1. PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following brief description of The Ivymount School and Programs 403(b) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of The Ivymount School, Inc., Ivymount Corporation and Ivymount Outreach Programs, Inc. (collectively, the School). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the date of their employment with the School. The Plan was effective on September 1, 1986 and was last amended on January 1, 2010. The Plan qualifies under the Internal Revenue Code as a 403(b) Plan. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

An employee is eligible to participate in the elective deferral portion of the Plan on his or her date of hire. There is no minimum age an employee must attain to become a participant in the Plan for purposes of making voluntary deferrals.

Contributions

The Plan provides for employer and employee contributions. Elective deferrals may be made up to the lesser of 100% of compensation or the maximum percentage of compensation or dollar amount permissible by law (\$23,000 and \$22,500 in December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 in December 31, 2024 and 2023. Participants may also make rollover contributions from other plans or IRAs. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Employees are allotted a specified amount to cover benefits. Participants may allocate the specified amount between health benefits and 403(b) plan contributions. The exact percentage is determined by the participant. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, no employer contributions were made to the Plan.

Rollovers from Other Plans

A participant who has received a distribution of his or her interest from another qualified retirement plan may elect to deposit all or any portion of the distribution into the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the current year contributions and allocations of Plan earnings (and losses), and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Investments in the Plan are participant directed. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in employer and employee contributions plus earnings.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance of the participant's account. The loans bear interest at a reasonable rate as of the time of application. Principal and interest are paid in level payments not less than quarterly. The loans may be immediately due and payable upon termination of employment or failure to make a payment as provided in the loan agreement

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account, or an annuity for the life of the participant or beneficiary. Upon termination for any other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures will be used to reduce future employer contributions.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Method of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment contracts with an insurance company which are held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The statements of net assets available for benefits presents the fair value of the investment contracts equal to the contract value since the value of the unallocated group annuity contracts is derived from the contract provisions. The statements of changes in net assets available for benefits are also prepared using the contract value basis for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments, other than insurance company annuity contracts, are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments. The contract value for insurance company annuity contracts is derived from the contract provisions; thus, fair value is reported as the contract value, which is the sum of contributions and earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan, such as the audit and accounting fees, are paid directly by the School and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the notes receivable obtained by the participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Administrative expenses for the insurance company annuity contracts are paid by the Plan and allocated among the participants investing in these contracts. Mutual fund expenses are typically included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments and are not reported as administrative expenses in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

All of the investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, including investments held at year-end, net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest on notes receivable from participants were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the trustees.

5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). If the inputs used to measure the financial instruments fall within different levels of the hierarchy, the categorization is based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement of the instruments. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - These are investments where values are based on unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in an active market that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - These are investments where values are based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or model inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full-term of the investments.

Level 3 - These are investments where values are based on prices or valuation techniques that require inputs that are both unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement. These inputs reflect assumptions from management about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the investments. These investments include non-readily marketable securities that do not have an active market.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Annuity contracts: insurance company annuity contracts are valued at contract value which represents contributions and earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

6. INSURANCE COMPANY ANNUITY CONTRACTS

The Plan has two benefit-responsive investment contracts: the Lincoln Stable Value Account and the Multi-Fund Fixed Account. The Lincoln Stable Value Account is a group fixed annuity contract issued by Lincoln National Life Insurance Company (Lincoln) for contracts sold outside of New York. The Lincoln Stable Value Account has crediting rates based on an external index that are backed by the general account of Lincoln.

Participants have a beneficial interest in the group annuity contracts. The value of the group annuity contracts is derived from the contract provisions, which is backed by the general account of Lincoln. The contract value represents the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate a transaction under the terms of the Plan. The contract value equals the sum of the contributions plus interest credited less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may choose to take a benefit distribution in the form of an annuity.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Interest is credited daily on an actual basis. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Multi-Fund Fixed Account's crediting interest rate was 4.5% for both years, which is also the minimum guaranteed rate. For both years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the interest rate credited to participants for the Lincoln Stable Value Account was 4.5%. The minimum guaranteed rate for the Lincoln Stable Value Account was 1.75%.

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6. INSURANCE COMPANY ANNUITY CONTRACTS (CONTINUED)

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan's sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (d) a material misrepresentation. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their account balance. Any unallocated assets of the Plan would be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the School may determine.

8. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Lincoln National Life Insurance Company and Wilmington Trust, the Plan's trustees and investment custodians. Transactions for these investments qualify as party-in interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the mutual funds are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan made direct payments to Lincoln National Life Insurance Company for other investment services totaling \$55,038 and \$46,385, respectively. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

9. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the School that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the

9. TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there is currently no audit for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

10. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.
