Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

(1) Description of Plan

The following description of the Citizens Bank Restated Profit Sharing Plan (“Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

(a) General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Citizens Bancorp Investment, Inc. (“Company”) who are age eighteen or older. Employees become eligible to participate and may enroll on the first day of the month following their hire date. The Plan is administered in accordance with the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

(b) Contributions

Each year, participants are permitted to make pre-tax contributions or elect to reduce their compensation to make Roth 401(K) contributions at rates of at least 1% up to 100% of eligible earnings, as defined by the Plan. Contributions are subject to a maximum annual amount as determined by applicable law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions, as determined by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) and ERISA. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified deferred benefit or defined contribution plans (“rollover”). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Each payroll period the Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution to the Plan for eligible participants. The Company will match 100% of the first 3% of the eligible participant's compensation contributed to the Plan and 50% of the next 2% of the eligible participant's compensation contributed to the Plan.

The Company may make, at its discretion, profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The Company did not make a profit sharing contribution to the Plan during 2024.

(c) Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's and the Company's contributions and any rollovers, an allocation of Plan earnings, and may be charged with some or all of the costs and expenses of operating the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or election of investment options, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

(d) Vesting

Participants are always 100% vested in their voluntary contributions made, rollover contributions, and the Company's safe harbor 401(K) matching contributions received plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contributions to participants' accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service as follows:

(e) Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or in annual installments over a period not to exceed the life expectancy of such participant. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Participants with vested account balances less than \$5,000 and exceeding \$1,000 are automatically distributed to an Individual Retirement Account ("IRA") for their benefit. Participants with vested account balances less than \$1,000 are immediately distributed as a lump-sum under the terms of the Plan without the participant's consent, unless the participant has made a timely rollover election to an IRA or other qualified arrangement.

(f) Investment Options

Investments are made as directed by the Plan's participants. Company contributions are invested in the same manner as participant elective contributions. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a collective investment trust as investment options for participants.

(g) Forfeitures

Upon termination of employment, the unvested portion of the participant's account is forfeited. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and may first be used to pay administrative expenses and fees and then to reduce Company contributions to the participants remaining in the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, unallocated forfeitures totaled \$1,117 and \$10,749, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures totaling \$11,979 were used to reduce Company contributions to the participants remaining in the Plan.

(h) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, each participant becomes 100% vested in the aggregate value of his or her account regardless of each participant's current vesting percentage and is entitled to receive the balance in his or her account (after payment of all expenses and proportional adjustment of such expenses and any investment gains or losses).

(2) Summary of Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") and the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

(b) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

(b) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition, Continued

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

(c) Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(d) Plan Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company, if any, are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for annual participant account maintenance and fees related to distributions to participants are included in administrative expenses and are charged to participant account.

(e) Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) Date of Management's Review and Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 15, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

(3) Fair Value Measurements

The Plan accounts for its financial assets and liabilities in accordance with Accounting Standards Codification 820, Fair Value Measurement ("ASC 820"), which are carried at fair value on a recurring basis in the financial statements. ASC 820 establishes a fair value hierarchy that requires assets and liabilities measured at fair value to be categorized into one of three levels based on the priority of inputs used in the valuation. Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted price (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the entity has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in market that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities.

Level 3: Unobservable inputs that reflect a reporting entity's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

(3) Fair Value Measurements, Continued

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds:

Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) reported in the active market where the fund is traded on a daily basis and are classified as Level 1 investments.

Collective Investment Trust:

The Wells Fargo Stable Value Fund, held in a collective investment trust, invests primarily in fixed income portfolios that are wrapped by stable value contracts which allow participants to transact at book value. The objective of the stable value fund is to provide safety of principal and consistency of returns while attempting to maintain minimal volatility. The investment is valued using NAV as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying investment assets owned by the fund minus liabilities and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on this investment. The trust files an annual report on form 5500 as a direct filing entity.

The methods described above may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes these valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with those of other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial investments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(4) Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan, as restated, is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to the applicable statute of limitations.

(5) Information Prepared and Certified by the Trustee

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the trustee. This information has not been audited by the independent auditor.

(6) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's exposure to concentrations of credit risk is dependent upon the investments selected by participants. The Plan's investments in the following funds represent concentrations of credit risk at December 31, 2024:

(7) Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Therefore, these investments represent party-in-interest transactions under the provisions of ERISA. During 2024, fees paid to Fidelity Investments for their services provided totaled \$30,893 and are included in administrative expenses on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Certain advisory and management services are provided by Regions Institutional Trust (the Plan's investment advisor). During 2024, fees totaling \$59,700 were paid to Regions Institutional Trust for services provided. These fees were paid by the Company and are not included in the financial statements.
