Scope and Nature of the ERISA 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The House of the Good Shepherd 403(b) Thrift Plan (the "Plan") sponsored by The House of the Good Shepherd (the Organization) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Organization established the Plan to provide employees with a systematic means of saving and investing for the future. All permissible employees of the Organization, as defined in accordance with the universal availability standards, are eligible to enroll on their date of hire. All eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan 60 days following their hire date at a contribution rate of 3% of their compensation unless they choose to have employee elective deferrals other than 3% by completing a salary reduction agreement or opt out of the automatic contribution. Employees whose maximum elective deferral would not exceed \$200 annually are considered to be non-eligible employees.

Employees, except those part-time who normally work less than 20 hours per week, are eligible for employer matching contributions and employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions once they have completed an eligibility year of service (12 consecutive month period). Once the employee has completed an eligibility year of service, they will enter the Plan on the first day of the next calendar month for employer matching and discretionary profit-sharing contribution purposes.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax eligible pay through direct payroll withholding subject to maximum allowable contributions under the Internal Revenue Code of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants with 15 years of service with a public school, hospital, home health service agency, health and welfare service agency, church, or convention or association of churches may increase their contributions by an additional amount up to \$3,000 annually (\$15,000 lifetime maximum).

The Organization matches 50% of employee elective deferrals up to 5% of eligible wages.

The Organization's profit-sharing contribution is discretionary. The Organization did not make profit sharing contributions in 2024 or 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with their contributions, employer matching contributions, employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions, Plan gains or losses, and administrative expenses.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are immediately fully vested in their elective and rollover contributions. Employer matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions vest according to the following schedule:

Employees who terminate employment before becoming 100% vested in their account balance will forfeit the portion of their account that is not vested.

Investment Allocation

The Plan allows participants to select from a variety of investment options. Participant contributions may be directed to any of these options, in multiples of 1%. Participants can change the future direction of contributions or move existing account balances between various investment options on a daily basis by using the online service. All investment choices are directed by the participant and each participant bears the respective investment risk of their election. All investments are considered mutual funds, except for the Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund and Mutual of America Interest Accumulation Fund, which are considered unallocated insurance contracts. All employees eligible to participate in the Plan and who do not make an investment election for their contributions, shall have all contributions invested in the qualified default investment alternative as defined by the Plan, which was the Vanguard Target Date Funds for 2024 and 2023.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are the amount the Organization contributed to a participant's account that was not vested upon termination. Forfeitures are applied toward the payment of employer contributions or administrative expenses. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions in 2024 and 2023 were \$0 and \$2,206, respectively. Amounts in the forfeiture account were \$40,055 and \$14,871 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 less the highest outstanding loan balance during the one-year period prior to the new loan or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants are allowed to have up to 3 loans outstanding. The interest rate on loans is determined by the U.S. prime rate plus 1.0%. Interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024. The maximum repayment term is five years, but this may be extended for the purchase or construction of a principal residence. Upon termination from the Organization, the loan must be fully repaid by the participant.

Participant Investment Rollovers

Participants are allowed to rollover funds into the Plan from other qualified or 403(b) plans.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Payment of Benefits

Distributions resulting from retirement, death, disability, or termination are made in the form of a lump sum distribution, a life annuity, a joint and survivor annuity, or periodic installments for a limited time. Upon termination of employment, if the account balance is \$1,000 or less and the participant has not elected to receive the benefit pursuant to an optional form of benefit payment, the participant will receive a single lump sum amount equal to the value of his or her account. If the account balance is greater than \$1,000 but not more than \$5,000 and the participant has not elected to receive the benefit pursuant to an optional form of benefit payment, the account balance will be automatically rolled into an Automatic Rollover IRA. Hardship withdrawals are available of up to 100% of the vested portion of the participant's account. Distributions, without penalty, may be made upon attainment of age 59½.

Administrative Expenses

All costs and expenses with regard to the purchase or sale of investments are paid by the Plan. All other administrative expenses of the Plan, such as loan processing fees and distribution fees, are paid by plan participants. Personnel and facilities of The House of the Good Shepherd have been used by the Plan for its accounting and other activities at no charge to the Plan.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make significant estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investments

The Plan's investments are stated in the accompanying financial statements at fair value except for the funds held in insurance company general accounts, which are stated at contract value. The fair value is equal to quoted market value on a national exchange for mutual funds. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The Plan presents in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits the net appreciation in fair value of investments, which consists of the net realized gains (losses) on investment transactions throughout the period and net unrealized gains (losses) on investments at the end of the period.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements, provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

The three levels of fair value hierarchy under these standards are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs, other than quoted prices in active markets, that are observable either directly or indirectly and fair value is determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies.

Level 3: Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the asset or liabilities. Level 3 assets and liabilities include financial instruments whose value is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: valued at the closing price on the active market which the funds are traded.

The Plan administrator assesses and approves the fair value measurement policies and procedures on a continuing basis. Periodically, the Plan administrator determines if the current valuation techniques used in the fair value measurements are still appropriate. The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS

In accordance with Department of Labor Regulation 29 CFR 2520.103-8, certain information was furnished and certified by Hand Benefits & Trust Company and Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, the investment custodians, to the Plan administrator as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. This included the following:

4. INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANIES

The Plan has a benefit-responsive investment contract with Prudential, the Prudential Guaranteed Income Fund. Prudential maintains the contributions in a group annuity (general account). The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits at contract value. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

4. INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANIES (Continued)

The contract value of the investment contract as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$84,932 and \$75,597, respectively. The crediting interest rate is established by Prudential considering many factors, including current economic and market conditions and the general interest rate environment. Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan; (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; or (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

The Plan has a benefit-responsive investment contract with Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (Mutual of America), the Mutual of America Interest Accumulation Fund. Mutual of America maintains the contributions in a group annuity (general account). Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Generally, there are not any events that could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. There are not any events that allow Mutual of America to terminate the contract and which require the Plan to settle at an amount different than contract value.

The contract value of the investment contract as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$358 and \$364, respectively. The crediting interest rate is established by Mutual considering many factors, including current economic and market conditions and the general interest rate environment. The minimum crediting rate under the contract is 1.0%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a periodic basis for resetting.

5. INVESTMENTS

The following table sets forth the Plan's investments that were accounted for at fair values as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Investments are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurements:

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contribution at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants are 100% vested in their accounts.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan is exempt from federal and state income tax under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Internal Revenue Code to maintain its tax exemption. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

8. TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Hand Benefits & Trust Company and Mutual of America Life Insurance Company are custodians of the Plan's assets. As such, transactions between the custodians and the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, notes receivable from participants qualifies as party-in-interest transactions.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 9, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
