Basis for Opinion for the Financial Statements

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Zenni Optical 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements section of my report, my objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, I:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such

Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

- Conclude whether, in my judgement, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Zenni Optical 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

My audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

I am required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that I identified during the audit.

Other Matter — Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, I compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming my opinion on the supplemental schedule, I evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Zenni Optical 401(k) Plan “the Plan” provides only general information. The Plan’s sponsor is Ocusun, LLC “the Company.” Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is a single employer defined contribution retirement plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 “ERISA”. The Plan was established on January 1, 2016 to provide retirement benefits for the employees of the Company. Zenni USA LLC is a participating employer in the Plan.

The Plan operates under the CBIZ Benefits & Insurance Services Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan #01-001. The Plan Sponsor’s Trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan Sponsor’s Trustees.

The Plan was amended effective January 1, 2023 to exclude gift cards and meal subsidies from the definition of eligible compensation and to change the automatic deferral provisions from an Eligible Automatic Contribution Arrangement to a traditional Automatic Contribution Arrangement.

Eligibility – Substantially all employees of Ocusun, LLC and Zenni USA LLC are eligible to participate on the first day of the month following three months of service.

Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). Deferral contributions are subject to a maximum limitation as provided in the Internal Revenue Code. The maximum contribution of pretax compensation that a participant could defer in 2024 was \$23,000, and the maximum catch-up additional deferral for participants who reached the age of fifty by the end of the 2024 plan year was \$7,500.

The Plan includes an automatic-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan on their entry date unless they affirmatively elect not to participant in the Plan.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (continued)

Through January 31, 2024, automatically enrolled participants had their deferral rate set at 3 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a retirement target age lifecycle fund until changed by the participant. Effective February 1, 2024, automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4 percent of eligible compensation. In addition, the Plan includes an automatic deferral escalation provision whereby the initial automatic deferral will increase by 1% of eligible compensation on the first of the first subsequent year, and each year after, up to a maximum of 6% of eligible compensation.

The Company has elected to make Safe Harbor match contributions equal to 100% of the first 4% of eligible compensation that participants contribute to the Plan each pay period. The safe harbor match is subject to an end of year true-up based on the annual eligible compensation. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed Safe Harbor match contributions totaling approximately \$1,711,359. Employer contributions related to safe harbor match contributions totaling \$186,343 and \$117,759 were receivable at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company may also make discretionary matching contributions and nonelective contributions. The Company did not make a discretionary match contribution or nonelective contribution in the year ended December 31, 2024.

Investment Elections – The participant contributions and the company contributions are allocated to the various investment options offered by the Plan as directed by participants.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Company's contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's accounts.

Vesting - A participant is always fully (100 percent) vested in his or her salary reduction account, rollover contribution account, and employer safe harbor contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants also immediately vest 100% in discretionary employer match contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. Loan terms generally range from one to five years, but can be up to 15 years for the purchase of a principal residence. The plan sponsor sets the interest rate based on the prime rate plus 2%. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. A participant may only have one loan currently outstanding at a time from the Plan. A participant's account is charged monthly interest on the outstanding loan balance.

Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. In 2024, the interest rates on loans ranged from 5.25% to 10.50% per annum. The loans mature on various dates through April 2036.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service or attaining the age of 59 ½, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested portion of his or her account. For termination of service, if a participant's balance is less than \$5,000, a participant will receive a mandatory lump-sum distribution of the vested interest in his or her account. Mandatory distributions over \$1,000 are in the form of a direct rollover.

Participants with certain immediate and heavy financial needs are allowed hardship distributions of their account balances.

Forfeited Accounts – Forfeitures of the nonvested portion of terminated participants' accounts may first be used to pay reasonable plan expenses and then used to reduce employer contributions. There were no available forfeitures at December 31, 2024 and 2023. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$18,210 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer safe harbor match contributions.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s Investment Committee determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing the information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions – Contributions from Plan participants and the safe harbor matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to participant recordkeeping, the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit distributions are charged directly to the participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	<p>Inputs to the valuation methodology include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; • Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; • Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; • Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. <p>If the assets or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.</p>
Level 3	Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

Mutual Funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. These investments are reflected as Level 1 because the inputs used to determine fair value are quoted prices in an active market.

Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund

Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is a general account product of Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. Although the investment option is benefit responsive for participant-initiated transactions, the Plan’s contract with Empower is not considered fully benefit responsive because there is a provision in the investment contract that prevents the immediate and full payout of the contract value for plan-initiated transactions. The fair value is reported daily based on a discounted cash flow valuation methodology where the interest rate for this portfolio investment contract is reset quarterly. Using this methodology, the fair value approximates contract value. This investment is considered Level 2 because the inputs used to determine fair value are not quoted prices in an active market, but there are observable inputs.

NOTE 4 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN’S DIRECTED TRUSTEE

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC, the directed trustee of the Plan, and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America.

NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Empower which is affiliated with Empower Trust Company, LLC. Empower Trust Company, LLC is the directed trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Indirect fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment. The Plan made direct payments to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, the recordkeeper, totaling \$77,304 and direct payments to the Plan’s third party plan administrator totaling \$9,675 during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan’s operations.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The defined contribution pre-approved plan adopted by the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code, and, accordingly, the trust's net income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan was amended and restated effective January 1, 2023 under the CBIZ Retirement Plan Services Non-Standardized Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS Continued)

CBIZ Benefits & Insurance Services received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020 stating that the plan's form is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is acceptable for use by employers for the benefit of their employees under IRC Section 401. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service and state taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 – OPERATIONAL ERROR

The Company missed withholding and transferring into the Plan approximately \$2,344 of participant contributions in the 2023 plan year. The employer fully corrected the error in the 2024 plan year by remitting a contribution of 50% of the missed contributions totaling \$1,172 plus lost earnings totaling \$301 into the Plan.

Management believes the operational error will not affect the Plan's exempt tax status.

NOTE 9 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of investment securities offered by the Plan. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
