Note 1 Description of Plan

The following description of United Steel Workers of America (“USWA”) Savings Program – Pencor Services, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information purposes. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time collective bargaining employees of the Company. The plan trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan’s plan administrator.

Eligibility Requirements

Employees are eligible to participate in the plan after they have completed at least four months of service within their first four months of employment. Employees except those who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement with the Employer and United Steelworkers of America Local Union 6441.

Contributions

Participants may elect to make contributions to the Plan not to exceed Internal Revenue Service limitations (\$23,000 for 2024 and \$22,500 for 2023). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions (up to \$7,500 for 2024 and 2023). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 1 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant.

The Company’s matching contribution to the plan are defined by the collective bargaining agreement (the “Agreement, see the agreement for specific details). Per the Agreement the Company will contribute 2% of the participants’ quarterly gross pay including overtime for those participants who contribute at least 1% or less to the Plan. For those employees who do not contribute to the Plan, the Company will contribute 1.5% of the participant’s quarterly gross pay including overtime to the Plan. Additionally, the Company will make a matching contribution to the Plan equal to 50% of the participants’ plan contribution not to exceed 13% of the participant’s quarterly gross pay including overtime. The total Company’s matching additional contribution will not be greater than 6.5% of the participants’ annual wage. The maximum Company liability is 8.5% (2% Company contribution plus the additional 6.5% Company match = 8.5%). The Company’s total contribution was \$510,258 and \$349,348 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 1 Nature of Activities (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's elective and rollover contribution, as well as the allocation of the Company's contributions and plan earnings, net of plan administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may change their self-directed investment options anytime.

Vesting

Participants are 100 percent vested immediately in their contributions and Company contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, less any outstanding loans. Participants are allowed to have one outstanding loans at any time. Note receivable terms extend to a period not to exceed five years, or more if used for the purchase of a principal residence. At December 31, 2024, interest rates ranged from 5.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deduction.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Additionally, participants who are still employed may make hardship withdrawals as defined by the IRS from their salary deferral account balance. Employees age 59 ½ may withdraw any portion of their vested account balance. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Hardship Withdrawals

Hardship Withdrawals are permitted under certain defined conditions.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. As a practical expedient, the fair value of the collective investment trust fund is estimated using the net asset value (“NAV”) per share of the fund. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases are recorded on a trade date basis, and sales of securities are recorded on the settlement date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The net returns from investment activity include realized and unrealized gains and losses from investment activity of the plan's assets. Unrealized gains and losses are calculated as the difference between the current value of investments as of the end of the Plan year and either the current value at the end of the preceding year or the actual cost if such investments were purchased during the current year. Realized gains or losses on sales of investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and the current value of the investments at the beginning of the year or the actual cost of such investments were purchased during the year.

Employer and Employee Contribution Receivables

Employee contribution receivables are recorded when amounts have been withheld from employees prior to the end of the year but were not remitted to the plan until the subsequent year. Employer contribution receivable represents the Company's contribution to the Plan that was not paid until the subsequent period.

Plan Transfers

Amount represents transfers between the Plan and other related qualified plans. The Company is an affiliate of a parent company and at times participants move employment between the company and the parent and/or other related subsidiaries and affiliates of the parent company. Amounts transferred follow all plan and legal requirements. Transfers to the plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$58,908 and transfers from the plan for the same period totaled \$117,782. The balance is shown as transfers, net on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained a certification from Transamerica Trust Company (“TTC”) in which they certified that the statements furnished for the specified period, pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-5 is complete and accurate reflection of Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC’s business records. The information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and the supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest, and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained or derived from information supplied from and certified by TTC, the custodian, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

Note 4 Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Investments measured at NAV – consist of collective trusts and are valued at the NAV of units of collective investment trusts. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of a collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Collective Investment Trust

The Reliance Trust Company Stable Value Collective Investment Trust (“RT CIT”) is a collective investment trust fund managed by Metropolitan Life Insurance Company (MetLife) and the trustee Reliance Trust Company. The RT CIT invests in the MetLife Group Annuity Contract 25053, which invests in the MetLife separate accounts (the “separate account”) the objective of RT CIT is to provide competitive total returns relative to Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index.

Events outside the normal operations of the RT CIT that cause a withdrawal from an investment contract may result in a negative market value adjustment, which can limit the ability to transact at contract value with the issuers of its investment contracts. Examples of such events include, but are not limited to, partial or complete legal termination of the Fund or a unit holder, tax disqualification of the Fund or a unit holder, and certain Fund amendments if issuers’ consents are not obtained. According to the Fund’s annual report, as of December 31, 2024, the occurrence of such an event is not considered to be probable.

Participants may redeem trust units on a daily basis for withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at the assets underlying contract value (NAV) without restriction. The NAV per unit is computed by dividing the total fair value of the assets, less its liabilities, by the total number of units outstanding at the time of such computation. Investment income earned is reinvested in each and included in the determination of unit values.

Note 5 Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at the end of the collective bargaining agreement and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Note 6 Related Party and Parties-in-Interest Transactions

During the course of the year, the Plan entered into certain party-in-interest transactions with TTC, who serve as fund custodian. The Plan also has several service providers in which administrative fees (Note 2) are paid for services provided. As such, transactions in these investments and for services provided qualify as party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services and auditing services are included in administrative expenses.

In addition, notes receivable from participants, as disclosed in the statements of net assets available for benefits, qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 7 Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 Prohibited Transactions

As reported on Schedule H, part IV, line 4a, Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, certain participant contributions were not remitted to the Plan within the timeframe specified by the Department of Labor’s Regulation 29 CFR 2510.53-102, thus constituting non-exempt transactions between the Plan and the Company.

Delinquent Participant contributions, remitted to the Plan exceeding the time allowed by the DOL to be reasonably segregated from the Company’s assets, are as follows at December 31, 2024:

Note 9 Risks and Uncertainties

Investments are subject to market volatility, which could have a material effect on participant accounts. The Plan provides for various investment options. These investment options are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment options and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment options, it is reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participant’s accounts balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.
