We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Amadeus North America, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 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Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Amadeus North America, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Amadeus North America, Inc. and participating subsidiaries (the "Company") who have completed 30 days of service. Effective June 30, 2020, immediate eligibility applies to the nonelective employer contributions for active, vested employees of the Amadeus North America, Inc. Pension Plan that were still accruing pension credit service on April 30, 2020. The Administrative Committee controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (together, "Empower") serve as the custodian of the Plan (the "custodian"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75% of their annual salary, as defined in the plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations. Eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 3% of their compensation, as defined by the Plan, unless otherwise elected, with an automatic escalation of 2% annually, up to 15%. Highly Compensated Employees, as defined by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), are excluded from the automatic escalation provision. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also make Roth after-tax contributions and may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. In 2024, the Plan elected to make matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 5% deferred on by Amadeus Air-Transport IT Services, Inc. employees, 100% of the first 6% deferred on by Navitaire LLC employees, and 100% of the first 3% deferred on by all other employees. The Plan also elected to make a discretionary true-up contribution in the amount of \$1,239,670 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company may make discretionary matching or nonelective contributions to the Plan, as defined in the plan document. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of contributions for their account into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trust funds, pooled separate accounts, and a guaranteed investment contract as investment options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contributions, and plan earnings (losses), and charged with benefit payments, transaction fees related to loans and distributions, and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon and are 100% vested after one year of credited service in the Company's contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Special vesting provisions applicable to certain participants are defined in the plan document.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances reduced by the excess of the highest outstanding loan balance during the 12-month period ending on the date of the loan. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the bank prime rate as reported by the U.S. Federal Reserve on the last business day of the calendar quarter, plus 1%. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum or various installment options, as provided by the Plan. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Amounts contributed on a before-tax basis may be withdrawn only upon demonstration of financial hardship, disability, or after the participants reach age 59.5 years. Participants may petition for hardship withdrawals prior to termination of employment and, if approved, an amount not exceeding the vested portion of their individual accounts may be withdrawn.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$128,731 and \$132,342, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions or pay administrative expenses. During 2024, forfeitures of \$132,562 were used to reduce Company contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income (including interest income from notes receivable from participants) is recorded when received. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the plan document. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Expenses related to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value, as defined under GAAP, is an exit price representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1** Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.
- Level 2** Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities in their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

Note 5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Guaranteed Annuity Contract

The Plan has entered into a guaranteed annuity contract with Empower (formerly Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company). This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan document (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) premature termination of the contracts, (4) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (5) the failure of the Plan to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material representation or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

Note 6. Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower, the custodian as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees in the amount of \$204,829 were paid by the Plan to Empower for investment advisory and recordkeeping services during the year ended December 31, 2024. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were recorded as a reduction of the return earned on each fund.

Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 8. Tax Status

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the IRS stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan is relying on IRS approval of the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA, sponsored by Empower Retirement LLC, which it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed Empower Retirement LLC by a letter dated September 16, 2022, that the plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 10. Non-Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions

During the 2024 Plan year, there were unintentional delays by Plan management in submitting participant contributions and loan repayments to the custodian in the amount of \$64,650. These delinquent contributions constitute prohibited transactions, and the Company will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost income due to the delays.
