Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Munck Wilson Mandala, LLP 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Plan management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Plan management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section —

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that plan management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of a Matter — Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements which describe the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental information are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than GAAP. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Plan Management for the Financial Statements

Plan management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Plan management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect plan management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, plan management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, which raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Plan management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matter - Supplemental Information Required by ERISA

The supplemental information as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The information included in the supplemental information, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental information that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental information, we evaluated whether the supplemental information, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Munck Wilson Mandala, LLP (the “Partnership”) 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Partnership who have completed three months of service and are age 21 or older. Prior service with designated employers, as defined, is recognized for eligibility, vesting and employer contributions allocation. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Executive Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the plan document. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Partnership makes a safe harbor non-elective contribution equal to three percent of each participants’ eligible compensation. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Executive Committee. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Partnership made a \$658,840 profit sharing contribution to the Plan based on the 2023 activities of the Partnership. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and the Partnership’s safe harbor non-elective contributions, as well as allocations of the Partnership’s profit-sharing contribution and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Partnership’s safe harbor non-elective contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Partnership’s discretionary profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after five years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account. The loan interest rate is set at one percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant (or named beneficiary) whose vested balance is in excess of \$5,000 may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or equal installments. A participant whose vested balance is less than \$5,000 is subject to mandatory cash out provisions as defined by the plan document.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts total \$19,716 and \$10,390, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were offset by \$21,471 from forfeited non-vested accounts and the Partnership used \$10,882 to pay plan administrative expenses.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and is an acceptable method of reporting under Department of Labor ("DOL") regulations. The modified cash basis of accounting utilizes the cash basis of accounting while carrying investments at fair value and recording investment income (loss) on the accrual basis. Consequently, contributions are recognized when received rather than when earned, and expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and the changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Executive Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and the custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan unless otherwise paid by the Partnership. Expenses that are paid by the Partnership on behalf of the Plan are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and other specific transaction fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-ended funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value funds ("SVF"): Valued at the NAV provided by the administrator of the common collective trust ("CCT"). The NAV is based on market value of the underlying assets held by the CCT less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the CCT will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. The fair market value has been established using the NAV under the practical expedient approach and therefore is not assigned to a level in the hierarchy table.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investments at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, with the exception of the SVF measured at fair value using the NAV practical expedient. The fair value for the SVF is provided below to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

5. INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan participates in a traditional investment contract, the Fixed Select Contract, with Nationwide Life Insurance Company. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The contract value of the investment contract as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, totals \$36,119 and \$1,566,993, respectively.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0.5 percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The Fixed Select Contract does not have a maturity date.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the contract issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The contract issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan) (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) premature termination of the contract (4) The failure of the trust to qualify for exemption under ERISA, (5) bankruptcy of the Partnership or other partnership events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants. In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines (2) breach of material obligation under the contract (3) a material misrepresentation (4) a material amendment to the agreements without consent of the issue.

6. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are issued and managed by Nationwide. Nationwide is the custodian as defined by the plan document and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in both administrative expenses and net depreciation in fair value of investments.

Plan transactions and records are administered by InWest Retirement Solutions (“InWest”). InWest is the record keeper of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for recordkeeping services are included in administrative expenses.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Partnership has the right under the plan document to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer profit sharing contributions.

8. TAX STATUS

Plan management adopted a prototype plan offered by InWest. The IRS has determined and informed InWest by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Although the Plan has been amended since InWest received the determination letter, plan management believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The modified cash basis of accounting requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan, disclose within the footnotes to the financials any potential impact to the Plan, and recognize a tax liability at the Partnership level if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing jurisdictions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

10. RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500

11. OPERATIONAL ERRORS

During the 2023, 2022, and 2021 audits, it was determined that participant match calculations incorrectly excluded section 125 wages from eligible compensation for certain participants as a result of an operational error. Plan management believes it meets the requirements for correction under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System. As of the date of issuance of these financial statements, plan management is in the process of determining the corrective actions needed as required by IRS.

12. NONEXEMPT PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

As reported on the supplemental Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions (Schedule H, Line 4a), certain participant contributions totaling \$125,060 were not remitted to Nationwide within the time frame specified by the DOL's Regulation 29 (CFR 2510.3 – 102), thus constituting nonexempt prohibited transactions between the Plan and the Partnership for the year ended December 31, 2024. Plan management believes it meets the eligibility requirements under the DOL's Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program. As of the date of issuance of these financial statements, plan management has yet to determine all of the necessary corrective actions under the DOL's Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program, however, they plan to have them executed by December 31, 2025.

13. SUBSEQUENT EVENT

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there were no items to disclose.
