Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of IOMSA, P.C. Retirement Plan (the Plan), an Indiana employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Note 1: PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of IOMSA, P.C. Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan, established July 1, 1995. The Plan is sponsored by Indiana Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery Associates, P.C. (the Employer) for the benefit of its employees. An employee is eligible to participate in the Plan once they have obtained one year of service, which means they have worked 1,000 hours, and are at least 21 years old. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Contributions: Participants may elect to contribute to the Plan the maximum amount of annual compensation prescribed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch up contributions.

Contributions to the Plan by the Employer are provided by a safe harbor amount equal to 3% of all eligible Plan participants' compensation. In addition, the Employer can elect a discretionary profit-sharing contribution as determined annually by the employer. Any contributions received after December 31st that represent a prior year transaction are recorded as a receivable to the Plan.

The Plan follows Financial Accounting Standards Board's (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 326 – *Financial Instruments – Credit Losses*. The standard requires recognition of an allowance that reflects a current estimate of credit losses expected to be incurred over the life of the asset. As of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, there were no allowances for uncollectible receivables for either year end.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, an allocation of the Employer's contribution, investment revenue sharing, Plan earnings and an allocation of any administrative expense. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan document.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and the employer safe harbor contributions made to their accounts and the earnings thereon. A participant becomes vested in the employer profit sharing contributions in 20% increments starting after two years of service and becomes 100% vested after six years of service.

Plan Benefits: The benefits to which a participant is entitled are the benefits that can be provided from the participant's individual accounts. Benefits are payable upon retirement or upon total and permanent disability, employment termination, hardships, or death.

Forfeited Accounts: For the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, forfeited non-vested employer account balances amounted to \$12,478 and \$7,864, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, forfeited non-vested employer contributions were used to reduce current-year employer contributions in the amount of \$18,154 and \$11,484, respectively.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies followed by the Plan are listed below:

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments, other than fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan that are fully benefit-responsive are reported at contract value, rather than fair value, because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Plan's investment in the principal guaranteed investment contract is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract and is reported at contract value in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Risks and Uncertainties: The Plan provides for certain investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, liquidity, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the sensitivity of certain fair value estimates to changes in valuation assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses: Administrative expenses may be paid by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan, at the Plan Sponsor's discretion.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures, and actual results may differ than these estimates.

Presentation: Certain reclassifications may have been made to 2023 figures to conform with the 2024 presentation.

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, the Plan’s investments (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year) appreciated by \$4,174,209 and \$5,086,120, respectively.

Interest, dividends, and capital gain distributions reported by the Custodian for the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, were \$221,996 and \$252,778, respectively.

Note 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets or liabilities;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation of other means.

If the assets or liabilities have a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liabilities fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

The following descriptions of the valuation methods and assumptions used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments, apply to investments held directly by the Plan.

Mutual funds: The fair values of the mutual funds are valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the individual fund is traded.

Common collective trust funds: Valued based on calculating a unit value on the net assets of the underlying portfolio of securities, as reported by the manager of the fund. The net asset value is used as the practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5: FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan invests in the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option, a fully benefit-responsive annuity contract (the Contract) with Principal, which maintains the contributions in a guaranteed account. The investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the Contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the Contract, plus earnings (losses), less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Contract permits the Employer or Principal to terminate the Contract within 12 months of receiving notification. Principal may make the termination payment immediately in lieu of a 5% surrender charge. The credit rate was 1.50% during the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

Note 6: TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated December 2, 2009, that the Plan and related Trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related Trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan is subject to examinations for a period of three years from the date the Form 5500 was filed.

Note 7: PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor Regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer and certain others. All professional fees for the administration and audit of the Plan are paid by the Plan or the Employer. The Plan invested in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract and common collective investment funds managed by Principal Global Investment Trust and Principal Life Insurance Company as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023. As such, these investments qualify as party-in-interest investments.
