December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Inotiv, Inc. Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

- A) **General**--The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of the Company who have met certain service requirements. Eligibility for employee participation and employer contribution is 90 days of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Plan management oversees governance of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.
- B) **Contributions**--Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participant contributions are limited to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trusts, and an insurance investment contract as investment options for participants. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate, with a default deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation. Contributions are automatically invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Plan features an auto-escalation of 1% on July 1 every year with a maximum of 10%.

The Company contributes 50% on the first 6% of the participant's elective contributions. Effective April 19, 2024, employer match has been temporarily suspended, with notice appropriately provided to all Plan participants.

The Company also has the option to contribute a discretionary contribution allocated among eligible participants in the ratio that each eligible participant's compensation bears to the total compensation paid to all eligible participants for the contribution period.

Contributions are subject to certain statutory limitations.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

- C) **Participant Accounts**--Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's matching contribution and, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.
- D) **Vesting**--Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, employer contributions, and the earnings thereon.
- E) **Notes Receivable From Participants**--Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear an interest rate at prime plus 1% at the date of issuance, which range from 4.25% to 9.50%, and are commensurate with local prevailing rates, and mature within 5 years unless the loan qualifies as a home loan. The term for a home loan will be 20 years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.
- F) **Payment of Benefits**--On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the participant's account by: full lump-sum payment, partial lump-sum payment, rollover, annuity or systematic withdrawals. Hardship withdrawals, as defined in the Plan, are permitted prior to reaching age 59 $\frac{1}{2}$.
- G) **Forfeited Accounts**--At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$1,104 and \$68, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions. Also, in 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$120 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A) **Basis of Accounting**--The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would normally receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

- B) **Expenses**--Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

- C) **Use of Estimates**--The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

- D) **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**--Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

- E) **Payment of Benefits**--Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

F) Notes Receivable from Participants--Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

NOTE 3: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants are 100% vested in their individual accounts.

NOTE 4: INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan Administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 5: CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including all investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company (the trustee of the Plan).

NOTE 6: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no Plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented and there were no changes in the methods used to measure fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- A. Level 1--The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.
- B. Level 2--The fair value of Common Collective Trust funds is based on the market price of underlying investments. These funds are valued based on the net asset value (NAV) reported by the fund at the end of each day, which represents the fair value of the plan's interest in the underlying assets. The underlying investments within the trust consist of a diversified portfolio of publicly traded equities, real estate, and fixed-income securities.

Gains and losses included in changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

The Plan's policy is to recognize transfers into or out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no transfers into or out of Level 3.

NOTE 7: GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Prudential). Prudential maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract meets the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value.

Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Prudential, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$1,048,626 and \$2,754,471, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

Certain events might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Prudential. Such events include the following: a) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, c) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

During a prior plan year, the Company initiated plans to liquidate the Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund. The Fund's interest will be liquidated in two annual installments dated July 6, 2024 and July 6, 2025. Effective July 5, 2023, no further contributions or transfers were allowed into the Fund.

As of December 31, 2023, the Plan was also in a contract with a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company. The contract value was \$6,074,275. Effective April 1, 2024, the entire balance was liquidated and transferred into the Vanguard Money Market Fund.

NOTE 8: RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity). Fidelity is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services amounted to \$246,108 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 9: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective February 2, 2025, employer match was partially re-instated to 50% of employee contributions up to 1% of eligible compensation.

Effective July 6, 2025 (the second of two installments per Note 7), the Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund has been liquidated and all funds transferred into mutual funds of the Plan.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Inotiv, Inc. Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

- A) **Merger**--Effective November 1, 2023, Envigo 401(k) Plan merged with Inotiv, Inc. Retirement Plan. All of its' Plan assets, including loans and investments, were transferred on October 31, 2023.
- B) **General**--The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of the Company who have met certain service requirements. Eligibility for employee participation and employer contribution is 90 days of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Plan management oversees governance of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.
- C) **Contributions**--Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participant contributions are limited to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and an insurance investment contract as investment options for participants. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate, with a default deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation. Contributions are automatically invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Plan features an auto-escalation of 1% on July 1 every year with a maximum of 10%. The Company contributes 50% on the first 6% of the participant's elective contributions. The Company also has the option to contribute a discretionary contribution allocated among eligible participants in the ratio that each eligible participant's compensation bears to the total compensation paid to all eligible participants for the contribution period.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

- D) **Participant Accounts**--Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's matching contribution and, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.
- E) **Vesting**--Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, employer contributions, and the earnings thereon.
- F) **Notes Receivable From Participants**--Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear an interest rate at prime plus 1% at the date of issuance, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates, and mature within 5 years unless the loan qualifies as a home loan. The term for a home loan will be 20 years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.
- G) **Payment of Benefits**--On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive the value of the participant's account by: full lump-sum payment, partial lump-sum payment, rollover, annuity or systematic withdrawals. Hardship withdrawals, as defined in the Plan, are permitted prior to reaching age 59 ½.
- H) **Forfeited Accounts**--At December 31, 2023 and September 30, 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$68 and \$-0-, respectively. During the merger of Envigo 401(k) Plan effective November 1, 2023, \$1,125 of forfeited funds was transferred into the Inotiv, Inc. Retirement Plan. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions. Also, in 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$1,196 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

- A) **Basis of Accounting**--The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would normally receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

- B) **Operating Expenses**--Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

- C) **Estimates**--The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

- D) **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**--Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

- E) **Payment of Benefits**--Benefits are recorded when paid.

F) Notes Receivable from Participants--Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2023 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan payments and the Plan Administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

NOTE 3: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants are 100% vested in their individual accounts.

NOTE 4: INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan Administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 5: CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including all investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2023 and September 30, 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company and Principal Trust Company (the trustees of the Plan)..

NOTE 6: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 3 inputs for the periods presented and there were no changes in the methods used to measure fair value at December 31, 2023 and September 30, 2023.

- A. Level 1--The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.
- B. Level 2--The fair value of Common Collective Trust funds is based on the market price of underlying investments. These funds are valued based on the net asset value (NAV) reported by the fund at the end of each day, which represents the fair value of the plan's interest in the underlying assets. The underlying investments within the trust consist of a diversified portfolio of publicly traded equities, real estate, and fixed-income securities.

Gains and losses included in changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended and September 30, 2024 and 2023, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments. The Plan's policy is to recognize transfers into or out of Level 3 as of the date of the event or change in circumstances that caused the transfer. For the year ended December 31, 2023, there were no transfers into or out of Level 3.

NOTE 7: GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANIES

The Plan has entered into two traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contracts, one with Principal Life Insurance Company, a member of the Principal Financial Group (Principal), and Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. Principal and Prudential maintain the contributions in general accounts. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuers are contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contracts meet the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contracts. The guaranteed investment contracts are presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value.

NOTE 7: GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANIES (Continued)

Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal and Prudential, represents contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the Principal investment contract at December 31, 2023 and September 30, 2023 was \$6,074,275 and \$6,277,433, respectively. The contract value of the Prudential investment contract at December 31, 2023 is \$2,754,471. The Prudential investment contract was transferred into the Plan during the merger of Envigo 401(k) Plan as described in Note 1A. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuers. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

Certain events might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Principal or Prudential. Such events include the following: a) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, c) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contracts do not permit the insurance companies to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

During a previous Plan year, the Company initiated plans to liquidate the Principal Guaranteed Income Fund. Plan management elected 12-Month Advance Notice so the Plan's interest will be liquidated on March 29, 2024. Effective June 9, 2023, no further contributions or transfers were allowed into the Fund.

Before merging with Inotiv, Inc. Retirement Plan, plan management of Envigo 401(k) Plan initiated plans to liquidate the Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund. The Plan's interest will be liquidated in two annual installments dated July 6, 2024 and July 6, 2025. Effective July 5, 2023, no further contributions or transfers were allowed into the Fund.

NOTE 8: RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, and the Principal Guaranteed Income Fund is managed by the Principal Trust Company. These entities are trustees as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services amounted to \$17,459 for the year ended December 31, 2023. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 9: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective March 29, 2024 the Principal Guaranteed Income Fund has been liquidated and all funds transferred into mutual funds of the Plan. Effective July 6, 2024 and 2025 (two installments per Note 7), the Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund has been liquidated and all funds transferred into mutual funds of the Plan.

Effective April 19, 2024, Plan management elected to suspend discretionary employer contributions for the foreseeable future.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.
