### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Dubow Textile 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

**NOTE A DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Dubow Textile 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a single-employer defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Dubow Textile, Inc. (the Company). An eligible employee begins to participate in the pre and/or post tax salary deferral contribution, discretionary employer matching contribution, and discretionary nonelective contribution of the Plan on the first day of the first month after the attainment of age eighteen and completion of sixty days of service, as defined in the Plan document. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participant contributions may not exceed an amount greater than that permitted by the Secretary of the Treasury under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), as defined in the Plan document. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may, at the discretion of the Plan Administrator, also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). The Company contributes a discretionary employer matching contribution for each participant who makes a pre and/or post salary deferral contribution during the Plan year, have completed sixty days eligible service, and have attained the age of eighteen. The discretionary employer matching contribution is equal to one hundred percent of the first three percent of compensation of the participant's pre and/or post salary deferral contributions for the Plan year. Additional discretionary nonelective contributions may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. There were no discretionary nonelective contributions made to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. The assets of the Plan, both employee and employer, are allocated to various investment options at the direction of the participant. Several investment options are available for the investment of participants' elective contributions, discretionary employer matching contribution, and discretionary nonelective contributions. Participants may change their investment options on a daily basis. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contributions, and allocations of (a) the Company's discretionary employer matching contribution and discretionary nonelective contributions, and (b) Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary pre and/or post tax salary deferral contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary employer matching and discretionary nonelective contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on vesting years of service and is determined as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants

In accordance with the Plan document, Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at one percent above the prime rate. Loan terms range from one to five years or up to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence, with no prepayment penalty. The maximum number of loans outstanding that a participant may have is one. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Plan Administration

Plan assets are managed by the Plan custodian, who is a party in interest. Plan fees are paid from forfeitures and by the participants via a reduction of Plan assets.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or for termination of service due to other reasons, if a participant's account balance is \$5,000 or less, a lump-sum cash payment may be made in the amount of the participant's vested account without the participant's consent. If the value is greater than \$5,000, a participant's account may be paid out in the form of substantially equal installments, rollover to another qualified retirement plan, or lump-sum payment.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of non-vested Company contributions are used to offset the discretionary employer matching contributions or to pay plan fees. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts total \$209 and \$4, respectively. During 2024, \$59,928 of forfeited non-vested accounts were used to reduce Company discretionary employer matching contributions.

**NOTE B SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Contributions

Plan participant, discretionary employer matching, and discretionary nonelective contributions are recorded in the year in which the contributions are withheld from employee compensation.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Sponsor's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recognized on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gain and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. In the event of default, notes receivable from participants are reportable to Plan participants as taxable income but remain outstanding and continue to accrue interest until repaid by the Plan participant or the participant becomes eligible to receive a distribution under the terms of the Plan. The Plan Administrator has concluded that these loans are not plan assets and that such arrangements are exempt transactions. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Plan expenses, such as audit fees, accounting fees, legal fees, and trustee administrative fees are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Certain employees and officers of the Plan Sponsor, who are also participants in the Plan, perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan.

Income Taxes

In accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 740, *Uncertainty in Income Taxes*, Plan management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The Plan is open and subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state, and local tax authorities, generally for three years after the filing date. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examination for years prior to 2021.

Subsequent Events

In accordance with FASB ASC Topic 855, *Subsequent Events*, the Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued, and have determined there are no subsequent events that require recognition or disclosure.

**NOTE C FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:
  - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
  - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
  - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
  - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant of the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds:* Valued using the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in changes in net assets for the year ended December 31, 2024 are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE D PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their entire account. Any unallocated assets (non-vested forfeiture accounts) of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Plan Sponsor may determine.

**NOTE E TAX STATUS**

The Plan adopted a standardized form of a prototype plan sponsored by DST Retirement Solution, LLC, the third-party administrator. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS stating that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and tax-exempt.

**NOTE F RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and those changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. The value, liquidity, and related income of securities held are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market’s perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has investments of \$1,939,290 and \$1,963,499, that are concentrated in four and five funds, respectively.

**NOTE G INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN**
