INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Administrative Committee of
National Construction Rentals, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of National Construction Rentals, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section -

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of National Construction Rentals, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the National Construction Rentals, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

1. General

Effective July 1, 1992, National Construction Rentals, Inc. (the "Employer") adopted the National Construction Rentals, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan. The Plan is a defined contribution plan which was established for the benefit of substantially all employees of the Employer and meets all requirements under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Employer is the plan sponsor and plan administrator. The general duties of the plan administrator are to administer the Plan in accordance with the Plan rules and ensure compliance of the Plan with ERISA.

2. Eligibility

Employees are immediately eligible to participate in the Plan and receive employer matching contributions on their date of hire. To receive discretionary employer non-elective contributions, participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year and must have worked at least 1,000 hours during the year. Employees covered by collective bargaining agreements, leased employees and non-resident aliens are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

3. Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute on a tax-deferred basis and/or make Roth contributions, up to 100% of their compensation up to the maximum deferral limit per Section 402(g)(1) of the IRC. Additional "catch-up" contributions can be made beginning in the plan year in which a participant will be at least age 50 by the end of the plan year. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

In addition, the Employer may elect to make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan equal to a percentage of the eligible contributions made by the participant, as determined by the Employer. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer made a discretionary matching contribution equal to 100% of a participant's deferral up to a maximum of \$1,500. The Employer may also make discretionary non-elective contributions to eligible participants. There were no discretionary non-elective contributions made to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee and Employer contributions, as desired, in any of a variety of investment options held by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company and Principal Life Insurance Company ("Principal"), the trustee and custodian of the Plan, as elected by the Employer. Participants may change their investment options daily.

5. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with employee contributions, rollovers, employer discretionary matching contributions, and allocations of discretionary non-elective contributions and plan earnings. Allocations of non-elective contributions are based on the same ratio each participant's compensation bears to the compensation for all participants. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

6. Vesting

Participants are fully vested in their employee contributions, rollovers and actual earnings thereon. A participant becomes vested in the Employer's contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, in accordance with the following schedule:

7. Benefit Payments

When a participant attains normal retirement age, becomes disabled or dies while working for the Employer, the participant (or beneficiary in the case of death) is entitled to receive a lump sum amount equal to 100% of the participant's account balance. When a participant terminates service due to other reasons, the participant is entitled to their vested account balance. In-service and hardship distributions are permitted if certain criteria are met. In addition, participants subject to required minimum distributions (RMD) may receive regular installments equal to or exceeding the annual RMD amount.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

8. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow against their vested account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the preceding 12 months. The interest rate charged will equal the prime lending rate. Loans must be repaid within 5 years, or 15 years if used for the purchase of a principal residence. Participants may apply for one loan each calendar year and may only have one loan outstanding at a time.

9. Forfeitures

Forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested amounts may be used to pay plan expenses or may be used to offset future employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures totaling \$115,074 were applied to the employer discretionary matching contribution. Unallocated forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were not material.

10. Termination of the Plan

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. Upon termination, further contributions to the Plan would cease, all interests of participants would become fully vested, and the assets of the Plan would be distributed to participants in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

2. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

4. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser and trustee. See Note D for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation includes gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

5. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

6. Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses incurred by the trustee and other service providers in performance of their duties are paid from the assets of the Plan. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation/depreciation of fair value of investments. Substantially all other out-of-pocket administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the plan sponsor. Expenses paid by the plan sponsor are excluded from these financial statements.

7. Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding adjustment to benefit payments (see Note I). The Plan distributed the 2024 and 2023 excess contributions to the affected participants in June and September of 2025, and March of 2024, respectively.

8. Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

NOTE C - CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company and Principal Life Insurance Company (the trustee and a custodian of the Plan), qualified institutions respectively.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the quoted net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Collective investment trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust fund. The NAV, as provided by the trustee of the funds, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Stable value collective trust fund: A stable value fund that is valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Pooled Separate Account: The NAV of this account is based on the market value of their underlying investments. The NAV is not a publicly quoted price in an active market. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the account will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan holds an investment in a group annuity contract (the "Contract") issued by Principal Life Insurance Company ("Principal Life") to Principal Trust Company, as custodian. The Contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal Life, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings at guaranteed crediting rates, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The following represents the traditional investment contract held by the Plan:

NOTE E - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT (Continued)

Principal Life is obligated to repay the principal and interest rate at the specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is reset on a semiannual basis on June 1 and December 1 of each year. The contract is backed by Principal Life's general account. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

No direct transfers to competing investment options are allowed. Indirect transfers are subject to an equity wash which requires that transfers from the Contract be first directed to a noncompeting investment option and reside there for at least 90 days before transferring to a competing option.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Employer adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan ("pre-approved plan"), which received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, which stated that the pre-approved plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement date. Administration errors, if any, which are insignificant or operational in nature, are handled by the plan administrator in accordance with applicable IRS correction policies.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Principal is the trustee of the Plan and Principal Life is the recordkeeper. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions for which a statutory exemption exists. Notes receivable from participants of the Plan and the related interest income are also considered party-in-interest transactions.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Employer failed to remit employee contributions and loan payments totaling \$131,727 to the Plan on a timely basis in accordance with Department of Labor Regulations. As a result, lost earnings on these untimely contributions were or will be remitted to the Plan and allocated to participant accounts in 2025.

NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
