Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Quorum Health Barstow Community Hospital Standard 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF AND FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Quorum Health Barstow Community Hospital Standard 401k Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions. QHCCS, LLC (the “Company”), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Quorum Health Corporation (“QHC”), is the sponsor of the Plan (“Plan Sponsor”).

General—The Plan is a defined contribution plan and covers employees of the Hospital of Barstow, Inc. (d/b/a Barstow Community Hospital) who have three months of service and whose benefits are subject to one or more collective bargaining agreements (including agreements that have terminated but remain subject to negotiation) between the Hospital of Barstow, Inc. and the California Nurses Association/National Nurses Organizing Committee, or an employee of the Hospital of Barstow, Inc. for whom a collective bargaining unit representative of the California Nurses Association/National Nurses Organizing Committee has been certified with respect to which bargaining towards an initial collective bargaining agreement has commenced (“participants”). There is no age requirement in order to participate in the Plan.

Employees who are not eligible to participate in the Plan include certain non-resident aliens, leased employees, residents of Puerto Rico and employees who are eligible to participate in other retirement plans maintained by the Company that are intended to be qualified under Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”) Section 401(a) that also provide for a cash-or-deferred arrangement or contain a qualified Roth contribution arrangement. The Retirement Committee, which consists of members approved by the Board of Directors of the Company (the “Administrator”), controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan.

Contributions—Each participant may elect to defer compensation, as defined in the Plan, by up to 50%, not to exceed the maximum amount as determined by the Code. Participants may also contribute amounts representing after tax contributions (“Roth contributions”) or distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan provides for a discretionary employer matching contribution.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed a discretionary amount equal to 100% of the first 1% and 50% of the next 5% of eligible employee contributions. Catch up contributions are not subject to matching contributions. Plan Sponsor contributions may not exceed the maximum amount allowable for federal income tax purposes.

Participant Accounts—Each participant’s account is credited (charged) with the participant’s contributions, allocations of Plan Sponsor contributions, investment earnings (losses) and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances as defined in the plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Investment Options—Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions to the Plan are invested by the Trustee according to the participant’s instructions in one or a combination of several fund options. Participants may change their investment elections or initiate transfers between funds by giving notice to the Trustee. The Plan currently offers a variety of mutual funds and collective investment trusts as investment options for participants.

Vesting—Participants are vested immediately in their participant contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in Plan Sponsor discretionary matching contributions is based on years of service. Termination of participation in the Plan prior to the scheduled vesting period for a reason other than death, disability, or retirement results in forfeiture of the unvested portion of the participant’s account balance.

Vesting is according to the terms of the Plan document and follows a five-year graded schedule as follows:

Notes Receivable from Participants—Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at fixed rates ranging from 6.50% to 9.50%, which was commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator at the time the loan was taken. Principal and interest are collected ratably through payroll deductions. The duration of the loans range between 6-60 months for general loans and 12-120 months for residential loans.

Payment of Benefits—Distributions from the Plan are permitted upon a participant’s death, disability or retirement. In addition, certain payments are permitted if a participant terminates employment for any other reason. On termination of service, if a participant’s vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant may generally elect to receive a single, lump-sum payment or installments over a period of time not to exceed the participant’s assumed life expectancy. Account balances that do not exceed \$5,000 generally may only be distributed as a lump-sum payment. In-service withdrawals are available for a participant upon attainment of age 59½.

Forfeited Accounts—Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment prior to becoming fully vested in the Company contribution portion of their accounts. Any portion of Plan forfeitures not allocated in the Plan year in which they are forfeited (“Forfeiture Year”) may be allocated in the following Plan year to pay Plan expenses or to offset the Plan Sponsor contributions for the Forfeiture Year. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$41,499 and \$23,860, respectively, of which \$600 was used to pay plan expenses during 2024.

Hardship Withdrawals—The Plan permits distributions in the event of a hardship, as defined in the plan agreement. These distributions are taxable and subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant is younger than age 59½. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant’s elective account balance.

Administrative Expenses—Any expenses paid directly by the Company related to the Plan are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to maintaining the Plan, the administration of notes receivable from participants, transaction expenses, recordkeeping and investment management services are charged directly to the participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses.

Plan Termination—Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the plan agreement to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting—The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition—Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s Retirement Committee determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by its third-party investment advisors. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants—Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits—Benefits are recorded when paid.

Transfers—The Company sponsors other defined contribution plans in which participants of this Plan may become eligible participants. Similarly, participants in the other Company defined contribution plans may become eligible to participate in this Plan. In such situations, the employees’ respective participant accounts are transferred to or from these other plans sponsored by the Company. For the year ended December 31, 2024, plan transfers reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits received from the Quorum Health 401(k) plan were \$58,881.

Use of Estimates—The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties—The Plan provides various investment options to its participants. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk, and overall market volatility. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the value of the participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Subsequent Events —The Plan has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between December 31, 2024 and October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. See Note 8 description of any subsequent events.

3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The following is a summary of the information regarding the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedules that were prepared by or derived from information prepared by Voya Institutional Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan and furnished to the Plan administrator. The Plan administrator has obtained certifications from the trustee that such information is complete and accurate.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2—Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds—Valued based on quoted prices in an active market.

Collective Investment Trusts:

Collective Investment Trust—Valued at the net asset value of units of a bank collective trust. The net asset value as provided by the trustee is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to confirm that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Stable Value Fund—A collective trust fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued at the net asset value of units of the bank collective trust. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to confirm that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

5. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. RELATED PARTY AND EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balances in the participants' accounts. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

7. NONEXEMPT PART-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Company remitted certain participant contributions and loan repayments of \$46,107 to the trustee later than required by Department of Labor (DOL) Regulation 2510.3-102. The Company will file Form 5330 with the IRS and pay the required excise tax on the transaction. In addition, participant accounts will be credited with the amount of investment income that would have been earned had the participant contribution been remitted on a timely basis.

8. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan amended the plan document to change the annual employer matching contribution to a per-pay-period matching contribution.
