Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed audit of the financial statements of the Navian Capital, LLC 401(k) P/S Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Navian Capital, LLC 401(k) P/S Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. More complete information regarding the Plan’s provisions may be found in the Plan document.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Navian Capital, LLC, (the “Company”) under the provision of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”), which includes a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. All employees are eligible to participate once they have one month of service and attain the age of 21, as defined. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”). The Plan was originally adopted January 1, 2008, but has been amended subsequent to that date.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each of the Plan’s participants to reflect the participant’s contributions, employer matching contributions and related allocation of profit-sharing contributions, forfeitures of terminated participants non-vested accounts, charged with an allocation of administrative expenses and debited with withdrawals, as well as the participant’s share of the Plan’s income and any related administrative expenses. Allocations of income and expenses are based on the proportion that each participant’s account balance bears to the total of all participant account balances.

Contributions

Eligible employees can contribute in any amount up to the maximum percentage of compensation and dollar amount as defined by the Plan, subject to certain limitations under the IRC. Additionally, the Plan allows after-tax contributions to be made that exceed the annual dollar limit, subject to certain limitations. The Company provides a safe harbor employer matching contribution equal to 100 percent of each participant’s contribution up to a maximum of 4 percent of the participant’s compensation. The Company may make a discretionary additional matching contribution. If the Employer makes a discretionary additional matching contribution, the discretionary additional matching contribution will not apply as to elective deferrals exceeding 6% of your compensation. The total amount of this discretionary additional matching contribution will not exceed 4% of the employees’ compensation. The participant contributions and the Company’s safe harbor and discretionary employer matching contributions may be allocated to the investment alternatives made available by the Company, as defined, as the participant directs.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, employer safe harbor contributions and the earnings thereon. Vesting in the discretionary additional employer contributions and the earnings thereon is based on years of service. A participant vests in the discretionary additional employer contribution a percentage each year of service as follows: Year 1 – 25%; Year 2 – 50%; Year 3 – 75%; Year 4 – 100%.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service without the participant’s consent, a participant with a vested account balance of \$999 or less will receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the vested value of their account as soon as administratively feasible following the participant’s employment termination date. An account balance of \$1,000 to \$4,999 will receive an automatic lump-sum distribution to a participant or a direct rollover to an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan Administrator equal to the vested value of their account as soon as administratively feasible following the participant’s employment termination date. A participant with a vested account balance of \$5,000 or more will receive a distribution as soon as administratively feasible following the first date that occurs on or after both (1) the participant’s employment termination date and (2) the date on which the participant consents to the distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of non-vested Company employer matching contributions are used for the reduction of future Company employer matching contributions, as additional employer contributions or to pay plan expenses, as defined by the Plan. The Plan had \$9 and \$3,320 of forfeited non-vested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan used \$10,922 of forfeitures to reduce employer contributions.

NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan’s management to use estimates and assumptions that affect the accompanying financial statements and disclosures. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Contributions from the Company are recorded in the period in which the related participant contributions are due. No allowance for credit losses had been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan and are recorded in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

ASC topic *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Level 3 - Inputs to valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation is generated from model-based techniques that use significant assumptions not observable in the market. These unobservable assumptions would reflect our own estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. Such valuation techniques include the use of option pricing models, discounted cash flow models and similar techniques.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money Market Funds: The fair value of money market funds is based on the quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 4 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than the established floor rate. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code
2. Premature termination of the contracts
3. Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, participants will become fully vested in their account balances.

NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS

Although the Plan has received an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022, from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), it has not been updated for the latest Plan amendments. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan was qualified as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan and are recorded in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits as administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of the fair value of investments. The Plan Sponsor provides certain accounting, recordkeeping, and administrative services to the Plan, for which it received no compensation. Certain Plan investments are shares of fixed income funds managed by Empower Investments, an affiliate of the Plan's trustee. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Trustee and affiliates of Empower Investments maintain and manage the fixed income funds in the Plan for which they receive management fees. These management fees are part of the annual operating expenses of each fund and result in a reduction of earnings from investments.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
