Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Exchange Bank Health and Welfare Benefit Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Exchange Bank Health and Welfare Benefit Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Exchange Bank Health and Welfare Benefit Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 – The Plan and Its Significant Accounting Policies

General – The following description of the Exchange Bank Health and Welfare Benefit Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a health and welfare plan adopted by Exchange Bank (the Company). The Plan is an HRA plan, in which participants are designated a specific share of plan funds in which they can claim reimbursements for medical, dental, vision, and prescription drug premiums. The Plan is designed to comply and operate in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan expenses – The Plan Sponsor manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Third-party administrators process claims for the Plan. The Company pays substantially all administrative expenses of the Plan.

Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Basis of accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with GAAP.

Health reimbursement arrangement – The Plan solely consists of a health reimbursement arrangement (HRA). Each retiree who was eligible to participate in the Plan was credited with a one-time fixed dollar amount into their HRA account. The amount credited to each retiree's account was the actuarial present value of future benefits under the terms of the Plan multiplied by a fraction. The fraction's numerator was equal to \$6 million and the denominator was equal to the sum of all retirees' individually determined actuarial present values of future benefits. No more than the original \$6 million in funding is planned to be provided to the Plan.

Investment valuation and investment income – The Plan's investments are valued at fair value. The Plan's custodian, The Exchange Bank, certifies the fair market value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned.

Subsequent events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 2 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

Exchange Bank Health and Welfare Benefit Plan Notes to Financial Statements

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest-bearing cash – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The fund is required to publish its daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

The methodology described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methodology is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 3 – Contributions

Participants do not contribute to the Plan. In addition, no future employer contributions are planned to be made.

Note 4 – Participation

Retirees (as defined below), their spouses, and their domestic partners are eligible to participate in the Plan. Only the person who is a retiree's spouse or domestic partner as of the retiree's retirement date is eligible to participate in the Plan. Further, if a retiree dies while a participant of the Plan, their spouse or domestic partner may continue to participate in the Plan, provided that the HRA account has a positive balance at the time of the retiree's death.

Retirees are defined in the Plan Document as former employees who meet the following requirements:

1. The former employee is a "grandfathered employee." A "grandfathered employee" means, as of December 31, 2007, the former employee was either (i) an active employee of the Company with 15 years of continuous service, or (ii) an active employee of the company whose age plus years of continuous service equaled at least 60; and
2. The former employee was an active employee of the Company on June 30, 2003; and
3. The former employee was covered as an active employee participant under the Exchange Bank Group Health and Welfare Plan on the day before his or her retirement date; and
4. The former employee attained the age of 55 with at least 15 years of continuous service on or before his or her retirement date; and
5. The former employee was not terminated for misconduct.

Spouses, dependent children, and domestic partners losing eligibility under the Plan due to a COBRA qualifying event will be entitled to continue Plan coverage under COBRA or a COBRA-like continuation of coverage.

Note 5 – Tax Status

The Plan received a ruling dated August 28, 1992, from Internal Revenue Service stating that the trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's net assets is qualified pursuant to Section 501(c)(9) of the Code. Accordingly, the trust is exempt from most state and federal income taxes. The Plan has since been amended. The plan administrator believes that the Plan, as amended, is designed and continues to be operated in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Code.

Although the Plan for retirees and the related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Code, and the trust is exempt from most federal income taxes, investment income of the trust holding the assets is considered to constitute unrelated business income. This income subjects the trust to federal unrelated business income tax.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no deferred tax liabilities or assets.

Plan management evaluates tax positions taken and recognizes a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. No uncertain positions have been identified that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 – Benefit Obligations

Effective November 1, 2021, the postretirement benefit obligation represents the present value of the sum of the HRA balances, plus the actuarially determined value of benefits for certain executives that will be paid from Bank assets outside the VEBA.

A discount rate of 5.70% and 5.10% was used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Future years' costs were assumed not to increase in the following years. If the assumed health care cost trend rate increased by 1%, the Plan's December 31, 2024 and 2023, postretirement benefit obligation would not increase or decrease as the Plan obligation has an overall cap that is unaffected by plan experience or assumptions.

Note 7 – Certified Investment Information

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Exchange Bank, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Interest and dividend income reflected on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.
- Schedule of reportable transactions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 8 – Risks and Uncertainties

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentration of credit risk consist of interest-bearing cash in a Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured sweep account. This sweep account may include balances in excess of FDIC limits of \$250,000. The Plan Sponsor closely monitors these balances and has not experienced any credit losses.

Note 9 – Transactions with Parties In Interest

The Company is the Plan sponsor, trustee, and administrator of the Plan. Transactions with this entity qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 10 – Plan Termination or Modification

The Plan Sponsor reserves the right to terminate or modify the Plan at any time and subject to the provisions of ERISA. Any remaining undistributed funds are to be disposed of for the benefit of covered individuals. In the event that benefits due and payable exceed available funds, the Plan Sponsor will contribute to the Plan such amounts as may be necessary to ensure continuance of such benefit payments. No assets of the Plan may revert to the Plan Sponsor or be used for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan's participants.
