We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Commonwealth Casualty Company 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)" audit). 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Commonwealth Casualty Company 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible full-time employees of Commonwealth Casualty Company (the “Company”, the “Plan Sponsor” and “Plan Administrator”). The Plan was established on February 1, 2019, and restated effective January 1, 2021, to provide retirement income for its employees and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 as amended (“ERISA”). Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Company. The assets of the Plan are held in a trust by Empower Trust Company, LLC (the “Trustee”). Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“EAICA”) is the Plan’s record-keeper (“Record-keeper”).

On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act”) was passed by Congress. The CARES Act contained several provisions that temporarily impact 401(k) plans, including the waiver of required minimum distributions, a new hardship withdrawal option, increased loan limits, and a pause option for loan payments. The provisions of the CARES Act were effective and operationalized immediately, prior to amending the Plan document. The Company has adopted certain relief provisions included in the CARES Act, and an official amendment is expected to be signed on or before December 31, 2025.

On December 29, 2022, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement 2.0 Act (“Secure 2.0 Act”) was passed by Congress. The Secure 2.0 Act contains numerous provisions that impact employee benefit plans. Generally, the deadline for formally adopting any required plan amendments made pursuant to the Secure 2.0 Act is December 31, 2026; however, plans must be operated in accordance with the effective dates of each new provision. The Plan has administratively complied with and adopted all applicable provisions of the Secure 2.0 Act for the year ended December 31, 2024. Plan management expects the Plan to be formally amended prior to the Secure Act 2.0 deadline.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company and its affiliates are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attaining the age of 21 and completing 90 days of continuous employment, or alternatively, 1,000 hours of service in an eligibility computation period. Employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees, and non-resident aliens with no U.S. source income are excluded from participating in the Plan.

1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Contributions

The Plan is a contributory plan whereby participants may defer any amount of their annual compensation limited to a maximum annual amount specified by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") (\$23,000 for employees under age 50 and \$30,500 for employees ages 50 and over). Deferrals may be made on a pre-tax and/or after-tax (Roth) basis through salary deductions. The Plan also includes a Qualified Automatic Contribution Arrangement ("QACA"), under which employees are automatically enrolled at 6% of compensation, with automatic increases of 1% annually up to 15%, unless an election is made otherwise. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

The Company is required to make safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the participant's elective contribution not to exceed 1% of compensation plus 50% of the participant's elective contribution that exceed 1% of compensation, but that do not exceed 6% of compensation. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made safe harbor matching contributions of \$263,723. The Company may also make discretionary employer matching, non-elective or qualified non-elective contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no discretionary employer matching, non-elective or qualified non-elective contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, including the earnings and losses on these contributions, and an allocation of the Company's matching and non-elective contributions. Participant accounts are also charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

The Plan provides a variety of investment options with differing risk and growth characteristics. As of December 31, 2024, the Plan's net assets available for benefits were invested in collective trust funds. Participants may change their investment allocations and transfer their account balances among the various funds at any time.

Vesting

A participant is fully vested immediately as to voluntary contributions, rollovers and related earnings. Vesting in the Company's safe harbor matching contributions plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service in accordance with the following schedule:

Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and non-elective contributions plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service in accordance with the following schedule:

Participants also become fully vested in the Company's contributions at their normal retirement age of 65, upon retirement due to disability, upon death, and upon termination of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of 50% of their vested account balance, not to exceed \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the prior 12-month period. Loan terms range from 1 year to a maximum of 5 years, except for loans used to purchase the participants' primary residence, which may be extended to 30 years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable fixed rate of interest to be determined by the Plan Administrator. Interest rates on participant loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024. The amount of the loan, plus interest, is amortized over the repayment period. Loans are repaid by payroll deductions or participant payments.

Benefit Payments and Withdrawals

Benefits start on a participant's normal retirement date if the participant is no longer an employee and has a vested account under the Plan. The participant may choose to have benefits paid on this date even if the participant is still an employee. Normal retirement means the first day of the month on or after the participant reaches age 65.

If a participant's employment ceases as a result of termination, normal retirement, death or disability, the participant or participant's beneficiaries are entitled to receive the value of the participant's vested interest. Participants or their beneficiaries may receive benefit payments in a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest, in installments over a period determined by the participant, or a direct transfer to a qualified plan of equivalent value.

The Plan also allows for an in-service distribution from the participants' vested accounts at any time after the attainment of age 59 ½ years old.

Benefit Payments and Withdrawals (Continued)

In-service distribution may be made from the participants' vested accounts at any time for a hardship withdrawal. Events that qualify for a hardship withdrawal are as follows: to cover necessary medical expenses, for costs directly related to the purchase of the participant's primary residence, for expenses related to postsecondary education, for payments necessary to prevent the participant's eviction from or foreclosure of the primary residence, burial and funeral expenses for deceased family members or expenses for repair and damages of the participant's primary residence.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Forfeited Accounts

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the non-vested portion of the participant's account, as defined by the Plan, represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures are used to reduce employer contributions. During 2024, forfeitures of \$0 were used to reduce employer contributions. The forfeiture account balance was \$55,259 as of December 31, 2024.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser and custodian. In accordance with the Plan's policy of stating investment at fair value, net unrealized gains for the year are included in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation and depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as unrealized gains and losses on investments held during the year.

Administrative Expenses

All expenses incurred in maintaining the Plan are paid using the Plan's assets, unless the Company, at its discretion, elects to pay certain expenses. These expenses include fees of the Plan's trustees and third-party administrators. The expenses of maintaining the Plan paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in the fair value of investments. For the year ended December 31, 2024, administrative expenses of \$29,589 were paid directly by the Plan.

3. Information Certified by the Trustee and the Record-Keeper

The Plan Sponsor elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-5(c) of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Under this provision of ERISA, certain information certified need not be subject to independent audit.

The Plan Sponsor has obtained certification from the Trustee and the Record-keeper that the following information included in the Plan's financial statements is complete and accurate:

- Investments and participant loans as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and
- Investment income and investment transactions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

4. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

The Plan maximizes the use of observable inputs and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument’s categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the following fair value measurement.

- Level 1: quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level 2: inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities; or
- Level 3: unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for financial instruments measured at fair value.

- Common trust funds: units held in common trusts funds (“CTF”) are valued at net asset value (“NAV”) practical expedient of the CTF as reported by the CTF managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CTF, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient of a CTF is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market information.
- Mutual funds: valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

5. Investment Contracts with Insurance Company

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with EAICA. Contributions are maintained in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investments at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Certain events may allow for investments to settle at an amount different from contract value. The events include layoffs of Plan participants, early retirement windows, spin-offs, sale of a division, facility closings, full or partial Plan terminations and changes in laws or regulations. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investments contracts is also dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer, and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

6. Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan engages in transactions involving acquisition or disposition of units in funds managed by the Trustee and the Record-keeper. The Plan allows participants to borrow from their vested balances. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. All of these transactions are exempt from prohibited transaction rules under ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their account balances.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their account balances.

8. Tax Status

The Plan has received a determination letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRS.

U.S. GAAP require plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects are recognized when the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

10. Plan Correction

During the 2024 audit, it was noted that bonus compensation was not included when calculating the 401(k) deferrals for certain individuals. As a result, some participants may not have been able to defer the full amounts to which they were entitled under the terms of the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor is evaluating and implementing corrective contributions, including any required earnings, in accordance with IRS-approved correction methods. These contributions are intended to make affected participants whole. The financial statements as of December 31, 2024, do not reflect the effect of these corrective contributions, which will be recorded when made.

11. Non-Exempt Prohibited Transactions

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer did not remit certain participant contributions and loan repayments to the Plan on a timely basis as defined by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Delinquent Participant Contributions Disclosure under ERISA. Untimely remittances identified on the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions totaled \$30,529 for payroll period ending June 7, 2024, which were remitted to the Plan on June 21, 2024. The lost earnings on the untimely contributions are expected to be corrected outside of the Department of Labor Voluntary Fiduciary Correction Program in 2025 as part of the corrective action.
