment with Faith.

Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to make contributions of their pretax annual or post tax (Roth) compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover).

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect a different deferral rate or not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the employee.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions (including rollovers) and allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's compensation, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct rollover and deferral contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions (including rollovers) plus actual earnings or losses thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest, partial withdrawals, or installments as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination of service, death or disability. A terminated participant with a balance of less than \$1,000 may be automatically paid out by the Plan upon termination. Any terminated participants with a balance between \$1,000 and \$7,000 can still be automatically paid out if their balance is rolled into a qualified Individual Retirement Account. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of age 65 or hardship as defined in the Plan document.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employers have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by investment advisors, insurance company and the trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value methods.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Contributions

Participant contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Excluded Contracts and Accounts

The Plan Administrator has elected to exclude certain contracts and accounts from Plan assets in accordance with Department of Labor (DOL) Field Assistance Bulletin 2009-02 due to the following:

- The contract or account was issued to a current or former employee before January 1, 2009;
- The Employers ceased to have any obligation to make contributions (including employee salary reduction contributions), and in fact stopped making contributions to the contract or account before January 1, 2009;
- All the rights under the contract or account are legally enforceable against the insurer or custodian by the individual owner of the contract or account without any involvement by the Employers; and
- The individual owner of the contract is fully vested in the contract or account.

Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Employers, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Employers are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net asset available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Employers. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Fixed account: The Plan's interest in the fixed account is based on the value of participant contributions plus credited interest, less any market value adjustment.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at fair value based on the NAV of the units held in the account. The NAV, as provided by the custodian is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the account less liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Note 4 - Certified Information

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Voya Institutional Trust Company (the trustee of the Plan) and by American United Life Insurance Company (the Insurance Company).

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, which received an advisory letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated March 31, 2017, stating that the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 - Contracts with Insurance Company

The Plan has entered into multiple traditional fully benefit-responsive investment contracts with American United Life Insurance Company (AUL). These contracts met the fully benefit-response investment contract criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by AUL, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract value of the investment contracts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$373,669 and \$462,443, respectively.

AUL maintains the contributions from the contracts in a general account. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The following is a summary of the guaranteed interest rate by contract:

- a) Distributions out of the contract are charged a fee ranging from 0% to 8% based on number of years the participant has been part of the contract.
- b) Distributions out of the contract are charged a fee ranging from 3% to 10% based on number of years the participant has been part of the contract.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents; (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options; or (3) significant withdrawals from the Plan. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

Note 7 - Non-Fully Benefit-Responsive Contract

The Plan entered into an investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (VRIAC). As part of the contract, VRIAC maintains a portion of the contributions in a guaranteed account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged by VRIAC. The guaranteed account is included in the financial statements at fair value.

Note 8 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Voya Institutional Trust Company (Voya) and made available through VRIAC, related entities. Plan investments include a fixed account with VRIAC. Also, certain Plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts and traditional fully benefit-responsive investment contracts managed by AUL. Voya is the trustee and AUL is a service provider as defined by the Plan. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Note 9 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or global conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10 - Plan Amendments

In connection with the SECURE 2.0 Act, the Plan has not yet been formally amended. However, the Plan is required to operate in accordance with required provisions in accordance with the effective date of each new provision, as well as any optional provisions as elected by the Plan. Effective for distributions made after December 31, 2023, the Plan has elected to apply a threshold of \$7,000 for involuntary cash-out distributions. In addition, effective January 1, 2025, the Plan will allow higher catch-up contribution limits for employees who have attained age 60, 61, 62 and 63.

Note 11 - Delinquent Participant Contributions

During 2023, the Employer failed to remit to the Plan's trustee certain employee contributions totaling approximately \$4,301 within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. During 2024, the Employer failed to remit to the Plan's trustee certain employee contributions totaling approximately \$1,254 within the period prescribed by DOL regulations. Delays in remitting contributions to the trustee were due to administrative errors, and the Employers have or will make contributions to the affected participant's accounts to compensate the participants for potential lost income due to the delay.

Note 12 - Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, Voya Financial acquired the OneAmerica Financial full-service retirement plan business. As part of that transaction, Voya purchased OneAmerica Retirement Services LLC and OneAmerica Investment Advisory Services. Group annuity contracts issued by AUL will be administered by VRIAC.

Administrative and recordkeeping services will be provided by VRIAC or Voya Institutional Plan Services, LLC. Certain registered representatives of OneAmerica Securities, Inc. who support the affected businesses are now registered with Voya Financial Partners, LLC or Voya Financial Advisors, Inc. OneAmerica Financial continues to provide information and services to Voya through a transition services agreement.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
