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**NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

This summary of significant accounting policies of the Sanctuary For Families 403(b) Plan (the "Plan") is presented to assist in understanding the Plan's financial statements and supplemental information. These financial statements, supplemental information, and notes are representations of Sanctuary for Families, Inc.'s (the "Employer" or "Plan Sponsor") management, who is responsible for the integrity and objectivity of the financial statements. These accounting policies have been consistently applied in the preparation of the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments in mutual funds and the fixed interest account are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income on investments is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan's net appreciation in fair value of investments was \$1,692,358.

Notes Receivable From Participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid to the Plan's participants.

Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Certain investment-related Plan expenses like fees paid to those who administer and manage the funds are paid from the assets of the funds, and therefore reduce the overall return offered by the funds.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Events Occurring After Report Date: The Plan Sponsor has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between January 1, 2025 and October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible disclosure and recognition in the financial statements.

#### **NOTE 2 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the Plan provides general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan, restated effective July 1, 2011, is a participant-directed defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Plan Sponsor who will complete 1,000 hours of service within a Plan year (i.e. hired to work more than twenty hours per week). Eligible employees can become participants as soon as they commence employment. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Hands Benefits & Trust Company ("Custodian") serves as the custodian of the Plan assets and Benefits Plans Administrative Services ("BPAS") serves as the recordkeeper as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Effective July 1, 2016 the Plan was amended to include an auto enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Auto-enrolled employees are enrolled to defer 2% of eligible compensation. Contributions are automatically invested in a qualified default investment alternative until changed by the participant.

Contributions: Each year, participants may contribute to the Plan a percentage of eligible compensation (defined in the Plan document as W-2 wages plus elective deferrals, excluding bonus compensation) or in specific dollar amounts. In addition, the Plan allows participants to designate a portion of their contributions to be treated as "Roth" contributions. A contribution treated as a Roth contribution is subject to current federal income tax at the time it is contributed to the Plan. However, if certain requirements are satisfied prior to the distribution of such amounts from the Plan, distributions of amounts attributable to Roth contributions (including earnings thereon) will not be subject to federal income tax at the time of distribution. Participant contributions other than those treated as Roth contributions are excluded from the participants' federal taxable income until received as withdrawals or distributions from the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts distributed from other qualified plans.

All contributions are subject to certain limitations. Employees may elect to defer a maximum amount not to exceed \$23,000 (the annual threshold as established by the IRS) for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024. In addition, participants who attained age 50 by December 31 were eligible to make an additional catch-up deferral of \$7,500 for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan provided for employer discretionary contributions of 3% of eligible participants' gross salaries. Employer discretionary contributions are approved by the Board of the Plan Sponsor. In order to participate in the employer discretionary contributions, an employee must have one year of service with at least 1,000 hours. Employees who normally work under 20 hours per week are not eligible to participate in the Plan. Employer discretionary contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 were \$338,872, net of forfeitures of \$15,519.

Participant Accounts: The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with each participant's contribution and earnings, and an allocation of any employer discretionary contributions and administrative expenses. As a participant-directed plan, each participant's investment choices determine his/her share of earnings or losses.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. In addition, they are 100% vested in their shares of employer contributions after three years if they are hired on or after March 26, 2003. Those participants who were hired prior to March 26, 2003 are 100% vested in their shares of employer contributions after two years. Each employee must complete 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year to be credited with a year of service. Participants shall become fully vested upon death.

Forfeited Accounts: When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the non-vested portion of the participant's account represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures in each Plan year are used to pay any reasonable Plan expenses or reduce employer contributions for the Plan year. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were new forfeitures of \$15,519, all of which were used to offset employer contributions during 2024. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$489 and \$19, respectively, of forfeitures remaining.

Investment Options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct BPAS to invest contributions in various investment options managed by the Custodian, its affiliates, and other large investment management companies. Participants may change their investment options, transfer part or all of past investments to other funds, and change their deferral percentages at any time.

Notes receivable from participants: BPAS offers collateral loans to participants. Such loans are made outside of Plan assets. Such loans do not reduce the participants' account balances since they are made directly with BPAS. The loans are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts, and bear interest at rates ranging between 4.25% and 8.50%. The collateral amount of the loans is reported as notes receivable from participants in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Deemed Distributions: When a participant fails to make loan repayments under the terms of the loan agreement, the loan is considered to be in default. A loan in default is considered a distribution from the Plan (deemed distribution) that would result in taxable income to the participant. However, until the participant either repays the loan or formally requests that BPAS distribute it out, the balance will remain in notes receivable from participants. Upon the occurrence of a qualifying event (as defined by the IRS and the Plan document), defaulted loans will be offset against the participant's account balance and removed from receivables. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$61,011 and \$65,995, respectively, of outstanding loans represent defaulted loans (deemed distributions for which the participant was taxed through an IRS Form 1099-R).

In-Service Withdrawals: In-service or hardship withdrawals are permitted by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits: Participants receive the full amount in their accounts when their employment terminates due to death, disability, or normal retirement. Terminations due to any other reasons only entitle the participants to receive the vested percentage of their account balances. Under the terms of the Plan, participants are eligible for normal retirement upon reaching age 65. Participants must start receiving required minimum distributions of benefits by April 1<sup>st</sup> following the year in which they reach the age of 73, even if they are still employed by the Plan Sponsor. Participants can elect to receive retirement benefits through lump-sum distributions or installments. In addition, the Plan will make a mandatory distribution of a participant's vested account balance following severance from employment if the amount is less than or equal to \$7,000.

A participant may receive a distribution up to \$5,000 during the 1-year period beginning on the date on which the Participant's child is born or on which the legal adoption by the Participant of an eligible adoptee is finalized. An eligible adoptee is any individual (other than a child of the Participant's spouse) who has not attained age 18 or is physically or mentally incapable of self-support. The \$5,000 maximum is an aggregate amount of such distributions from all plans maintained by the Employer.

Plan Amendments: The Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to amend the Plan at any time. The Plan was last amended in June 2024, with an effective date of July 1, 2024, to add union provisions to the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor has until the 2026 Plan year to amend the Plan to include mandatory and any voluntary SECURE Act and SECURE 2.0 Act provisions.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan's termination, participants will become one hundred percent vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed pursuant to the Plan document.

#### NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

Investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the Custodian.

#### NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting standards establish a framework for measuring fair value, providing a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
  - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
  - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
  - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
  - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset and liability.
- Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodology used at December 31, 2024.

Mutual Funds (Registered Investment Companies): Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year-end. The NAV is based upon quoted market prices.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 - INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan Sponsor elected to adopt BPAS' prototype plan. The Plan administrator and BPAS believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the

technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**NOTE 6 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 7 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTY-IN-INTEREST**

Certain Plan investments are managed by BPAS and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments.
